Welcoming Remarks Action

1. The <u>Chairman</u> opened the meeting by welcoming the trade representatives. He stressed that the proposal presented at the meeting was for discussion and the content had not been finalized. He urged the trade representatives to actively participate in the discussion.

Agenda Item 1

Confirmation of Minutes

2. The <u>Chairman</u> suggested amending the last sentence of para 7 to "He told the meeting that the Administration would *explore* the details when finalizing this exemption. In the meantime, he welcomed comments and suggestions from the trade." Minutes of the meeting held on 5 September 2005 were then confirmed.

Agenda Item 2

Revised Proposal on the Labelling Scheme on Nutrition Information

3. <u>Ms FUNG</u> briefed the meeting on the revised proposal of the Labelling Scheme on Nutrition Information. She remarked that the presentation provided a framework for discussion and the contents were subject to revision. After the presentation, the <u>Chairman</u> invited comments and questions from the trade representatives.

Phased Approach and Grace Period

4. Representative from the HK Food Council, HK Suppliers Association and selected participants had different views on the phased approach and the length of the grace period, which included the following options (i) One phase with four-year grace period; and (ii) Two phases (i.e., mandatory nutrition labelling when with claims, followed by mandatory nutrition labelling for all prepackaged foods) with a three-year and one-year grace periods for the first phase and second phase, respectively.

Timeframe

5. A trade representative enquired about the timeframe regarding the legislative process. The <u>Chairman</u> informed the meeting that the current food

labelling regulations would be amended by adding schedules on nutrition labelling. The process would be a negative vetting process, which in general lasted for 28 days. However, LegCo would have an option to extend the process for another 21 days, if necessary. In other words, the whole legislative process would last for a maximum of 49 days.

Trans Fat

6. The <u>Chairman</u> remarked that due to the concern of the public and LegCo members, the Administration was considering including trans fat as a core nutrient. A trade representative acknowledged that providing trans fat information was a trend and he preferred to have it included in the core nutrient list and settled with the issue, rather than changing the core nutrient list later on. However, another trade representative had a different view. He preferred not to include trans fat in the core nutrient list and opined that the decision on whether or not to declare the trans fat content should be vested in the trade.

Special Emphasis on Ingredients/Nutrients

7. A participant asked how to make "special emphasis" on an ingredient on food label after the enactment of the nutrition labelling regulations. <u>Ms HUNG</u> replied that the Administration was considering amending the relevant clauses in the current food labelling regulations, so that in the future, special emphasis on nutrients should follow only the conditions of making nutrient claims.

Sources of Nutrient Information

8. Trade representatives sought clarification regarding the source of nutrient information for nutrition labels. The <u>Chairman</u> informed the meeting that both direct nutrient analysis (i.e., laboratory testing) and indirect nutrient analysis (i.e., calculation made use of food composition data) would be acceptable. In case the trade preferred indirect analysis, special attention should be given to the source of ingredients, amounts used, yield factors, processing methods, etc., as these factors might affect the accuracy of the calculations.

Due Diligence Clause

9. A participant asked whether a due diligence clause would be included in the nutrition labelling regulations. Mr CHUNG replied that nutrition labelling regulations would be part of the food labelling regulations and there was already a due diligence clause in the current food label regulations.

Compliance Date

10. With regard to the compliance date, a trade representative suggested that the Administration should make reference to the approach in Taiwan, i.e., using the manufacturer date as the compliance date. In other words, only prepackaged foods produced on or after the compliance/enforcement date would have to comply with the new requirements. The <u>Chairman</u> explained that the suggestion might not be feasible as the provision of manufacturer date was not required under the Hong Kong food labelling regulations.

Low Volume Exemption

11. Several trade representatives stressed that the proposed Scheme would greatly affect small volume products, including seasonal products and new products. They urged the Administration to seriously consider the low volume exemption, despite the possible administrative difficulties. The <u>Chairman</u> indicated that the Administration would continue to explore various administrative options.

Agenda Item 3

Technical Guidance Notes (Draft)

- 12. <u>Ms FUNG</u> introduced the overview of the draft of the Technical Guidance Note with details of the rounding rules and tolerance limits presented (Annex I).
- 13. The <u>Chairman</u> told the meeting that the draft of the Technical Guidance Note would be made available at the upcoming technical meeting. He urged the trade representatives to offer comments so that the draft could be more comprehensive and be of use to the trade.
