Welcoming Remarks

1. The <u>Chairman</u> opened the meeting by welcoming the trade representatives.

Agenda Item 1

Confirmation of Minutes

2. A minor amendment was suggested under the trade representatives list – To change "Ms LAM Tsz Mau to Mr LAM Tsz Mau". Minutes of the meeting held on 28 September 2007 were then confirmed without further amendments.

Agenda Item 2

Revised Proposal on the Labelling Scheme on Nutrition Information

3. <u>Ms FUNG</u> briefed the meeting on the revised proposal of the Labelling Scheme on Nutrition Information. The <u>Chairman</u> stressed that the information presented was the most updated information, however, it might not be the final proposal put forward to LegCo. Members of the trade was welcomed to make last-minute suggestions. He remarked that taking into consideration the burden on the trade, the requirements in many areas had been lessened, such as unit of energy, basis of expressions, etc.

Format of Nutrition Labels

4. Several trade representatives asked whether there would be specific and detailed requirements on the format of nutrition labels. The <u>Chairman</u> said the information must be legible and the nutrition label must be located on a conspicuous place on the food package and presented in a tabular format. Font size and ruling would not be specified in the regulations.

Serving Size

5. A participant enquired about the definition of serving size. The <u>Chairman</u> told the meeting that serving sizes would not be defined under the regulation. However, they must be in reasonable amounts. He indicated that the trade might make reference to overseas NL regulations.

Individual Packs in a Pre-package Food

6. A trade representative asked whether nutrition label was required for each individual pack found inside a pre-packaged food. Mr CHUNG replied that same as general food labelling, nutrition label should be displayed on the outer package which the information could be read by consumers.

Nutrient Content Claim

7. A participant asked whether "Vitamin C XX gram" listed in bold letters on the package would be considered as a claim. The <u>Chairman</u> said even without any related "claim" words, the expression might be interpreted as a nutrient content claim.

Agenda Item 3

Proposed Exemption List

8. <u>Ms FUNG</u> presented the principles for exemption from nutrition labelling and the latest proposed exemption list. She stressed that any prepackaged foods meeting one or more principles might not be necessarily granted with the exemptions; as other factors, such as overseas practices and consumer expectations, would be taken into consideration as well. The <u>Chairman</u> said that the exemption list tabled was subject to further refinement.

Pre-packaged Foods with Assorted Raw Ingredients (Item 12)

9. Several participants asked about the definition of "assorted". The

<u>Chairman</u> said the pre-packaged foods must contain three or more different raw ingredients to meet the criteria of this exemption.

Same Premise / Immediate Vicinity Exemption (Item 14)

10. A participant asked whether repacking would be considered as one of the preparation process. The <u>Chairman</u> indicated that this exemption was for ready-to-eat food which went through a key preparation process, such as baking (e.g., bakery products) and roasting (e.g., bbq pork). Thus, simply cutting, washing, or repacking would not meet the criteria of food preparation under this exemption.

Pre-packaged Foods Sold to Manufacturers

11. A trade representative enquired about whether pre-packaged foods sold to manufacturers for food production would require nutrition labels. Mr CHUNG said manufacturers were not included in the definition of "ultimate consumers", therefore, pre-packaged food sold to manufacturers would not be subject to food labelling regulations.
