Let us write our opinions and comments on the above SOC matter as one of Electricity user and one of Corporate body relating to Electricity business in Hong Kong.

1. We would like to point out that the importance of "supply reliability, reasonable tariff and environmental friendly".
2. Most people seem to be interesting in Powe Co's tariff but we have to speak to you actually Reliable Suply and Environmental Friendly is much more important in long-run basis. Because when we open our eyes, it has been hazy everyday recently in Hong Kong due to air contamination coming from other area. We do believe no one will disp ute this fact.
3. As far as supply of reliable electricity concerned, this is mission and duty for Power Company to supply reliable electricity to all of Hong Kong citizens, offices, factories etc to let Hong Kong citizens spend happy life and to maintain competitive power in this world.
4. We would like to commnet Electric tariff as under:-
 - 1) Elctirc tariff in Hong Kong is fixed since 1998 until now and it is relatively higher than that of Taiwan, Shangai and Singapore. However, it is lower than that of New York, Tokyo and London by 20 to 30%. And Electricity accounts for only 1.3% to 2.7% of monthly household expenditure in Hong Kong, it shall be maarginable iging from Hng Kong's cost of living.
 - 2) On the other hands, there are a lot of high rise building in Hong kong City, one power failure had happened, very faunctions in city is paralyzed totally resulting in great impact to Hong Kong Economy.

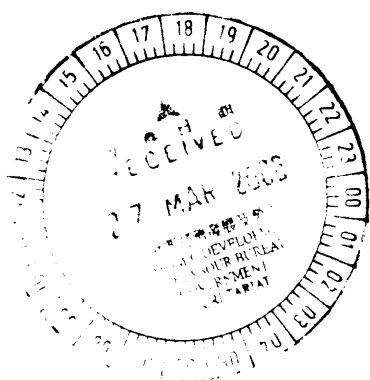

Dear Sir,

Referring to the Government's consultation paper on the captioned subject, I would like to comment as follows.

Of the dozens of proposals outlined in the paper, some of them are quite commendable. Proven and simple concepts of the current scheme of control (SOC) are retained. For example, the agreement will be a bilateral one between the Government and the two local power companies. And, the rate of return is based on the average net fixed asset. Of the new features proposed this time, I found the establishment of the Tariff Stabilisation Fund to be a good move that would help to stabilize tariff.

Before modifying the existing SOC, one has to review it to determine areas requiring revision. As evident from the submissions for stage I consultation and postings in the stage II consultation, the existing SOC is considered to be highly effective in the vast majority of cases. I could find no reason in putting forward the following proposals in the consultation paper:

1. tiered rates of return applying to different types of assets.

This will complicate the return issue. Simple dependence on the average net fixed asset is preferred.

2. rate of return reduced from the present 13.5% to 7 - 11%

The proposed rates of return of 7 - 11% is too low to attract investment in view of the long term nature of the power industry together with the inherent risks.

3. rate of return linked to emission cap target achieved or not.

As there are already penalties for power companies not meeting the emission caps, the new regulation should not impose double penalty.

4. 10 years regulatory period instead of the present 15 years.

Due to the long term nature of the power industry, e.g. many capital items will have usable life of 20 to 30 years, the current 15 years term should not be reduced.



Dear Officer,

Regarding to the proposed changes on the future electricity supply market, I have the following views:

1. Stability and Reliability of power supply is paramount important to the continuous success of HK:
 - a. The success of HK's economy in the past many years is attributed to the stable and reliable electricity supply from our existing two electric power companies in HK. Frequent black out and unstable power supply will lead to huge financial losses and distress in life to our HK citizens.
 - b. Moreover, investors will leave HK if power supply is unstable or unavailable due to open electricity supply market or lower the Rate Of Return of our existing electricity companies.
2. Lower Permitted Return will deter electricity companies to maintain their reliable services to HK:
 - a. I believe that the existing Permitted Return should not be changed (based on average net fixed asset), as this is a common practice worldwide and simple to monitor.
 - b. The ROR should not be lowered from the present 13.5%, as lower ROR may lead to less investment, which will then affect the supply reliability. Only sufficient ROR can attract the huge and long-term investment required by the power industry.
3. Open electricity supply market in HK:
 - a. If the government allows electricity suppliers from mainland China to enter into HK market in the next 5 years for the sake of competition and hope to drive the tariff down, this may work in a short period of time. But in a long term, the current electricity suppliers will be force to leave the HK market due to lower profit, and by that time, the HK citizens will have to pay a higher electricity charges than before when the power suppliers from the mainland China raise the tariff after driving out the competitors.
 - b. In the view that the shortage of electricity supply in the Guang Dong province will still be very serious in the next 5 to 10 years due to its rapid economic growth and demand in power supply, distributing reliable and stable excess electricity to HK is very unlikely. Even though more power plants can be built in the province to maintain the electricity supply to HK, it is foreseeable that the pollution problem due to the lack of good emission control in those power plants will be getting more serious in the Pearl River delta region.

Dear Sir,

I would like to offer my comments on the Stage 2 Public Consultation Paper on Future Development of the Electricity Market in Hong Kong for your consideration.

I agree with the policy objective stated in the consultation paper, namely, to ensure reliable, safe, efficient and environmentally responsible energy supply at reasonable prices.

I support Government's proposal to continue economic regulation by means of bilateral agreement because pre-requisites for competitive market do not exist in Hong Kong.

However, some of Government's proposed modifications to the current SOC might not help Government to meet the policy objective.

The proposed regulatory period of 10-year period is too short. The power industry is very capital intensive with long payback period. Regulatory period should remain 15 years to facilitate long-term investments.

Government's proposal to apply different returns to different types of assets is unreasonable. All assets are required to deliver reliable service to consumers. Government's proposal will lead to distorted investment decisions which may affect electricity supply in the long run.

Incentives should be provided to power companies to make investment to improve the environmental performance of their power plants. Setting a lower rate of return for emission reduction facilities contradicts with the Government's policy objective of minimising environmental impact.

The proposed 7-11% rate of return is too low. Return level should be sufficient to encourage investment to ensure reliable supply.

本人就香港電力市場未來發展第二階段諮詢有以下意見：

– 文件中歡迎新經營者加入市場，但卻沒有制定清晰的市場開放計劃，此舉將擾亂市場的正常運作。

– 要為香港市場帶來具意義的競爭，就必須待華南地區條件成熟，在公平的基礎上與之融合。若果政府引進新經營者的政策模糊不清，會導致電力市場非驢非馬，既非規管市場，亦非競爭市場模式，造成混亂，影響供電穩定性。在此情況下，相信電力公司難以規劃未來的電力基建投資項目及簽訂長期的燃氣合約。

– 在條件未成熟時開放市場，只會令電力市場秩序大亂，因為新經營者會挑選較大及有利可圖的客戶，而其他小客戶則因而要支付較高的電費，這即是由大多數人付出代價來讓少數人得益。

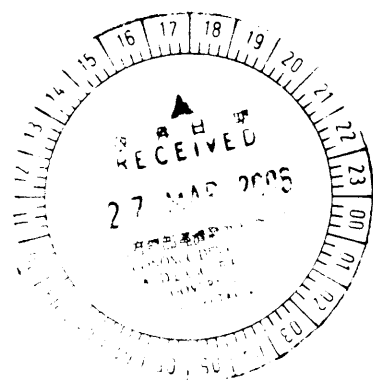

在第二階段諮詢文件裡本人看了後，有點見意！

你好！本人就第二階段諮詢文件的內容有以下意見：

就准許回報方面，本人贊成以固定資產為投資回報基數，因為世界上的供電機構都用這方法來計算，而且比較容易監管，及有助更具效益的融資安排。但本人不贊成以不同資產採用不同的回報率，因為這會令到整個規管變得複雜。而且增加行政費用，最終令納稅人加重負擔。另就投資回報方面，文件建議下調到 7 - 11%，這是用什麼合理依據定出來的？因另若回報過低會導致投資不足，最終影響供電的可靠性。另按照（空氣污染管制條例）電力公司若超越排放上限是要受處罰的，此外電力公司投資是否適當，應決定於妥善的國際慣用準則，而非事後檢討，所以我亦反對針對過剩發電用量罰則。

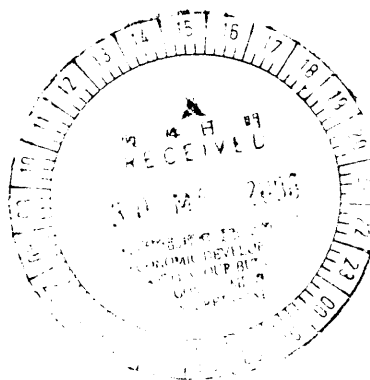
在經濟規管事項方面，政府與兩電簽訂的雙方協議，本人是贊成的，因為簡單及易於實施，而且監管經費較低又可從以往記錄證明有效。建議中的十年期協議及期滿時可再續期五年，這是忽略電力基建較長的投資週期及電力公司需作出的合約承擔，而且亦忽略長壽命資產在規管方面，我反對電費調整要得到政府批准，因為這很容易受制於政治壓力，那有誰會敢來投資？我贊成設立一個「電費穩定基金」，這有助穩定電費及減低非電力公司所能控制的營運風險。若基本超出上限，餘款歸還用戶，這本人亦贊成的。

致於新的電力供應方面，本人反對用內地電力，因為會危害供電的可靠性，而且增加污染物輸入本港，亦會令本港就業機會流失。

在電網開放方面，本人亦是反對，因香港市場實在太小，以及經已成熟及飽和，這樣根本是不可能創造有意義的競爭環境。在加強兩電聯網方面本人亦是反對，因為對電費構成即時壓力，對用戶的好處亦有限。

Dear Sir,

While I concur with the majority of your proposals in the the Stage II Consultation Paper, I do have some additional comments on your Consultation Proposals:-

- 1) It would be unfair to impose penalty on ROR to the power companies if the emission caps cannot be met. There is uncertainty in the post-2008 regulatory framework for the power companies to plan for their long-term investment and there is possibility of future emission trading with the Mainland.
- 2) I think the proposal should properly balance the interests between the investors and the consumers. Consumers should also have the responsibility to pay more in reducing the emission from power plants.
- 3) Since that according to the existing Air Pollution Control Ordinance, the two power companies in Hong Kong have already been subject to penalty when they cannot meet the emission caps, the rate of return (ROR) linked to emission cap target achievement is definitely not a good proposal in the Stage II Consultation Paper.
- 4) ROR should be only directly related to the cost of raising the capital and the various risks incurred. It seems not reasonable to relate the achievement of the emission caps of the power companies to the ROR.

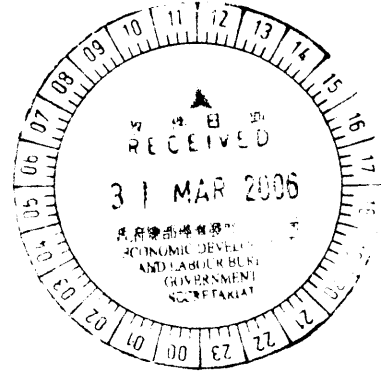

關於未來電力市場發展之意見

現時公眾關於未來電力市場發展之意見，普遍集中在價格方面，忽視討論電力公司與電力使用者各自對環保方面之責任及所需要之誘因，本文現各自論述之。

無可否認，電力公司要在發電過程中減少污染負上一定責任，但在商言商，如果未來的管制協議不能提供足夠誘因，令電力公司在投資新的環保設施時有利可圖，要求電力公司減少污染只會變成痴人說夢。本人建議：

1. 管制協議年期應該維持十五年。由於電力行業一般的投資在首八或九年都未能回本，加上一些合約協議如液化天然氣合約往往長達廿五年。如果管制協議希望電力公司引入天然氣發電，投資可再生能源及減排設施，管制協議的年期實不宜太短。

另一方面，電力使用者對減少污染也有相當責任，本人認為投資可再生能源及減排設施之成本不應完全由電力公司承擔。所謂用者自負，現時污水排放及建築廢料處置的成本最終都會由消費者承擔，為什麼電費不可以有「排污費」呢？而且價格因素永遠是迫使用戶節能最有效的方法！

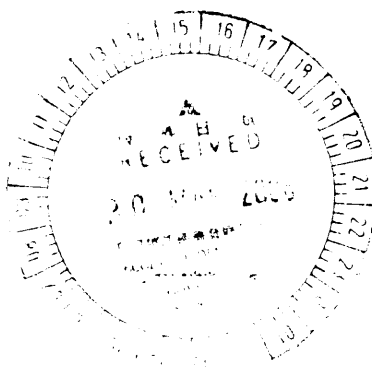

In the current SCAs, the Government closely monitors the demand in the power companies' respective service areas and the timing for the installation of additional generation facilities. As informed in the Stage II Consultation Paper, I now know that in the present mechanism, a portion (40% for CLP Power and 50% for HEC of the capital expenditure on any facility found to be "excessive" would be excluded from the company's ANFA for calculating the return.

In the new regime, all capital expenditure on generation facility found to be excessive will be deducted from the rate base in calculating the company's return. I think that this is not fair to the power companies, the 100% deduction will only discourage investment in generation facilities and eventually, lack of sufficient power supply will be resulted. Therefore, I suggest that this issue be carefully reconsidered.

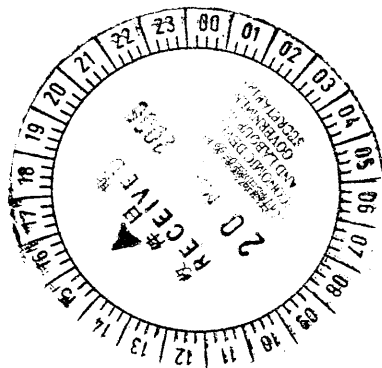

1. With reference to the result of the “ Stage I Consultation paper”, most of the citizen would like to keep no change of the existing regulations for both electric companies in HK.

I also agree with this point, since both companies has been provide stable and reliable of power supply for us in the past many years and they non-stop to improve their service.

2. Interconnection between Hong Kong and Guangdong

I do not support any interconnection with other country.

From your reference documents also indicated that cases of cascaded trips in US and Europe not long ago that showed the drawback of interconnection, therefore this risk cannot be ignored. China cannot provide stable and reliable power supply for their local cities, how come they can provide power supply for us.

3. The permitted rate of return would be in the range of 7% to 11% :

I do not agree with this point. This is neither reasonable nor acceptable base on too many unreasonable or uncontrollable conditions.

As you indicated “the topographical constraints and the limitations in Hong Kong”, there is not possible to “build” a “Renewable Energy power plant” such as solar plant or “energy-from-waste”. You also indicated that both companies are building “wind power plant” to improve and protect the environment. Therefore I suggest Government should try to help they and encourage them instead of “put this requirement as the top requirement of the consideration for the permitted rate”.

At this moment the investment of the “Renewable Energy Power Plant” is very small for both plant, therefore the permitted rate will be highly decreased, how they can survive?

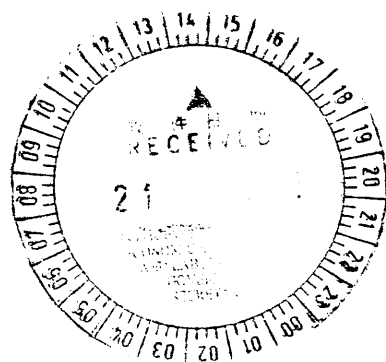
4. Regulator arrangement - To be for 10 years, with an option to extend for another five years subject to a review to be conducted towards the end of the term.

My suggestion is 15 – 20 years, since power plant investment is a long term and big investment, most of the contract(s) are signed for 15 to 25 years. Their regulatory instrument should not be 10 years.

Conclusions: Both companies provided reliable and stable electricity supply to us, gave us an excellence service, non-stop to improve their service, and trying many ways to protect the environment everyday. I suggest the government should encourage them help them to do better and step to be the best power plants in the world. Encourage them is much intelligent and suitable way for them.

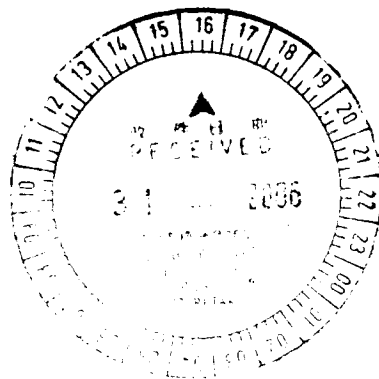

Regarding the above subject, I would like to make the following comments.

Basically, I fully support the policy of ensuring the public "continues to enjoy reliable, safe and efficient electricity supplies at a reasonable price". All these elements are, from my point of view, important to the success of Hong Kong over the years, and shall therefore continue.

I am happy with the electricity supplies and services provided by the two power companies in Hong Kong. Their electricity price is affordable and as compared to other expenses such as transportation and housing, it is not significant in my case. To my understanding, the electricity price in Hong Kong is competitive regionally and worldwide. However, as a customer, I welcome a reduction in the price but as a shareholder, return of my shares is equally important. There are different perspectives for different groups of people. I think the Government should be cautious (and fair) in considering the interest of different parties, and avoid making it a political issue.

As a Hong Kong citizen (and resident), I would like to see improvement in the air quality. 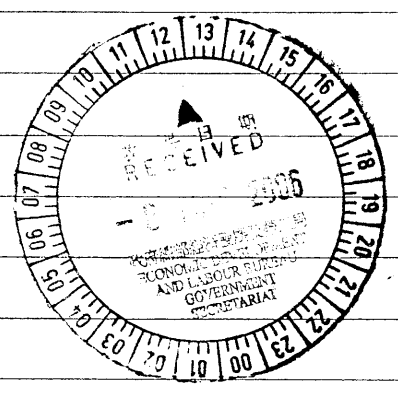

Views on HKSAR Government's Consultation Paper on the
Future of the Electricity Market in Hong Kong - Stage II
Consultation

I'm a qualified scientist / engineer, previously employed
for 24 years by Eskom, the electricity utility in South
Africa, presently living and working in Hong Kong, New
Territories. During my time in South Africa I was involved,
at an operational level, in the electricity industry
transformation process in that country.

I have read the Consultation Paper on Future Development of
the Electricity Market in Hong Kong and seen and heard in
the media many divergent views expressed by Hong Kong's two
electricity companies China Light & Power and Hong Kong
Electric. On the basis of my experience in Eskom, and of
the transformation taking place in the SA in the power
industry I'm writing in to support the views of the two
local power companies and specifically those of CLP who
state their objections very clearly.

In South Africa from the beginning, in the early 90's a
platform for transformation was clearly set out in the
Government's Energy 'White Paper' prior to which a draft
'Green Paper' had been published inviting inputs from all
stakeholders. In addition to spelling out plans for energy
usage, required fuel mix diversity for the country and
procurement of energy supplies in the decades to come,
specific regard was given to the Electricity Industry by
setting out clearly objectives and 'hoped for' end states
namely

- 1) envisaged future flexible electricity market structure,
responsive to social, economic & market forces
- 2) a blueprint for the electricity distribution industry
describing amalgamation of Eskom & Municipal Distribution
to form six Regional Electricity Distributors
- 3) objectives with regard to the corporatisation and
unbundling of Eskom and
- 4) adherence to the principle of 'cost reflectivity' with
regard to development of a required and enabling Wholesale
Tariff structure.

The Government of Hong Kong has not yet achieved this first
important step. It has no Energy Policy nor any clearly
described 'hoped for' end state with regard to its
electricity supply industry. In my view this is the single,
and most seriously grave oversight, leading to the
impression in the minds of stakeholders that Government
hasn't properly thought out a foundation for its proposals.
I tend to agree with this impression. It appears the
industry transformation that Government is proposing is

disorderly rather than orderly, un-thought out, rather than thought out.

The proposed reduction in the period of regulatory review from 15 to 10 years will not encourage needed investment in Hong Kong's power industry. Investors are not going to invest without clarity beyond 15 years, certainly not when returns on their investment are set to reduce further beyond what is currently allowed by Government. Appropriate returns should be in line with industry risks, as reflected in the necessarily large multi-million HK\$ intensive power industry asset base, the risks of assets becoming stranded, and the requirement for long term fuel supply contracts. Procurement of LNG for Hong Kong requires at least a 20 year contract. Likewise a purchase contract for nuclear generated electricity spans a similar timescale if not longer.

Another shortcoming of the Government's Consultation Paper, that supports the conclusion that proposals have not been thoroughly thought through, is insufficient attention to Tariff issues. As an enabling mechanism for contracts to purchase electricity in a wholesale market (ie: energy from Generation Companies; transport of said energy via the Grid to customers etc), the South African Government and its Department of the National Electricity Regulator gave high level and continuous attention to the development of an industry Grid Code and an industry Wholesale Electricity Tariff, thus clearly leading from the front in its intention to separate potentially competitive components from the so-called Eskom monopoly. These two focal points, a common, transparent Grid Code and Wholesale Tariff structure have proved to be vital elements in the foundation of a sustainable electricity industry transformation in South Africa.

From a Hong Kong perspective I believe it is of utmost importance that the mechanisms for connection to grid and tariff setting are clear and objective to allow the industry here to develop on a sustainable basis. The collapse of the market in California is an indication of what can happen when transition to new market structures is set upon shaky foundations. The new competitive electricity market in Singapore, now in its third year of operation, took many years of preparation and careful, well thought out, orderly planning. I believe this is the one area where the Hong Kong Government's proposals fall short.



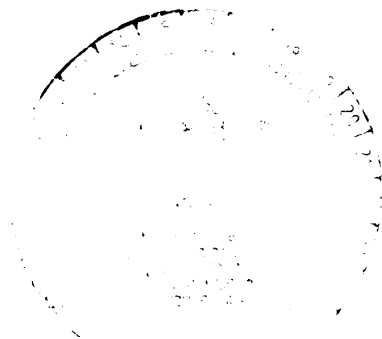

1. 可靠而穩定的電力供應對香港經濟發展和市民生活至為重要。香港現有制度行之有效，不應有太大的改變。規管協議年期太短，會影響投資者對市場的興趣及影響供電的穩定性。

環保

1. 將減排設備回報率降至最低有違鼓勵改善環境的目標。
2. 贊成「用者自負」。

再生能源

1. 由於可再生能源的可靠度低及每度電的成本高昂，香港需小心設定可再生能源應佔的比例，以免大幅增加供電成本及拖低整體供電可靠度。
2. 但香港人多地小，要發展可再生能源有很多限制。若政府要認真發展可再生能源，須提供土地及作出相關協助。

能源政策

1. 政府須制訂一套清晰的能源政策並配合適切的環保條例。包括煤、核能、天然氣等多元化燃料組合對供電可靠性及維持合理電費很重要。政府必須兼顧不同燃料的均衡應用，以免過於依重某些燃料。

開放市場

1. 開放香港市場，最有可能是由內地引入供電。目前國內電力仍然短缺，有關供電可靠性和穩定性不高，相對本港要求，尚有一段距離。要內地在技術、安全、及環保標準方面發展一段時間，才能與香港接軌。與國內電力網聯結，應從詳計議，不可隨意進行。
2. 假如開放電力市場，政府不能為新供電商提供優待或優惠而立下一套另類法則。維持有效競爭，必須訂立公平原則。

我對貴局提出的香港電力市場未來的發展 第二階段諮詢文件(下稱文件)總的印象是站在消費者的立場向兩間電力公司提出了很高的要求。

我覺得穩定、安全的電力供應對香港的發展是非常重要的。應該從保證香港能長期穩定的發展的高度來處理這件事，在這基礎上，有些要求應該要分輕重緩急，按實際情況逐步施行。

另外，我覺得文件對兩間電力公司提出的限制是太多及太死。可以說是想以主觀的願望去規限、干涉電力市場的發展，我覺得這樣做是非常危險的。請注意香港是一個資本主義的社會，香港賴以成功正是由於奉行了資本主義的自由經濟，主要由市場的力量去引導經濟的發展，政府或政治上的干預應該是愈少愈好。當然，由於香港電力市場的特殊情況，政府作出一些規限是應該的，但應該是合情合理，應該有足夠的分析資料來支持，但不應太多及太死。對一些市民的過高要求，政府應站在一個持平、中立的角色，向這些市民做必要的解釋。

以上是兩點原則性的意見，其它的意見有：

1. 兩間電力公司過去的表現說明它們是對社會負責任的公司，不是謀取暴利的公司。
2. 和世界其它主要城市比較，香港的電力供應在穩定性方面是比較好，電費水平是比較便宜，占市民收入的百分比也不算高。
3. 環保的要求是應該的，但應該按可能情況，逐步實施。要明白，香港的環境污染問題是整個區域的問題。
4. 文件對准許投資回報率厘定的原則(見文件的2.56(a)) 太過簡單，亦不見有分析資料支持，回報率應該能反映出有利於達到電力市場的長遠、穩定的發展，而不是為了達到一些表面好處(例如短期的減價)。

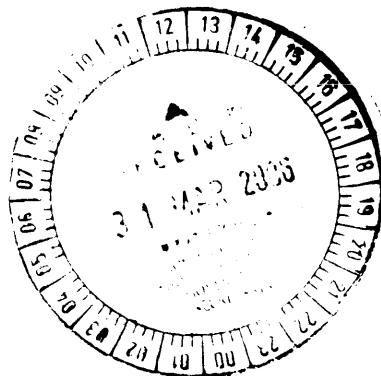
致經濟發展及勞工局局長：

To Economic Development and Labour Bureau,

As a Hong Kong citizen, I am very much concerned about the air pollution caused by the power stations. I strongly demand the government to enhance control in the electricity market, so as to restrict all sorts of pollution induced by power generation. These control measures must not be used by the electricity companies as a pretext for an escape from their social and environmental responsibilities. I thus recommend:

1. The permitted rate of return of power companies should be linked with the total emission caps set under the power companies' licences. Those cannot achieve the caps should have the rate of return reduced;
2. The investment in renewable energy (RE) should earn a higher level of permitted rate of return;
3. We support RE, but not incineration which generates green house gas;
4. Energy saving is fundamental in reducing pollution, as it saves money and conserves our resources. We demand the SAR government to set up a concrete and clear energy saving target;
5. Energy Administration should be established to coordinate the planning of electricity market in terms of economic, social, environmental and regional development;
6. The cooperation in RE development between Guangdong and Hong Kong should be speeded up, including the regional blueprint of wind energy development.

I cordially demand the SAR government to bring us back the blue sky and a breath of clean air.

對香港電力市場第二階段諮詢文件的意見

敬啓者：

本人在電機行業工作了大約二十年，對於電力系統有一定的認識和了解，相對那一群對電力工作和電力系統全無認識，只顧個人民望，無視香港穩定，與一群無見地、無遠見的香港市民跟紅頂白，危害香港社會穩定的‘九反議員’，本人絕對稱得上是專家。*(註：無論政府推出甚麼政策或諮詢，只要有市民反對，不論是否有理據也只會胡亂地十次有九次作出反對來博取民意，稱之為‘九反’)，對不起！以上是本人對那一群‘九反’議員的言論和行爲，并已屈結在內心一段時間的憤怒，藉此機會作出不平鳴而已！

因應本人與電力行業的關係，就政府展開的香港電力市場第二階段諮詢文件發表以下意見：

就應否開放電力市場加入外來競爭者，藉此希望降低電費及給予用戶有供應商的選擇權，從而避免市場壟斷，本人認爲以香港這樣的彈丸之地，有限的發展空間是沒可能做到開放電力市場的。首先是政府計劃在2008年把電力公司的准許投資回報率調低，縮短規管協議期，加入更嚴厲的排污罰則，電力公司調整電價需要政府審批，以不同資產類別來計算准許回報率等等…。就以上而言，跟本就沒有投資者願意做這種高風險、投資大的蝕本生意，就算以現時的規管法則，投資電力動輒要十年八載的時間才能達至回本，往後時間才開始賺錢，若改變了規管條款，想做到回本大約要十五至二十年，更何況賺錢了，若然真的縮短了訂定的規管年期由十五年改爲十年，以這樣的誘因，何來新的投資者，就連現在的電力公司再也提不起投資意慾而可能導致發電、輸電和配電設施不能與時并進而引發電力不穩的大危機，最終會影響到香港的經濟和民生。

有些對電力一知半解的市民可能會說，內地某大電力公司不是說願意投資一億元，作爲供電香港之投資嗎？行內人一定清楚，投資電力如包括興建發電廠、發電機組、電站、鋪設電纜或架空天線等等…，沒有一百數十億跟本沒有可能成事，就算成事也只是冰山一角，何時才能令到部份香港市民可以選擇到這‘平電’？其實這家電力公司怎會不知一億元資本是沒有可能成事，他們只不過是造勢，當公司在股票市場上升幾個價位，公司有錢賺便過海是神仙了，等香港的無知市民以爲他們真的會投資這個蝕本項目。倘若他們肯蝕本，目的志在打入香港電力市場，再作日後發展，但不要忘記他們需要租用兩電投資了龐大金錢的地底或架空電網，試問兩電怎會平租給外來競爭者？那班無知的‘九反’和市民可以想想。如果政府施壓立法監管要兩電開放電網，兩電

在無可奈何之下開放并租出電網，對於這個原本由兩電不停地投資作出更新、改善和維修的設施，在這個已被迫開放的市場環境下，相信兩電再不會投資在這個賤價租出，又有利可圖的電網更新和改善工作上了，只會不壞不整，有壞即整，到時可能一年停幾次電，最終一樣影響到香港經濟和民生。如果外來競爭者不想揸頸就命，自行投資鋪設地下電纜網絡，便會發生如開放電訊市場一樣的附帶問題，就是同一段路面會有多間不同電訊機構分別掘路鋪線，還有這些都是一些細少的電訊電纜，所需要的掘坑位置也比較細少，但真正的輸、配電電纜尺碼，較電訊電纜大很多，如需要掘坑放線，所佔用的路面亦較大和多，到時更多的掘路噪音、塵埃污染、改路和封路等等一連串附帶問題，最終又是影響香港經濟和民生。

另外那些內地發電廠所排放的污染物，現在已實實在在的影響著香港的空氣質素，首先不說那些要用大量金錢去興建與系統配合設施的裝置，假設所有用錢可解決的問題已解決，內地電真可輸港（這麼多要用錢去解決的問題，真的不知道有幾多年平價電可享用），內地排污的監管沒有香港那麼嚴格，如果內地真正輸電供港，內地的發電機組必須加班排放廢氣才能把空氣污染物（當然連同所謂的低價電）輸送到本港，屆時整個天空黑密密，街道全是廢氣，可能要廿四小時關窗開冷氣和開燈，到頭來是得不償失。

兩電在香港投資了很多資源在控制和減低因燃煤發電而排放的污染物，一旦排污物未達指標，便要承擔處罰，香港政府更加想改變規管條例，把投資回報率分類，而減排設備之回報率將會降至最低，目的想電力公司不再只顧投放資源在減排，而應盡力去投資開發清潔能源，大家應知道環保的支出費用昂貴，這個是不爭的事實，到頭來只會令致電費有上調壓力。內地電價比香港平是因為內地不需要做嚴格的環境保護裝置，電力供應又不穩定，如果他們要做到與現時香港兩電之高質素水平，並要由內地供電到香港，電價可能比香港電價還高，若是要用所謂低價電，就要忍受空氣污染和時常停電之苦？

以香港沒有天然資源配合（如沒有大瀑布產生水力發電；更沒有大幅地皮興建風車場做風力發電），燃煤發電是唯一最經濟的發電能源，雖然燃煤發電是比較天然氣發電沒有那麼乾淨，但是兩電已不斷投資及改進設備來控制排污物，並已投資開發可行的再生能源發電，例如鋪設天然氣輸送管道，建造天然氣發電機組來減少燃煤數量，改善空氣質素。如我前文所述環保的東西：像天然氣發電支出費用較昂貴，如果兩電增加使用天然氣，減少燃煤來發電，定必做成電費加價壓力，屆時那班‘九反’議員和無知的市民只會說電費貴。

其實香港空氣質素差，主要源頭是來自內地，當然香港兩電亦有責任，但在人口稠密地區的空氣污染物，主要是來自龐大的柴油巴士車隊及柴油貨車所

排出的廢氣。試想像閣下在市區巴士站等巴士，一部又一部的巴士埋站後，當巴士起步開車時所排出的黑煙，相信閣下都不能否認，這些直接在人煙稠密市區內排放的空氣污染物，遠遠大於要將兩電電廠所排出的廢氣吹入港九市區，影響更深、更直接。

發電廠發展清潔的再生能源，但就沒有加價的可能，為什麼不提倡將柴油車轉用石油氣車、電池車或電油車？要為香港環保，理應公平地大家也出一分力，但本人覺得那些‘九反’議員和那些環保團體從來也沒有出來反柴油車？眼見街道上巴士車龍不斷，有客源的巴士路線不斷重疊，巴士埋站時更爭先恐後，引致交通大擠塞，滿街是廢氣，其實那些議員理應將精神放在爭取運輸署重組巴士路線，減少巴士在繁忙街道的流量，也減少了廢氣和塞車，這樣更有利於我們在繁忙地區居住或工作的市民的健康，更能善用資源，減少不必要的無謂開支，（開十部巴士接載十個乘客到相同目的地，倒不如開一部巴士接載十個乘客，這樣更能令巴士票價有下調空間），只可惜‘九反’就永遠應做不做，應反不反。值得順帶一提的是，本人家庭成員六人，每月用在交通費的總開支超過三千元，但電費開支大約為一千元左右，這樣的家庭開支比例，算是合理嗎？如香港市民能接受這樣昂貴的交通服務，而政府又能給予巴士公司9.7%的回報率，那麼電費真是超級合理了。

開放市場避免壟斷，市民是否一定得益而言，這也未必。我們可看看多間油公司一起控制油價，一年加價六、七次，幾年才減回一次半次價，例如這次由甲公司帶頭加價，下次就由乙公司帶頭加價，大家夾好次序才一起分先後加價，直到最後所有市場價格一致，像這個開放市場，香港市民也沒有得益，相反是肉隨砧板上任由宰割。但那些‘九反’議員大部份都是有車人仕，沒理由他們不拉隊遊行反對油公司這種‘扯貓尾’的行動，或是要求政府減燃油稅？（香港燃油零售價幾乎是全球最高）原因是因為在香港養車是一種奢侈品，車主的要求難以得到一般市民的認同，要反對各油公司的‘扯貓尾’動作，以及在超賺錢的時候減油價回饋車主，‘九反’們可能要費很多工夫才可以達到減油價的效果，但是民心 and 民意就得不著，真是事倍功半。現在兩電雖然賺錢，但多年來凍結電費和有電費回饋市民，相反地‘九反’們卻大力反對兩電加價，因為電力是香港市民的必需品，而這種要求政府或請願的行動就可以得到市民廣大的支持，他們目的只是打民意牌，但一些無知的市民還以為那些‘九反’們真的幫到香港，其實他們只不過是幫自己和擾亂香港平穩經濟發展。

本人想藉著油公司的變相壟斷帶出以下相關的問題，首先香港兩間電力公司擁有龐大的營運車隊，還有一系列須要石油產品運作的設備器材，油價高企自然令到兩電營運成本提高，因而有電費加價的壓力。其次如果開放電力市場迫使兩電投資做聯網（假設香港市民願意接受因兩間不同設計的電力系統成爲

聯網供電，而引致電力供應不穩定的話)，一開始的時候可能令到香港島市民用到九龍半島相對的平價電，但日後會否出現如油公司一般的‘扯貓尾’行動，屆時大眾市民一樣沒有選擇，因為電力是我們市民的必須品。

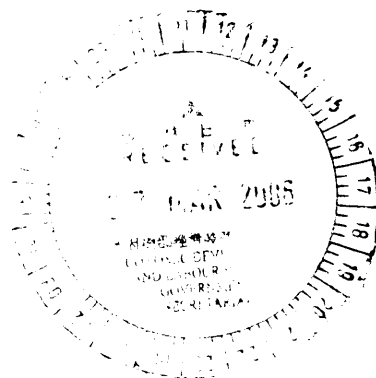
其實香港現在的電力市場分別由兩間財政獨立和電力系統獨立的電力公司營運，兩間電力公司會互相觀察對方的行動而不會貿然行事，包括電價上的設定亦會有所顧慮，假若兩間電力公司成為聯網，電費的設定就沒有顧慮而做成真正的壟斷。

葉局長，本人相信閣下應該詢問過很多機電工程署的工程師及其他電力專家，香港現在有沒有條件開放電力市場而又能繼續保持世界一級的電力穩定性，大家應該心中有數，請不要因為一些外來流言蜚語的壓力而做一些為改革而改革的事。香港空氣質素差非全是兩電的責任，為何要額外加重條款嚴懲兩電，但就容許其他香港的公共事業在人煙稠密的地方排放過量污染物，而且電力發展是一項長遠的固定資產投資，改變協議年期及降低投資回報率，定必令投資者卻步，沒有人會投資做生意，一心想將錢倒進咸水海。作為長遠電力投資項目，理應給予投資者有可見的回報率支持才能誘發投資意慾去改善電力系統，改變協議年期及降低投資回報率只會嚇阻投資者，電力系統不能與時並進，不能做到相應改善或維修工程，最後只會影響電力的穩定性，危害香港經濟和民生。其實兩電一直都供應世界級水平的電力給香港市民，兩電現時不是獅子開口地討價還價，只不過是想保持現時行之有效的規管模式，繼續以合理的電價供應一級水平的電力，不明白為何強調要為改革而改革？因為改革而引伸出來的不良後遺症是一群真正想為香港好、有遠見的香港市民不想看到的。

葉局長，請原諒本人以上不太禮貌的言論，本人在此致歉，以上是本人因應那些唯恐香港不亂的‘九反’議員的所作所為而按捺不住地要宣洩一番，希望葉局長能分清是與非。本人亦支持政府推行可再生能源及使用較清潔的電力能源，來改善香港的空氣質素，但要實質推行必須要政府與兩電作出相應的配合，事實上兩電亦已投資興建天然氣發電機組和有關之輸氣設備，要全面改用天然氣發電來替代燃煤發電仍然有很長遠的路要走，試問若沒有清晰的規管架構及可見的長遠投資回報誘因，在這條長遠（2008年後可能會十分崎嶇）的清潔能源之路有誰願意繼續出錢出力向前走呢？最後本人希望香港能繼續保持合理的電價、優質和穩定的電力供應，避免因為改革而引發出更多不明朗因素及一連串的反效果後遺症。

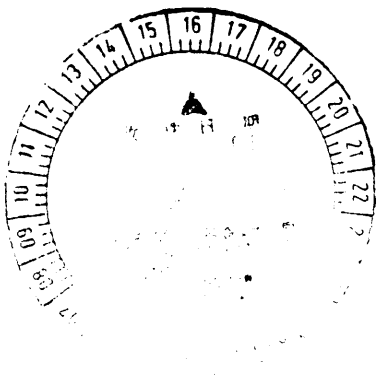

After reading the Stage II Consultation Paper on Future Development of I H.K. Electricity Market, I have comments as summarized below on some of the proposals concerning “New Supply Sources”, “Economic Regulation”, “Permitted Rate of Return” and “Tariff Regulation”:

(1) Chapter 2B “New Supply Sources”

Proposals in this Chapter	Views/Comments
Supply from the Mainland	<p>View:</p> <p>I <u>do not concur</u> with this proposal.</p> <p>Comments:</p> <p>The electricity supply situation in Guangdong remains tight and the timetable that Guangdong can actually resolve the situation is uncertain. For reason of supply reliability which I consider is of prime importance to Hong Kong as an international finance centre, I think it is unrealistic to rely our future supply on source with uncertainty.</p> <p>Furthermore, I am also concerned that this arrangement will cause loss of job opportunities to the Mainland.</p>

Summary

Hong Kong has a very safe, reliable and environmentally responsible power supply system with reasonable tariff which in fact is in the lower range when compared other cities. This proved that the existing SOC system is workable and effective and I therefore doubt very much whether we should make big changes on the present terms of the system without proof. On the contrary, some of the proposals in the Stage II Consultation Paper worry me as I feel they might discourage sufficient investment in the electricity market and affect the supply reliability as a result.

As reliable electricity supply is a must for Hong Kong as a financial centre and a city with so many high-rise buildings, ways to ensure sufficient investment in power industry is important. I therefore hope that EDLB could take into account of my above-mentioned comments in reviewing the Consultation Paper.

I am a HK citizen living on HK Island. As electricity is one of the necessities that I need to consume without too many alternatives, development of the Scheme of Control on the electricity companies certainly is of my interest. I do agree that the rate of return entitled by the companies under the current regime lacks flexibility and the way the tariff increase lacks transparency. Therefore I did spend some time reading the Stage II Consultation Paper on Electricity Market in Hong Kong put forth by the HKSAR Government. To my disappointment, the argument point put forth by the Government is equally lack of transparency. To be honest, some! the suggestions stated in the Paper were not too fair to the two electricity companies. Why reduce from 13.5% to 7-11%? What if the inflation suddenly goes up to 10%? This rate of return range is equally inflexible. Being an investor also in various blue-chips stock, I would like to express my opinion from the point of view of an investor.

Clause 2.40(a) already stated that all development plan has to be approved by the Government. If already approved, why should the electricity companies have to bear 100% penalty on excess capacity as stated in Clause 2.50? Everyone knows that planning is planning and cannot be 100% accurate. This point sounds a bit too unfair to the investors. In Clause 2.50, even the Government itself stated that such regulation would deter investment, hence after stability. If such shortfall can already been foreseen, clearly it is not a good suggestion. Why put down in the Paper then? Who can bear the consequence of electricity instability?

Clause 2.49 use additional measure to guard against violation of emission caps. To me it is a very strange practice. If there is deficiency in the SPLs, we should go for amending the law rather than go after the rate of return on the investors. Is it because the Government finds it too difficult to change the law and as the result, try to sneak the control in in other inappropriate places?

Clause 2.55 proposed a lower rate of return on emission reduction facilities. To my understanding, emission reduction facilities have the same effect of improving environmental health. Why can't it enjoy the same rate of return as RE infrastructure? If both offer the same level of environmental protection but the emission reduction facilities are much cost-effective, the companies should even be given a better incentive to do so. This point proposed by the Paper is very contradicting.

The above are just some of the things I spotted that are questionable in the Paper.

**Views on the Stage II Consultation Paper -

<p>A) Policy Objective [Paragraphs 2.1 to 2.2]</p>	<p>To ensure that the public can continue to enjoy reliable, safe and efficient energy supplies at reasonable prices, and to minimise the environmental impact caused by the production and use of energy.</p>
<p>Our views</p>	<p>We find that the energy policy objective is set in a way which spells out the generic attributes in need regardless of the outcome on the future Hong Kong's electricity market reform. We expect the Government should take a lead to envision the community with a clear strategic framework for achieving the objective.</p> <p>We believe achieving the objective is not necessarily at odds with different form of market models or relating to the degree of competition they involve. Reliability and economic efficiency can be compatible, but this outcome requires more than reliance on the laws of physics and the principles of economics. It requires sustained, focused efforts by regulators, policy makers, and industry leaders to strengthen and maintain the institutions and rules needed to protect both of these important goals. The future regulation must ensure competition, if any, can safeguard and balance interest of different stakeholders. It does not erode incentives to comply with reliability requirements, and that reliability requirements do not serve as a smokescreen for noncompetitive practices.</p>
<p>B) New Supply Sources [Paragraphs 2.4 to 2.10]</p>	<p>(I) Supply from the Mainland</p>
<p>Our Views</p>	<p>We support the Government to make preparations for feeding in possible supply from the Mainland as proposed. We believe these initiatives can turn in more fruitful results if they work towards achieving specific targets such as to align our electricity market development with the China's long-run open power market policy; realizing Hong Kong's energy market development as an integral part of the South China Region.</p>

Our Views	<p>We support the Government for taking the proposed steps to promote and encourage the use of RE as a sustainable supply source. However, traditional financial analysis, based on discounted cash-flow accounting, undervalues future fuel price risks and ignores the environmental and health costs of fossil-fueled power plant emissions. If the cost of the environmental externalities is properly accounted for, the economically viable quantity of renewable energy increases. We need clear and strategic measures to cost and price the energy sources and their associated environmental impacts.</p>

The Government should ensure that the transmission networks are developed in a well coordinated manner and commit to kick off the reform by fixing up specific targets first.</p>

Our Views	We believe it is reasonable to continue using the current safety regulation till the time when a new regulatory authority has to be set up.

Our Views	<p>By the same rationale as described in C(I), we believe it is reasonable to continue regulating the environmental emissions by legislation.</p> <p>However, the environmental impacts caused by the generation of electricity using fossil fuels often result in real costs to society but it is difficult to quantify the environmental externalities in dollar terms. Although environmental impacts and associated dollar costs are often included in academic economic comparisons between renewable and conventional energy, investors rarely include such environmental costs in their power plant decision-making process. Hence, we support the Government's proposal to adopt certain measures under the rate-base regulation to incentivize utilities to adopt more innovative technology including those on RE.</p>

It thus makes sense to regard the proposed regulatory instrument as an interim

Our views (Cont')	<p>measure for transitioning to a new regulatory setup. It is unfortunate that the Government has not make this clear, or otherwise, in the proposals resulting with unnecessary disputes based on interpretation of the 10-year extension period as an investment return factor. A clear mandate to make use of it as a transitional period, the focus will then be on how long we need to formulate a new regulation framework. By then, we can always extend it until the time when everything is ready to go.</p> <p>The basic method for determining a fair return rate using the rate-base regulation has to consider many factors, including capital investment, operating costs and system reliability etc. In the proposals, the Government would like to adopt an integrated approach to determine the permitted rate of return. It includes provision of financial incentives to the power utilities for increasing use of RE and, improving on operational efficiency and performance in energy conservation. However, the lack of visible installations and familiarity with renewable energy technologies can lead to perceptions of greater technical risk than for conventional emission reduction plant, for instant. These perceptions may lead to increase required rates of return as suggested in the proposals for promoting the use of RE. Also, this common practice can be justified as a means of recognizing their long-term environmental and economic benefits.</p> <p>Once the reform targets can be set, we find the proposals for having more provisions for close monitoring and review are reasonable as to ensure the return are set in line to achieve the stated energy objective. More dedicated effort can then be devoted for setting up the regulatory framework deemed appropriate in 10 years' time.</p>



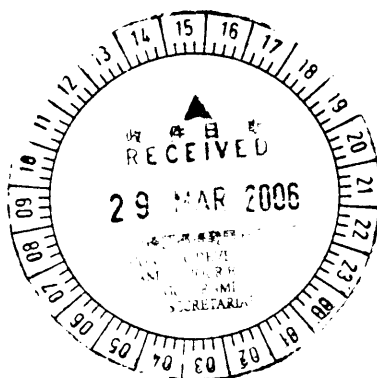

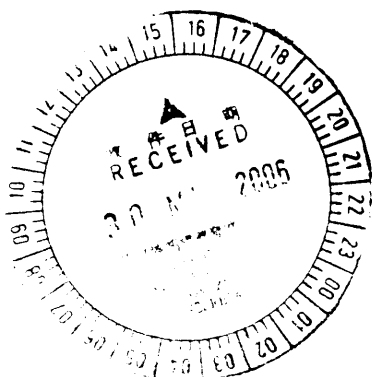

Stage II Consultation

Government has launched the Stage II Consultation on the future development of the electricity market in Hong Kong. As a Hong Kong citizen and electricity consumer, I would like to send in my views and comments on the Government's proposed arrangements in the Stage II Consultation Paper.

Reliability of Electricity Supply

Most of the people live and work in high-rise buildings in Hong Kong. High level of reliability of electricity supply is of paramount importance to us for ensuring the safety and comfort for the dense population in Hong Kong. Moreover, Hong Kong depends on a highly reliable electricity supply to maintain its position as an Asia's financial and commercial centre. The massive blackouts in North America and Europe in 2003 have fully illustrated the severe consequences of blackouts. If such a large-scale blackout occurs here, Hong Kong will be paralysed and suffers great economic loss. Hence, the high standard of reliability and security of electricity supply in Hong Kong should not be taken for granted. This high standard electricity supply should continue with the highest priority and must not be put at risk. Therefore, I support Government's policy objective, which will ensure the reliability of electricity supply in the post-2008 period. However, Government's proposals of third party grid access, supply from the Mainland and increased interconnection between HEC and CLP will increase the risks to supply reliability of Hong Kong. Government should be aware that Hong Kong cannot afford to trade the reliability of electricity supply for an uncertain open market after 2008.

Duration of Regulatory Period

Many of the proposals contain flaws, if implemented, will jeopardise the reliability of Hong Kong's electricity supply system. Government proposes to reduce the duration of the regime from 15 years to 10 years. Such proposal fails to recognise the unique characteristics of electricity industry, which is capital intensive, long investment cycles with assets lives exceeding 30 years, and long-term fuel purchase commitments of the power companies. Under the new regime, power companies only have 10 years of certainty to earn a return and have increased investment risk for electricity infrastructure.

Sufficiently long regulatory period should be given to power companies so that they are willing to continue to invest.

Permitted Rate of Return

Government should also be very careful about the setting of the rate of return because the proposed rate of return has been drastically lowered to between 7-11%. There is no justification provided in the consultation paper as to how these rates of return are derived. With this proposal implemented, it is envisaged that there will be inadequate incentives to encourage appropriate investment in electricity infrastructure. Also, the proposed 4-tiered rate of return is illogical. If the cost of raising capital for an asset is the same, the rate of return should also be the same.

Moreover, this proposal does not appear logical because greater incentive will be provided to renewable energy sources than for emission reduction facilities. Since both renewable sources energy and emissions reduction facilities are environmental protection measures, in my view, they must be given the same level of incentive. The end users of electricity must be responsible for paying the cost to reduce pollution generated by the production of electricity. The power companies should not bear the cost for reducing the pollution. Government must stick to the “User-Pay” principle in devising a more logical incentive mechanism to encourage the power companies to further invest new emissions reduction facilities. The proposed 7% rate of return on emission reduction facilities, which is considered too low, cannot help mitigating the air pollution problem in Hong Kong.

Tariff Adjustment Mechanism

Government approval for all tariff adjustments is not a good proposal. Power companies should be allowed a reasonable chance to recover their business costs and fair profits on invested capital through their tariffs. If all tariff adjustments are subject to Government's approval, the costs and permitted returns for power companies will be no longer sufficiently protected. It may be subject to undue political pressure, which shall increase risks borne by investors.

Emission Penalty

Government should seriously review its proposed emission penalty mechanism, which links the rate of return with emission performance. Since there is unclear picture of the post-2008 regulatory framework and lack of clarity on energy policy for the power companies to plan for their long-term investment, it will be unfair to impose penalty on the rate of return if the power companies cannot meet the emission caps, which are unilaterally set by the Government.

At present, the Government will penalize power companies if they fail to meet the emission caps under the Air Pollution Control Ordinance. If there is an additional penalty on the rate of return due to failure in meeting the emission caps, the power companies will be subject to a “double penalty”.

I request the Government to evaluate the proposals more cautiously in the Stage II Consultation Paper and my views will be seriously considered and reflected in the Stage II Consultation.

I have the following comment about the Consultation paper;

1) The Paper recommended to lower the permitted rates of return to 7-11%, but it is hard to draw an objective analysis in the absence of details for the proposed rate. Besides, the paper recommend to tighten many items, including emission standards, use renewal energy etc. All this require lot of investment,

I think the power company should be encouraged, not penalized to acheive this, otherwise the reliability of the power supply will be affected as the power company will not invest as the same way before. The Government and the electricity consumer also have the responsibility for the enviroment. We should not just put all the responsibility to the company.

2) The paper proposed that the term of the new Scheme of Control be cut to 10 years, with an option for a five-year extension after a review before expiry. However, Power sector investments are capital intensive, immobile, with asset lives exceeding 30 years while huge fuel commitments involving billions of dollars of liabilities extend over 20 years. Therefore, the regulatory period should not be shortened, as this will increase investment risks.

3) The Government suggested the rate of return be reduced if power companies failed to meet the emission targets. This is unreasonable as the power companies are already subject to penalty for failing to meet the emission caps under the Air Pollution Control Ordinance. Disincentivising environmental investments by offering a lower return while, at the same time, seriously tightening emissions standards with added penalties not only produces an environment that will distort investment decisions but also undermines the sustainability of the industry and hence the long term interests of society.

This new proposal will mean double penalty for power companies

4)The Government recommended that assets should be classified into categories according to returns. I think this will only complicate the regulatory structure, causing unnecessary disagreement and increasing administrative cost.

5) As the current regulatory regime works. Hong Kong's electricity supply is world-class & with high reliability. There is nothing to suggest that a fundamental or radical change to the current regime is either necessary or appropriate. I believes that the current, well-established, successful regulatory regime should be maintained.

Before stating my views on the consultation paper, I would like to declare that I am an employee of The Hongkong Electric Co., Ltd. and I am making an objective view points on the consultation paper simply based on a citizen of Hong Kong and having some knowledge towards Hong Kong's electricity market.

My views on a few issues related to the future development of the electricity market in Hong Kong are as follows:-

1. Policy Objective

I fully agreed with the objective of the Government's energy policy in ensuring that the public can enjoy Reliable, Safe and Efficient Energy Supply at Reasonable Prices, and to Minimize the Environmental Impact caused by the production and use of energy. Reliable and clean supply at reasonable price is of prime importance.

2. New Supply Sources / Open Market

Electricity supply is not a pure commercial business as it is a necessity for human living, just like water. The Government has responsibility to ensure everyone in Hong Kong can get the electricity they need and satisfying the policy objective. This shall not be short-sighted.

A pure open market driven by commercial profits may not be the suitable solution for electricity supply in Hong Kong. As read from the Discussion Forum in the Government's web site, there are quoted real life experiences showing problems in open market electricity supply in many countries such as:

- No proper investment to cope with economic growth and maintenance needs leading to reliability problem and black out issues.
- Low incentive towards environmental improvement facilities as these are basically "non-profit making".
- No benefit in Hong Kong in view of its small size and localized population.
- Inflated tariff over a few years.

2. New Supply Sources / Open Market (Cont'd.)

The Government must have a very thorough and professional study on the impact to Hong Kong caused by open market but not just simply focus on decrease in tariff. In fact, the aim in open electricity supply is to enhance supply reliability and achieve better utilization of generation facilities over regional zones with different demand peak periods. Hong Kong does not have the necessity for open electricity market in these two aspects.

Notwithstanding the above, a policy which is fair in all aspects and satisfying the policy objective shall be established prior to opening the market. This shall also include means to effectively monitor the suppliers' performance. Apart from CLPP and HEC, I believe that other potential suppliers would be from Mainland China. It is foreseeable that there are material differences in system reliability, quality control, flue emissions and legislative regime in the two places within decades due to differences in culture. This is particular important in environmental protection aspects in which even Hong Kong needs to improve further. We must not buy "polluted" electricity though we may get a lower tariff. Remember that our objective is base on reasonable price but not to strive for the lowest tariff.

In view of the above, open market is not suitable for Hong Kong within decades unless we can see substantial improvement with proven good history in electricity business in Mainland China. I support to adopt regulatory regime similar to the currently implemented one for electricity supply in Hong Kong.

3. Proposed Framework for New Regulatory Regime

I think the reliability of electricity supply in Hong Kong is currently meeting what our community requires and this must be maintained. On the other hand, as a well developed and civilized city, we must pay more to protect the environment. Under the current technology and geological conditions of Hong Kong, it is inevitably that "green electricity" will cost higher. This is same as many other environmental protection measures which are not economical solutions. However, I support to have a policy providing sufficient incentive to electricity suppliers to do more on environmental protection including emission minimizing facilities or development of Renewable Energy though this may increase the electricity tariff.

A regulatory regime as proposed in the consultation paper is adequate but the proposed lower rate of return for environmental protection measures does not provide incentive and seems contradicted with the policy in minimizing environmental impact. Moreover, the proposed 10-year regulatory period also seems too short to cope with the huge capital investment for electricity generation which takes breakeven period over 15 years. The proposed framework for the new regulatory regime has negative incentive for electricity suppliers to invest to satisfy the policy objective.

Cont'd/...3

3. Proposed Framework for New Regulatory Regime (Cont'd.)

Regarding the proposed lower rate of return between 7% to 11%, frankly, I do not have knowledge in how to calculate a reasonable figure. However, in normal life, I think this is not an attractive figure even for personal financial management targets. In order to achieve the policy objective, a reasonable rate of return and sufficient long regulatory period are necessary to give positive incentive for investment. From past history, the existing rate of return of around 13.5% may be a suitable figure. I also consider a regulatory period even longer than 15 years is more suitable for electricity business.

4. Reasonable Price

Having said what are required in item 3 above, we must maintain a reasonable price for electricity. The data from the Census and Statistics Department HKSAR indicates that the expense in electricity is less than 2% of the total household income in average. I think this is very reasonable when compared to other expenditures such as accommodation, transportation and food which are also necessities in living.

I think the Government is giving wrong impression to the public in emphasizing the needs in reducing electricity tariff in Hong Kong. Of course, everyone will be happy to hear a chance of cost reduction in anything. However, is it the true picture in Hong Kong that the electricity tariff is unreasonably high? From the comparisons with the tariff of other developed cities, Hong Kong's electricity tariff is at a very competitive level. The Government should tell the public more but it is disappointed that the Government has not clarifying this clearly.

On the other hand, the Government should take a positive role in smoothing out the differences in tariff between CLPP and HEC. I understand that one of the major causes for HEC's higher tariff is the higher investment cost such as higher land premium, higher infrastructure cost, small capacity (less efficient) generators to comply with Government policy, more environmental protection facilities, smaller population size...etc., which are the limitations particularly in Hong Kong Island. The Government may focus on these and figure out regulatory framework helping to bridge the gap.

To summarize, I consider we are currently having reliable electricity supply at very reasonable price based on the regulatory regime in past years. I support to a similar regulatory regime as the present one should be implemented for the future but adding more elements to provide positive incentive for investment in environmental protection. Supply reliability is still the prime concern in Hong Kong.

We are a small construction company in HK and would like to express our views on the Stage II Consultation.

We think the existing Scheme of Control framework is a very effective way to balance the interest of different stakeholders and should be maintained.

The reduction of the rate of return from 13.5% & 15% to 7% to 11% is much too drastic and would in the long term affect the business environment of HK. The tariffs we pay for electricity is comparatively more affordable than rents and salary for staff.

The proposed 4-tier rates of return applied to 4 different types of assets is irrational and in particular we do not understand why renewable energy and emissions reduction facilities are treated so differently as both are environmental protection measures. In addition, multiple tiers is complicate and would increase the government and the electricity companies administration costs. We think this is unnecessary.


Regarding the appropriate regulatory period, we think that 15 years is reasonable taking into account the long term nature of the investment cycle and contractual commitments of the power industry. 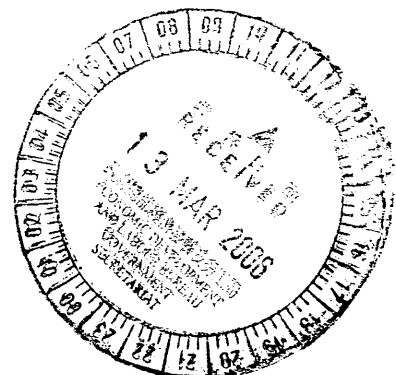

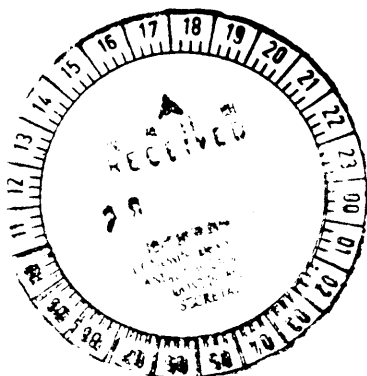

Comments on the Stage II Consultation Paper

Who doesn't want to have his cake and eat it too? Who doesn't want to have a good horse that doesn't feed on hay? These seem to be what the Stage II paper is trying to lead the HK consumers into believing as achievable goals. Unfortunately, these are impossible targets.

Of course I want to pay less for using the electricity but the fact that I am typing this comment on my computer in an air-conditioned room on the 21st floor of a building is enough to convince me that first and foremost I need the electricity to be there when I turn on the switch. Didn't the Stage I Consultation already reveal the clear consensus that reliability and safety of electricity supply are of paramount importance? I see many inconsistencies in the Stage II paper in trying to preserve the enviable position Hong Kong has in its reliable electricity supply.

My specific comments are as follows:

- On Economic Regulation
 - Disagree with shortening the base term of the agreement to ten years. It might deter major capital investment and hence affect the future reliability of supply.
 - To avoid any temptation on the part of the power companies to over-invest, the existing provision to disallow return on excess capacity can be beefed up.
 - Disagree with the annual review of tariff. If the government can withhold tariff increase at the annual review after approving an investment plan submitted by the power companies, who would be willing to make investment on such basis? If it is merely a review to make the government appears to have done something but with no real teeth to change anything, then it is totally meaningless and a waste of tax payer's money.
 - Agree with the plan to try and negotiate a lower return with the power companies if it is achievable. It is a bilateral agreement, right? What's the point in setting a return level publicly if the other side would not agree to it?

- On Environmental Regulation
 - It is inconsistent to expect more investment in emission reduction measures and yet propose a lower return for such category of investment. I thought we are trying to give incentive, not disincentive for environmental protection.

- Renewable Energy
 - Disagree with incentive in the return structure to encourage the use of RE. It will be a sure way to encourage expensive investment which is not required. I think the whole 1 to 2% RE target by 2012 is a joke in the first

place. There are more cost effective means to promote environmental protection.

- Supply from the Mainland
 - It wouldn't happen for a while but will probably happen in the future. The government should plan ahead and develop a clear and well thought out policy to prepare for its coming. However, the government should be careful not to provide an opportunity for speculators to promote their own interests at the expense of HK investors.

- Grid Access
 - This is also a matter to be negotiated with the power companies. Hong Kong is the freest economy in the world, so let's respect the property rights of every citizen even if that citizen happens to be a power company.

- Increased interconnection between HEC and CLP
 - Agree and hope that it will lower the tariff on Hong Kong island.


In response to the Stage II Consultation Paper, I wish to express my views on the Government's proposals in the Stage II Consultation Paper.

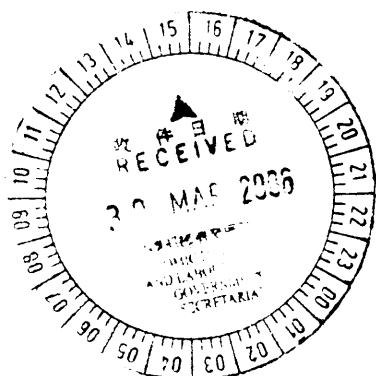

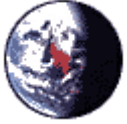

The new permitted return will be 7-11%. However, will 7-11% be reasonable when compared with the present risk free interest rate, which is greater than 4%? Please keep in mind that the power suppliers have to invest a lot of money in building new electricity generating stations, electricity stations, and other needed accessories. In addition, their expected return for their investment cannot be recovered within a short period of time.

As well, the design, plant procurement, tendering, construction, and commissioning of the plant will take more than a year to complete. Will the ten years regulatory period with an option for the extension of five years be reasonable to the power suppliers?

I was born in Hong Kong and used to enjoy the blue skies of winter, the clear waters and bright sunshine of summer and my good health. Now, I take an anti-histamine, Zertec, every day. My nose is like a tap that no washer can mend. Beautiful Hong Kong is now a smoggy and depressing place. On rare days that the hills are visible, shining with green (usually after a typhoon), I feel my spirits lift. I can, quite literally, see where I am.

The selfishness which has driven Hong Kong's development over the past twenty years has led to the erosion of our harbour, our environment and the destruction of many beautiful buildings which were all part of our communal heritage. Future Development of the Electricity Market in Hong Kong
Stage II Public Consultation

I am writing to express my views on the subject as a consumer (basically a HK resident) and a shareholder of the utility companies.

As a Hong Kong born resident, I must admit that I miss the clear blue sky I used to enjoy when I was young. I totally agree with the government 's mission to seriously address the intensifying air pollution problem in Hong Kong. I am also a strong believer that caring for the environment is everybody 's responsibility, users and producers of energy alike. Unlike in other parts of the world, the supply of electricity in Hong Kong is privately funded from the beginning and it has saved taxpayers a lot of money in this large-scale investment. Compared to the experience in other developed markets, I am proud of the performance of both utility companies in delivering excellent customer services and unbeatable supply reliability, which has been taken much for granted by users. On surface, it seems beneficial to consumers if the utilities are penalised for not meeting emission targets and not able to pass on the cost of emission reduction to the consumers. However, my view is that, in order to improve air quality, consumers should be receptive to the fact that cleaner air costs more and they should be proactive in conserving energy. Anything that comes cheap is so often wasted. On the other hand, I urge the government to provide more incentives to the suppliers for expenditure in renewable energy and environmental improvement investments alike, particularly when we know that there is not much scope for large-scale renewable energy projects in Hong Kong.

On the future development of the electricity market, I am not in favour of deregulation. The lessons in California, New York and Europe have caused us to rethink about the true " benefits " of deregulation. UK is one of the first electricity markets to deregulate back in the early 90s. Recent research reviews on the impact of deregulation on residential consumers found that price savings is questionable, there have been increased consumer complaints, expected competition failed to develop and higher price for low-income consumers. I can afford not to speak on my mobile if the network coverage of my service provider is weaker because I choose to go for a cheaper plan but I am not prepared to compromise for any disruption in electricity supply in return for a deregulation, the benefit of which is yet to be proved. Nowadays, we hear about " Hong Kong being

marginalised ” and maintaining its reputation as an international financial centre, is key to the future success of Hong Kong. This will not be sustainable if we do not have top reliability in electricity supply.

Being a shareholder of the utility companies, I am investing my savings in a defensive stock looking for long-term stability in returns. I am deeply concerned about the uncertainties in policies introduced in this Stage II Consultation Paper. When Bus Companies are entitled to a 9.7% return on assets, I see it unreasonable to cut returns on electricity assets to below that level. I also find it un-justified to reduce the Agreement period to ten years when it usually takes three years to commission a generating unit. If the Government has decided to open the market in ten years, I think it is only fair to clearly state the rules of the game early enough for the existing duopolies to plan for their investments and strategy as well as for us, investors, to assess if the risk profile of our investment will change significantly as a result.

It is hoped that the Government will consider all views from this Consultation and formulate a policy for the future development of the electricity market for the benefit and future success of Hong Kong.

Thank you for your EMAIL of 6th Jan 2006 inviting me to provide my views on the Stage II public consultation on future development of the electricity market in Hong Kong.

I wish to provide my comments as follows:

1. Policy Objective

I support the Policy Objective of ensuring that the public can enjoy reliable, safe and efficient energy supplies at reasonable prices, and to minimize the environmental impact caused by the production and use of energy.

However, there must be objective measurement of the environmental impact caused by the production and use of energy. The Government cannot arbitrarily set emission limits that the power utilities consider very challenging to achieve, both in terms of the ultimate reduction in emissions and the time table allowed for implementation.

From Radio Hong Kong program on 11th Feb. I heard from Betty Yuen of CLP that the emission reduction targets were based on the report "Study of Air Quality in the Pearl River Delta Region (Agreement No. CE 106/98)" posted at EPD web site http://www.epd.gov.hk/epd/english/environmentinhk/air/studyrrpts/study_pearl.html.

However, the report was prepared without involving the power companies. The basic assumptions and the implementation plans proposed in the report to achieve the proposed reduction were not discussed with the stake holders. It seems that EDLB does not entirely endorse the accelerated installation of gas fired generators to replace coal fired units, which is the basic assumption in the report to meet the emissions reduction proposed. This has caused difficulties in the power companies to achieve the reduction target.

2. Opening up the Electricity Market

The issue of increased interconnection between the two power companies in Hong Kong has been discussed some years ago with the conclusion that there is little to gain by a stronger interconnection. Since then the situation has not changed much for the generation and transmission/distribution systems of the two power companies. The conclusion should remain the same if a further study is carried out on this subject now. Hence I do not support the proposal to consider importing electricity from China or making provisions for new supply sources during this SCA renewal.

Open competition in the electricity market has many different forms. There are lots of experiments in open competition trials elsewhere in the world and successful cases are rare, while failed cases had cause considerable financial losses to the consumers and some utilities.

3. Renewable Energy

The potential of application of renewable energy in Hong Kong is small. Hong Kong has no hydro resources. Solar energy is very expensive and uneconomical. Wind energy required lots of space. The recent proposal of a big wind farm in Hong Kong has received more negative views than support from the general public. Unless the resources in mainland China can be utilized there is not much that can be done for renewable energy in Hong Kong. Importing renewable energy from China actually deprives them of the use of cleaner electricity. The new regulation scheme should not put too much emphasis on renewable energy. It is acceptable to offer financial incentive for the power company to invest in renewable energy. Renewable energy should not be made a mandatory requirement in the new Schemes of Control agreement. The 1 to 2 percent renewable energy target proposed by EMSD report on Renewable Energy cannot be achieved without extensive use of waste to energy. Waste to energy, however, is yet to be debated as there is still lots of objections from the Green Groups.

4. Proposed Regulatory Arrangements

a. Safety

I support the proposal to continue regulation of safety issues through Electricity Ordinance with EMSD as enforcement agency.

b. Environment

Environmental issues cannot be decoupled from economic considerations, and the cost of upgrading environmental performance of existing facilities should not become a burden of the shareholders of the publicly listed electric utilities. The current proposal of allowing a much lower return on investment to improve environmental performance and penalize the power companies on ROI if power companies exceeded arbitrarily set emission caps were unreasonable. There is nowhere else in the developed world that has such policy.

c. Economic

The current SCA was considered a good regulatory scheme because it has proven performance in terms of power supply reliability which is vital to a vertically and densely built city like Hong Kong. The cost of electricity should be compared with the potential economic loss of electricity not supplied due to an unreliable/downgraded power system. Too low a permitted return in the new SCA would deter investment into the power system hence would result in a deterioration of performance. There had been examples of insufficient investment into power systems elsewhere in the world that has led to frequent or even prolonged outages, resulting in huge economic losses. We should not cause the power system in Hong Kong to follow such development path.

5. Duration of the Agreement

The existing SCA is valid for 15 years with two interim reviews. The period is considered appropriate considering that the infrastructures for the power supply business are mostly fixed assets with operating life in excess of 15 years. The environmental requirement and the tightening in emission limits has forced the power companies to extensively use natural gas. Natural gas supply is characterised by long term contracts, extending to 20 years or more in typical contracts. Too short a regulatory period would increase the risk of the investors because the ROI or other terms of the agreement is subject to change in a much shorter period compared with the

commitment made by the utilities.

6. Different Permitted Return for different Assets

This proposal is not acceptable as there should not be distinction between assets. All assets are as important to achieve a clean, reliable and efficient power system. Giving preference to RE or providing very low ROI for environmental projects would distort the structure of a healthy power system. It also increase unnecessary administrative cost of the regulator and utility.

7. Overall Energy Policy

There seems to be no coordination between EDLB the bureau that has jurisdiction on economic matters and ETWB the bureau that has jurisdiction over environmental issues. Policies of the two bureaux are often contradictory. While EDLB wants low cost electricity, ETWB imposes emission caps that are unachievable without considerable investment on new environmentally friendly machines. More cooperation between the two bureaux is required.

I have the following opinions on the Stage II Consultation proposals.

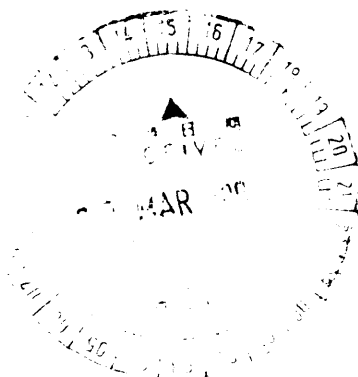

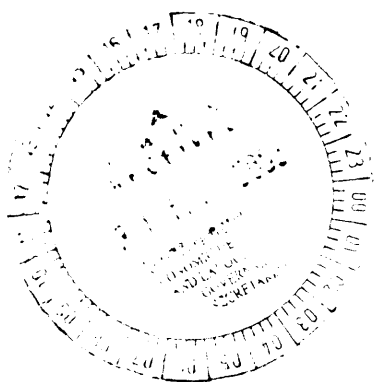
After reading the Stage II Consultation Paper, I would like to have some comments on your Stage II Consultation Proposals.

- (a) I do not think that the rate of return (ROR) linked to emission cap target achievement is a good proposal in the Stage II Consultation Paper. As far as I know that according to the existing Air Pollution Control Ordinance, the two power companies in Hong Kong have already been subject to penalty when they cannot meet the emission caps.
- (b) From my understanding, the ROR should be only directly related to the cost of raising the capital and the various risks incurred. It is unreasonable to relate the achievement of the emission caps of the power companies to the ROR.
- (c) I think the proposal also does not properly balance the interests between the investors and the consumers. Consumers should also have the responsibility to pay more for reducing the emission from power plants.
- (d) Since there is uncertainty in the post-2008 regulatory framework for the power companies to plan for their long-term investment and there is possibility of future emission trading with the Mainland, it would be very unfair to impose penalty on ROR if the emission caps cannot be met.

In response to the above consultation documents, I have the following opinions:

First, the permitted return of 7% to 11% on planned assets was too low. Large investment in replacing old equipment and purchasing and developing new equipment is always required in order to provide stable electricity for us. (The electricity supply stability rate is 99.9999%, promised by HEC) Stable electricity supply is essential for one of the world's leading cities and financial centres like

Hong Kong. Therefore, the electric companies need a certain sum of money to reinvest. Also, today's HIBOR is 7%, so, the permitted return is obviously not reasonable and hence will discourage the investment of both companies.

Second, the contract period is cut to 10 years. I think it's too short for the city's two power utilities which have many high-valued fixed assets like the power station. The depreciation rate of those fixed assets is usually calculated based on 30 years useful life. The 10 years contract period, again, discourages the investment and research and development work of HEC and CLP.

Third, HEC planned to develop the using of natural gas, which has a much more stable price than oil and causes much less pollution than coal, to generate electricity and that will result in both stable electric fee and a better environment. However, the plan! of HEC needs tremendous investment in R&D and implementation. If the permitted return and the contract period are cut, it will be difficult for HEC to invest in the project that is good for Hong Kong.

I hope the government can consider seriously before finishing the regulatory framework of the power market.

The ultimate best solution would be to introduce some form of competition in the electricity market. However, every one knows that such process is complicated and the Government must exercise its extreme care to ensure that the reliability and quality of electricity service is not affected.

Since the Government claims that such a change would require at least 10 years, then there should be as little change as possible before real competition is introduced, so as to maintain maximum stability. Therefore, it should only try to lower the rate of return but maintain all the rest of the terms as much as possible. Therefore, the duration of the new regime should be kept at 15 years, with a review every five years. Otherwise, the utilities will require higher return and in the end the consumers pay something extra.

I opine the proposals in the Stage II consultation document as follows:-

ROR linked to emission cap target achievement:

1. Air pollution originated from power station source has drawn much attention in recent years, however, situation from PRC should also be taken into consideration as pollution from electricity generation and industrial activities in PRC is equally serious. It is unfair to shoulder the sole responsibility of pollution on CLP and HEC unless one can establish a unique correlation between inferior air quality and electricity generation by 2 electricity suppliers in the territory.

New supply source:

1. CLP and HEC have excellent reliability record on electricity supply (more than 99%) in past decades and both companies committed the responsibility the provision of such; if the supply open to source(s) from the Mainland, electricity supply stability would probably be lowered based on the tight supply situation in the Guangdong region.
2. Monopoly status of CLP and HEC would not be changed by opening the electricity market to a small number of competitors. In reality, HK electricity market could not substantiate a large number of suppliers which is essential in the creation of "real competition".
3. Third party grid access will increase the frequency or risk of electricity supply failure due to increased probability of failure by various components from different connecting systems. Reference can be made to extensive electricity supply failure experiences in Canada and USA.
4. It is almost impossible to require the potential electricity suppliers to make commitment on provision of electricity with reliability level equivalent to that of CLP and HEC before commencement of any commercial investments.
5. HKSAG government is NOT the appropriate party to propose "Increased interconnection between HEC and CLP" because it contravenes the principle of maintaining minimum governmental intervention on commercial activities.

The Government seems to be under pressure by those elected legislative councilors and always try to "minimize" the profit of CLP and HEC. However, is 7-11% return on equity really attractive? Compared to property company, it may be a small amount even the return is 13.5-15%, as there is other opportunity for investment. Even buying Government bond has 5%, with nearly no risk. Electricity investment needs several tens of years to earn back. And there is unknown factor about competition in future, as CLP and HEC in fact do not have franchise. Do Government really want all companies to go for property / finance business, and no one to do those down-to-earth business which is the basic support for HK? If so, there will be another bubble to be burst someday.

Actually for those businesses which support our daily life, e.g. traffic, electricity, food, etc., Government should encourage investors rather than discourage them by capping their return as a low level. We should create a "productive" environment rather than a speculative one. The profit earned by these companies can benefit the investors and employees inside, which in turn can improve the consumption and the economy. Some poor people may really need help and subsidy for these basic service, but Government can subsidy them by another way (e.g. traffic, electricity subsidy).

Electricity for most citizens is relatively low expense. The most electricity expense may be luxury usage like those by air-conditioning devices. If persons think electricity is expensive, they should tolerate the heat and avoid using it. In fact I only heard complaint for traffic fares but not electricity bill by general citizens. The only voice is from those legislative councilors, who think fighting cheaper price for citizens can earn them votes.

Actually business users should be more concerned about the electricity fare. However, they are complaining about the difference between HEC and CLP, but not the electricity fare itself usually. Their voices should be listened more. However, if you ask a business man whether to have stable electricity or cheaper price, and whether 13.5-15% return is reasonable, I will choose stable electricity, and I should know that for running business in that size, 13.5-15% should not be considered as very high. There may be some room for reduction, but a drop to 7-11% may just discourage investors to continue to provide good services.



I am an assistance engineer living in Kowloon and would like to express my following comments on the above topic:-

1. Permitted Return

I ***disagree*** the proposed ROR is reduced from the present 13.5% to a range of 7-11%. A minimum return of 13.5% is reasonable for a densely populated city like Hong Kong. Lower ROR may lead to an insufficient investment which will undermine the supply reliability. Our living standard cannot be maintained and improved eventually. Furthermore, the permitted return rate of the two power companies are much less than the Bus Companies in Hong Kong but the performance of the former is quite better I think. It is necessary to be fair for them.

I ***disagree*** to apply the suggested penalty system in ROR in case the electrical suppliers cannot meet the agree targets including environmental issues. It is too negative. For example, (1) ROR doesn't link to an emission cap target achievement. It shall be directly related to the cost of raising capital and the various risks incurred not with emission cap target achievement. Furthermore, power companies are already subject to penalty for failing to meet emission caps under the Air Pollution Control Ordinance. It is enough I think. (2) 100% penalty on excess capacity is unfair to penalize power companies. It will discourage investment needed for adequate electricity supply. I think the existing penalty mechanism has worked well to prevent over-expansion of assets. The HKSAR Government should consider adopting an incentive scheme to encourage the suppliers to work hard and become an outstanding performer. It will be beneficial to Hong Kong.

I, therefore, enjoy an excellent and reliable power supply and agree the existing price and return rate is reasonable.

2. Economic Regulation Instrument

I ***disagree*** “10 years with an option to extend for another five years”. It is because HKSAR Government ignores the long term nature of the investment cycle and contractual commitments peculiar to power industry. He also ignores a high probability for the long-life assets to become stranded after the regulatory period.

Hence, I think the original Scheme and Regulation shall be maintained.

3. Tariff Regulation

I ***disagree*** “Government approval for tariff adjustments”. My reasons are listed below:-

- Power companies are entitled to earn permitted return on investments approved in Financial Plans.
- The regulatory regime becomes meaningless if the costs and permitted returns for power companies cannot be adequately protected.
- May subject to undue political pressure which shall increase risks borne by investors.
- A very dangerous precedent case for the Government to interfere with operation of privately-owned companies particularly since no conditions for approval have been clearly spelt out.

4. New Supply Sources

I ***disagree*** to open the electricity market in Hong Kong. It is not only to lower the supply reliability, but also affect the job opportunity in Hong Kong. In fact, it is impossible to create meaningful competition in Hong Kong’s electricity supply market because of small size of Hong Kong’s area.

Hence, two power companies in Hong Kong >>>>> SUFFICIENT.

I think there is a big disparity of view points. Government wants to control the electricity fee while the power supply companies requires a long term commitment to reasonable profit. Government is rather adopt a view to control a monopoly profit to an acceptable level. Since monopoly will charge a higher charge than those monopolistic or those under competition (not mentioning the theoretical perfect competition), so part of the cost is used for rent seeking / lobbying which is dead weight loss. That's why government wants to reduce this part also. Most modern governments try to deregulate. It seems it is a trend. I hope our government will not just change for change sake except there is actually a need.

I'd think previous guaranteed profit is too high. The profit from electricity fee, return from real estate, fixed asset may be too high. However reducing it drastically may have a problem in the future. I'd rather adopt a view to reduce it gradually.

Experience to open the network may have long term impact / problem. Refer to the incident in USA. Of course very high initial cost in the plant is difficult to open to competition, opening the network to competition also make it not profitable part for future investment. So the reliability of the network is in question if the government does not have a well-thought plan on this.

In terms of the environmental issue, the whole thing can be open to market operation using Coase Theorem. Vouchers and 2-part tariff may be proposed. So electricity fee can be related to the demand of each household. Higher charge due to the use of renewable energy source can be charged to the higher -demand household.

I refer to the Future Development of the Electricity Market in Hong Kong Stage II Consultation currently underway. I am of the opinion that the current Hong Kong Special Administrative Region Government (HKSARG) is trying to fix something that is unbroken.

Tariff

I believe at the core of the contemplated Electricity Market (EM) reform, the HKSARG is undertaking to reduce the current electricity tariff ("tariff").

The level of tariff is never an absolute number, since other constraints must come into play. The tariff in PRC is marginally lower than in HKSAR, but it is a combined result attributed to Central Government's regulated coal price, limited capital and revenue expenditures in emission control in a number of power plants, and unacceptable low level of reliability. The tariff of our neighboring Macau SAR is higher than here in HK, due to elevated fuel cost and lack of economy of scale, and it is not as reliable. How do we compare the tariff in these three places?

I consider that it makes some sense to tie a tariff level to the affordability of the citizens in a city in order to determine if a power company is over charging its users. In HK, our average electricity bill demands only a small percentage of average household income. If you walked down the streets in certain parts of the city where usually the grass roots amass, you would see a large number of air-conditioners struck out of the old windows. Air-conditioners consume large amount of power, and they are not a necessity. When people make a decision to purchase an air-conditioner, they should have evaluated their disposable income and decided that to enjoy the comfort of a cooler, cleaner and quieter living environment is affordable. For the small percentage of unlucky HK citizens ranked in the extreme poverty level who could not enjoy such luxury, they are in short of everything materially – not just an unaffordable bill. The power companies have actually used a slew tariff scale to benefit this class of people. I just failed to see the benefit it could bring to HK as a whole if our bill should be lowered by the fictitious 10%-20%, on the expense of other similarly important factors, e.g. reliability.

Reliability

Reliability is the usual tool that the power companies have been using to shield the attack from the government. Although it is cliché, it still works for me. I do not mind to pay a little more to enjoy reliable supply of electricity. When I told my friends, who are living in various parts of the world, including those in the developed countries like USA, Canada, Australia, the UK and those in developing countries, that I have never experienced a single incident of brown-out in the past 10 years (I do not remember an incident older than that either), they all complimented to my luck in living in a city like HK. I lived on 39th Floor of a 40-storey building, and my work requires me to visit high-rise commercial buildings a lot. I will be terrified if I were struck in a lift when lights go out. I am willing to pay the current bill or even a bit more, taking it as my insurance premium for avoiding the suffering from Claustrophobia.

Over-investment

I do not understand the logic whereas the power companies are accused of being overly investing in their assets in order to maximize their permitted return. Can they build whatever they want to and charge it to their customers? I understand that their capital expenditures must be submitted to the HKSARG for approval. The HKSARG should be safeguarding our interest and reject those proposals that are unrealistic or unnecessary. If the power companies receive the duly approval or endorsement from the HKSARG, it means the government must have agreed that the investment proposal is aptly prepared, realistic and necessary. If the Government has no intention to change this approval procedure, how could 'over-investment' happen?

Return

Some promoter and officials have claimed that the return of the two power companies should benchmark other utilities in HK. The Consultation Paper also proposed a 7%-11% range for debate.

Benchmarking is a good thing, but we must find the right comparable for such exercise. I read from newspapers that people like to use telecom and bus companies as examples to benchmark return for the power companies. My view: 1. they are not good comparables; 2. if they are, and if the bus companies may enjoy over 9% return plus benefit sharing, the power companies should enjoy more.

For a better comparison, I consider using gas and water companies are more appropriate to benchmark return because they are natural monopolies. Towngas, being an unregulated company, is enjoying a return even higher than the two power companies. I do not know about LPG, but I will be surprised if the LPG companies are not enjoying a return higher than the Towngas. Water Services Department is a government body, so it should be 'non-profit' making, but I do not understand why my water bill is comparable to my electricity bill. I do not turn on the tap all the time but I use electricity round-the-clock.

Furthermore, the power companies declare a large portion of their return as dividend to their shareholders, which in turn supported their share price at an attractive level. Among their shareholders, there are institutional funds and individuals, especially those investors who used the dividend for their living after retirement. The money is earned in HK, and spent locally to support the local economy. By lowering the return on two companies, effectively the HKSARG is doing something to diminish the total capitalisation in HK Stock market, lower the living standard of the retired, and hurts the local GDP.

Emission Control

The air pollution in HK recently is certainly at an unbearable level. It flaws the image of HK as a tourist and business paradise. But the problem is not a local one but require regional cooperation. Weeks ago the HK Polytechnic University, with the collaboration of NASA, have worked out the position correlation between air pollution in South China and wind direction to the local air pollution. I am disappointed to read from papers that some HKSARG officers insisted to ostrichise themselves by accusing both power companies as the main and only culprits for HK air pollution, and use it as an excuse to force the local generators to increase expenses on emission control

without proper compensation to them. It is bureaucratic mentality that matters.

I welcome any measure if it helps HK a clean breath but I reckon the HKSARG should encourage the generator to invest on emission control equipment by appropriate incentive scheme. What I can see now, in the Consultation Paper, the HKSARG proposed the lowest return for emission control in the Consultation Paper, and further threaten the generators to cut their permitted return if certain emission standards are not met. It violated the consistent "consumers paid" principle using in HK for years, by turning it into "producer paid"; it also imposed double punishment unfairly to the power companies. The air pollution laws in HK have clearly stipulated the punishment associated with failure to meet the statutory emission standard. And now the power companies are required to be brought to justice, pay the penalty for violation of such laws, and suffer further cut from their permitted return for other investment not related to emission control. I must have been living in HK for too long to fail to see any sense out of it.

Green Energy

I embrace the idea of promotion the use of green energy in HK, and I understand use of green energy comes with a price, which I am willing to pay. There are a lot of technical, commercial and environmental restrictions to obscure generating power from green source. In order to effectively manage these restriction, I believe the Government should do her part by pushing forward a consistent Use of Green Energy policy. However, I am disappointed to see from the Consultation Paper how little have been mentioned in this aspect, and the two numeral targets (ie 1-2% generation capacity from green source, 11% permitted return for generation equipment using green energy) are ambiguous. The Government failed to convince me the figures are the best mean to promote use of green energy. It also failed to reason where did the two target figures come from.

Interconnection

In the long run I may have a different view, but right now I object to the idea of interconnecting the two power companies to the Mainland networks. China, especially the southern part of it, is suffering a shortage in generation capacity. I cannot see an interconnection would benefit HK in the imminent future. Were we not importing electricity to China, which the government and the media accused CLP polluting HK without benefit to us?

Conclusion

Any electricity reform would demand a government's determination and huge amount of resources to make it work. In the current scenario in HKSAR, I did not see the Government is working in this direction. The Consultation Paper made some piecemeal adjustments to the current SOC, yet such adjustments would upset the stability of the current power sector structure. I resent to such "change-for-the-sake-of-change" attitude, and I object to any changes before I am certain about the benefit I can get from it. As such, I request the HKSARG to enter into a new SOC with the two power companies with the same terms and conditions as the current one.


In response to the captioned consultation launched on 30 December 2005, I please find below my views on some of the proposals in the Consultation Document.

I agree that the asset-based approach shall continue to be adopted for the permitted return calculation. Nevertheless, I cannot agree with your proposal of offering different rates of return to different asset classes.

To start with, classification of assets into different categories can be difficult and contentious. The complication will also incur higher administrative costs which eventually will be borne by all electricity consumers or tax-payers. Secondly, the mechanism will also be unfair to the investors whose cost of capital will be the same regardless of asset type. While I understand that the proposed mechanism is to encourage renewable energy development, it fails to take into account the complications arise. As such, the mechanism is doomed to fail.

The problem with the Consultation Paper is that it attempts to make too many changes at one time. Please remember: if we reform in haste, we may end up repenting at leisure.

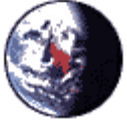

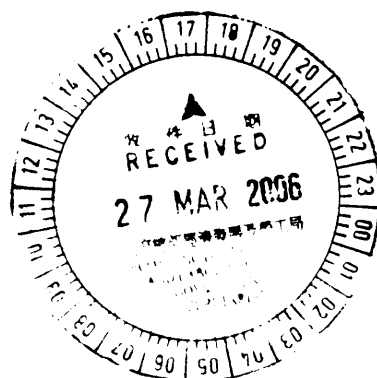
- lower permitted rate of return

Dear Sirs,

I have the following points to add for the Stage II Consultation for future electricity market.

1. Any change that are to be added to the present market should be carefully made as not to jeopardize the present reliable supply of electricity.
2. There are public urging for a cleaner source of electricity which often means a higher price. I agree that we shall preserve the environment. But I don't agree that the public should share the higher price as a whole. That is, those who urge for a cleaner electricity source should be paid for the price of cleaner energy source.
3. I am afraid that new supply source to the present power grid will mean higher instability of electricity supply, though it may make things cheaper. On the other hand, new interconnection for new supply source may not be economical in short term.
4. Regarding the pollution, general standard should be set up for all emission in HK which shall also include factory, ship, car, bus etc. instead of only talking about power stations. I am afraid that it is misleading to point the pollution only towards power companies. On the other hand, what has Government do to unify the environmental standards of Guangdong as a whole? As we all know that the pollutant from Main Land is serious.
5. Regarding the 15 years agreement period, I would suggest a normal extension of 2 years after each 2 years period if the supply is reliable (>99.99%), economical (say with tariff increase less than inflation). In that way, with a starting agreement of 1x year, the power company can forecast how the system is to be planned and run within 1x years with 2 years to be appended all the time if nothing wrong.
6. Suggest forming a public body with all sectors including academic sector to formulate policy regarding energy market.
7. A +0.5% tariff increase to be added for good performance of power company whereas -0.5% if it has poor performance or over invest.
8. I do not agree that the cost for renewable energy to be borne by public as a whole. It should be borne by one who chooses to. On the other hand, cost for emission reduction facilities should be borne by all to meet standard laid by GOV.
9. The rate of return for all investment should be the same to make things simpler or avoid making investment being biased toward a category (it will produce potential weak points). It is only a matter of whether investment is essential, useful or not.

Comment on Stage II Consultation on Future Development of the Electricity Market in HK

I would like to express my disappointment on the Stage II Consultation paper on the future development of the Electricity Market in HK. Similar to many other government policies, after a year long debate and consultation through various means, the current Paper still fails to address or provide any indication on one of the key issues on 'future development of the Electricity Market' in HK - that is, the direction as to whether or not the Electricity Market will be turned into open competitive, if so, when. It is not good enough to just say "interested parties are at liberty to enter the Hong Kong electricity market". There must have in place a comprehensive clear policy and strategy as well as governance process so that all participants have clear understanding of the rules of game underlying their investment.

In the Paper, it said that the Government proposed to "prepare the ground for possible new supply sources from the Mainland", and "continue to monitor closely the developments in the electricity market in Guangdong so as to identify possible sourcing opportunities including RE...". These are things that an ordinary citizen would expect the Government to do it without saying anyway.

In the First Sustainable Development Strategy for HK published in May 2005, Government has set a target of having 1%-2% of our local power needs met by Renewable Energy by 2012. I am not here to debate on the appropriateness of this target. But at least it has a clear direction and timeframe for the market participants (and the investors to a larger extent) to consider and plan.

The Government said that they understand that power industry has the characteristic of high capital intensive and long lead time for planning and pay-back. It also indicated that "interested parties are at liberty to enter the Hong Kong electricity market". These are not good enough. The Government, through this Consultation Paper, has not provided any clear indication about their decision to go for open competitive market or not, let alone a clear timetable and steps to move forward. For both the potential new entrance and current operators, they all need this information to plan for their investment.

For new investors, before they spend a lot of money doing preparation and planning, they need to know the timing as to when they have the opportunity to enter the market. They will review their opportunity costs and may consider other investment if there is uncertainty. Similarly for the current operators, they need to plan their investment accordingly to cater for market competition.

It would not be unreasonable to expect that they would invest into preparing for the market competition. The cost of this investment will undoubtedly have some impact on the electricity tariff. If the competition is not eventuated, or at least not within the period that was anticipated, the electricity consumers will end up be the one who suffer – bearing the cost of this preparatory work.

6. Cooperation in renewable energy development between Guangdong and Hong Kong should be speeded up, including the regional blueprint of wind energy development.
7. Demand management must be built into the profits of the company. There must be a mechanism where they profit if they can significantly reduce energy demand. At present they only profit from Increased demand.

I demand that the SAR Government bring back clean air to Hong Kong.

Dear Sirs,

I am an electrical engineer and would like to offer my comment to the Stage 2 Consultation Paper on Electricity Market in Hong Kong.

1. Introduction

No doubt that we enjoy an affordable and reliable power supply. However the economy in Hong Kong is very different from 10-20 years ago. We cannot live in the past and should look ahead.

Load growth will slow down below 3 percent per year (over 10% in 20 years ago). Most of the people in Hong Kong would like to look for improvement of the quality of life. Our future quality of life will heavily rely on -

1. Clean environment
2. Fair and competitive market economy

2. Clean Environment

Power generation plants are the main source of pollution in Hong Kong. It may be correct that the power plant in Hong Kong is less polluting than the old power plants in Guangdong. But this cannot be the excuse not to look for clean solution.

China has plenty of resources (land and energy) available to produce electricity. The power grid of HK is connected with the South China grid. Technically and economically, we can get power from mainland China and do not need to have large power plant (e.g. coal-fire plant) in HK. Guangzhou Pumped Storage Power Plant and Daya Bay Power Plant is a good example (May not be a good example, if people is against nuclear power). It, indeed, showed that power plant in China can provide reliable supply to HK.

We shall set high standard to protect our environment in next 10 or 15 years. For example, no coal-fire power plant in HK and give incentive to power companies to build power plant in mainland China. This is feasible if we look in a period of 10-15 years. The government can set specific target in the new scheme to restrict the building up of coal/oil fired power plant in HK.

2. Fair and competitive market

The current scheme that allow investor to earn " guaranteed" profit based on capital investment was an outdated scheme and is not suitable for HK in the next 10-15 years because of low growth in power demand. However, it is unlikely that the government can change the rule of game drastically in such a short time. Probably the scheme propose in the paper is a realistic solution. However, the government must pave the way to introduce fair and competitive market in electricity supply. Following issues shall be addressed.

1. Separate tariff for generation, transmission and distribution

Current electricity bill which consists of the total of generation, transmission and distribution cost shall be changed and have each of them listed separately. This is to provide transparency of cost build-up and prepare for de-regulation.

2. Grid Access Right

HK has very limited space for the right-of-way of transmission and distribution network. The right of way is owned by people of HK. In future, all the newly constructed transmission and distribution network (invested by either CLP or HEC) must allow third party to access subject to a transmission/distribution fee.

3. Guard against over-investment

As the load forecast is provided by the power companies. They, to certain extent, shall bear the risk of over-estimation. For this reason, I support the statement in clause 2.51 of the Paper. This clause is to protect the interest of general public and I do not think that it will affect the reliability of supply. On the other hand, it was certainly not the intention of the future scheme to offer a guarantee to power company that they can always earn the maximum return.

In addition, if a power company is under-invested and is short of capacity. They shall provide free access for other power companies who are connected in a common grid to supply electricity to their area . This is to prevent power company from under-estimating their future demand and may cause power shortage.

4. Conclusion

The current situation does not allow drastic change in the Scheme of Control. I therefore support the Consultation Paper but would like to see action taken by the government to :

1. Set clear target to provide cleaner air in Hong Kong (It is not enough in the consultation Paper).
 1. Encourage power supply from China.
 2. Restrict construction of coal/oil power plant in HK.
 3. Set target of importing energy from mainland China.
2. Specific action/provision to remove obstacles that will prohibit introduction of open market for electricity supply in next 10 year (the latest). Especially in the following three areas:
 1. separate tariff for generation, transmission and distribution
 2. open grid access right
 3. Guard against over/under investment

I would like to share my view in response to the Scheme of Control Stage II Consultation ". This is a complicated subject and I would like to focus my view on three specific areas:

Looking back, I still have a vivid memory 20-30 years back when I was a kid. The reliability performance of electricity supply was not comparable to the level today. From time to time, we would experience blackout which resulted in a stand-still of activities. The reliability of supply since then has improved drastically to the extent that nowadays, we almost take it for granted that electricity supply without disruption is a given. While we now enjoying the fruit of improvement, this brings to my first point that any changes made to the framework should not result in a compromise in the supply reliability.

A more pressing issue nowadays occupying newspaper headline is the apparent worsening of environment in Hong Kong, pollution of the air included. As a citizen who intends to spend many more years and raise the family here, there are no doubts we all look forward to seeing an improvement in our environment, bluer sky to see, cleaner air to breathe. While we understand the production base in the Pearl River has contributed to a large extent the pollutants here, it should not stop us from looking hard into the areas within our control that can be improved and set a good example. We know that power generation, by nature of the process, would result in pollutants into the air. As a business and engineering trained person, it's my belief that if we are having a framework providing the right incentive, solution does exist in a lot of technical situation, emission included. This brings to my second point that in the new regulatory framework, there should be incentive scheme built in for environment performance.

The last point I like to touch here is around pricing, I guess everyone would like to see a price that is as low as possible, however, as the old saying goes; there is no such thing as free lunch in the world. So let's look at this issue from a more rational standpoint. To me, there are two key considerations here, the first one, is around return, at what level of return is considered to be reasonable? The other factor, which I think is as important as this one is around operating performance, are the operation efficient? Do we see continuous improvement? This brings to my third point here, I believe we should have clarity on the framework to provide incentive for the on-going reduction of operating cost, in particular, the non-fuel component of the operating cost which is within the control of the Management of the company.

To summarize, while we don't oppose to change, I guess for a critical issue like the framework that governs the electricity supply in Hong Kong, any recommended changes should be judged and evaluated carefully against risk. Also, a good framework should encompass incentives for improvement, in particular, in the areas related to environment performance and cost structure. I look forward to seeing a final framework that satisfies all these boundary conditions.

I am a Hong Kong citizen and is currently resided in Los Angeles as a financial analyst. I refer to the stage II consultation and would like to express my strong disagreement in current proposal of lowering ROR.

I believe that keeping SCA is extremely important for the stability of electricity in Hong Kong, however, I do not believe that lowering the Rate of Return is going to be beneficial to both Hong Kong as well as customers.

First of all, lowering the ROR is not equal to lowering the tariff. The existence of two for-profit publicly listed electricity companies have, obviously, a fiduciary duty to make profit for their shareholders by first and foremost, hiring the most knowledgeable group of people who know the electricity industry in the Hong Kong. Their objective is to maximize shareholders value, not tariff. By limiting the ROR, it is difficult to convince investors to continue to support both companies given the limited size of Hong Kong electricity market, which would bring unstability to the market and would probably also bring job loss and create a chain reaction that would negatively impact the local economy.

Moreover, by keeping the ROR at its current level, it provides incentive for both companies to invest in most updated technology, to further enhance the power stability of the Hong Kong market. It also would encourage electricity companies to explore alternative energy sources that are more environmental friendly and less polluted. I would like to cite the example of the deregulation of the California energy market a few years ago. Without a sufficient (or in this case, zero) ROR guarantee, companies would not be able to meet the increasing electricity demand by investing in new technology (because of the lower profit due to heightened competitions) and thus lead to severe consequences of many blackouts in the last few years. As I understand that Hong Kong is the most reliable electricity market and has less than 0.001% unscheduled blackout, this is a solid proof of the importance of a reasonable, high enough ROR.

I believe many individuals with a long term electricity stability in mind would not agree to the current proposal. I would also like to express my disappointment over media coverage on this issue because it is very one-sided and only intends to create discomfort to the uneducated public for their own profit, but not expressing a fair and balanced view on this issue.

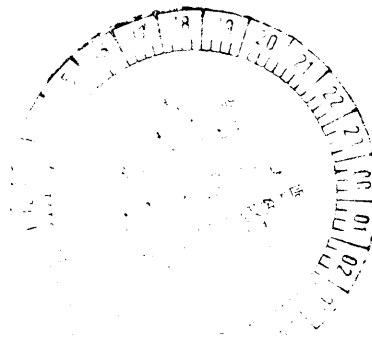
- i. I do not support the idea of grid access for third parties and importing power from the Mainland from the reliability concern.

Our views on the Future Development of the Electricity Market in Hong Kong-Stage II consultation are as follow:

Fuel Mix & Emission Reduction

This is a subject concerns reliability of the fuel which must be handled carefully Government should first employ experts and to discuss with CLP/HKE and to decide what is the best fuel mix in the next 10 to 15 years. If coal is to keep its position then Government to set a practical date for the two companies to improve the emission. If more gas generation is required, then Government must allow ample time and to provide adequate resources to facilitate the work. Government should not simply set the target date of emission reduction and penalties without firm decision on the future fuel mix and ignoring each fuel' s technical capabilities and the cost implication.

Tariff & Competitive Market

Survey indicates that the tariff is 1.5 % to 3% of monthly household expenditure and it should be affordable. As a consumer no one will reject paying less tariff for the same service but the question is can we get that same services? Can government guarantee? and what if the supply is not reliable and how many black outs we are going to accept and at what costs? Disorder of the electricity market is unavoidable if Government brings in the new supplier at this stage.

We have a stable government with good efficiency and on private sector, giant investors like Electricity Suppliers who have been growing with Hong Kong for so many decades. All existing arrangement is mainly continuation of a right track and I don' t see why a fundamental change is required unless the authority wants to reform it for the sake of reform. The biggest voices for restructure of electricity market and tariffs re setting are no doubts from the politicians who today seems to have put aside their memories that the reliability of our electricity supply has not happened by chance and it is all because of the stable , long term and fair regulatory regime evolved for so many years.

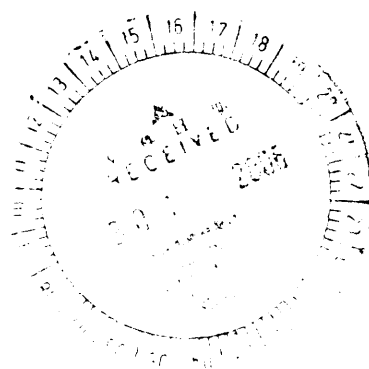

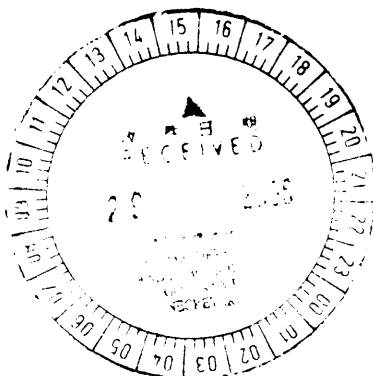

Views on Government's Consultation Paper on the Future Development of the Electricity Market in Hong Kong – Stage II Consultation

I would like to express some of my views on the Stage II Consultation as follows:

Environment

Government should closely work with power companies to ensure the energy and environmental policies as a whole are practical, viable and in the overall benefit of HK citizens. In reducing emissions to the environment, an appropriate balance should be weighed between clean energy and cost impact to HK citizens. Further, it is not a wise decision to be too heavily rely on a particular fuel type such as gas purely for environmental reason as this will certainly lead to supply reliability issues.

Competitive Market

Government need to be very cautious in dealing with the opening of the power market as overseas experiences show that electricity price will not necessarily be reduced while supply reliability problems leading to series of blackouts have happened in some cities following the opening of the power market. As the saying says, 'Don't fix it unless it's broken'. Since the current regulatory regime has a proven record of excellent supply reliability and inexpensive electricity price, I really doubt if it is necessary to change it unless the situation is reversed.

Return Level

While I have no comment about the final return level for the power companies as it should be a result of mutual agreement and compromise between the power companies and Government on behalf of the public after balancing all stakeholders' interests, I do not agree with Government's proposed lower return level for those emission assets as it cannot provide adequate incentives for the power companies to invest in those assets and hence cannot improve the environment.

I hope Government will consider the above in formulating the future development of electricity market in HK.

Hong Kong needs an integrated energy policy that comprehensively addresses energy supply and usage. Electricity generation has produced significant air pollution and contributes significant amount of greenhouse gas emission, causing global warming and resulted in climate change, the single biggest threat to our planet.

The Government's current proposals are outdated and could do far more to address these issues. I demand a future electricity market in Hong Kong that facilitates clean energy, and encourages energy conservation and efficiency, so that I am provided with electricity at minimal impact to my health, society and the environment.

I strongly recommend the Government to:

1. Set up a comprehensive and integrated energy policy for Hong Kong that properly addresses energy security, energy efficiency, protection of the environment and public health. As an SME in Hong Kong, we would like to express our views on the Stage II Consultation.

We appreciate your decision to largely maintain the current SCA framework, which in our view, is cost-effective and well balances the interest of different stakeholders. However, we do have reservation on some of your proposal raised in the Stage II Consultation Paper.

Being a for-profit business, we can easily comprehend the importance of investment to reliability, especially a supply reliability that is among the highest in the world. We are really concerned that your proposed post-2008 permitted rate of return of 7-11% is too low and cannot lead to sufficient investment. Electricity is very important to our business operations. As a SME, we have no budget to invest in expensive power backup equipment and we fully appreciate the excellent electricity supply reliability we are enjoying. We consider the electricity supply services we are getting really good value for money. As a matter of fact, we are more than satisfied with the current regulatory regime and are not looking forward to any changes.

Besides, we view your proposal to shorten the regulatory period from 15 to 10 years a major obstacle in reaching a successful agreement with the power companies. 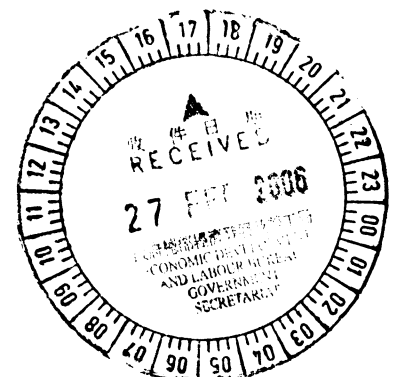

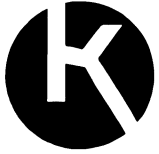

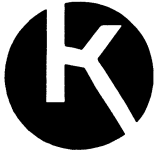

In response of the above, we would like to express our views as a building contractor for your consideration.

As a businessman in Hong Kong, I think to earn a fair return for one's investment is a reasonable expectation. The lowering of the permitted return to 7 - 11% has no justification nor basis. The return at this level is not attractive and I do not see how this can guarantee a long-term investment particularly required by the power industry. From an investor's point of view, there are other alternatives and this level of return does not provide enough incentive at all.

Although I would like to see the lowering of my electricity bills, I would not like this to happen at the expense of the reliability that I am enjoying now. Especially I would not like to see what happened in the USA to repeat in HK and the government should explain how this could be balanced before hastily and unilaterally lowering the return.

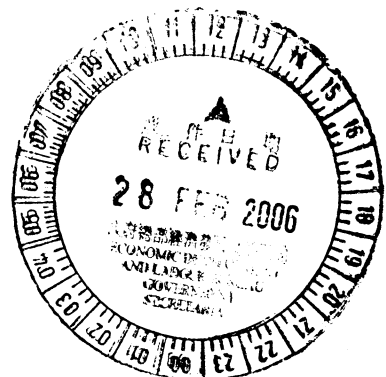

These control measures must not be used by the electricity companies as a pretext for an escape from their social and environmental responsibilities. I thus recommend:

1. The permitted rate of return of power companies should be linked with the total emission caps set under the power companies' licences. Those cannot achieve the caps should have the rate of return reduced;
2. The investment in renewable energy (RE) should earn a higher level of permitted rate of return;
3. We support RE, but not incineration which generates green house gas;
4. Energy saving is fundamental in reducing pollution, as it saves money and conserves our resources. We demand the SAR government to set up a concrete and clear energy saving target;

Dear Sir,

I am writing to comment on the Stage II Consultation paper. I believe that the paper has several good proposals, especially the policy objectives, institutional set up and fixed asset approach. These have the least impact on the existing system, which supplies reliable electricity to Hong Kong for a reasonable cost. However, I am concerned about the following issues:

1. Reliability and safety of electricity supply are of utmost importance. This has been confirmed by views received from Stage I Consultation. Thus the issue "New Supply Sources from the Mainland" are of concern to the Government. Guangdong's electricity supply is tight due to its rapid economic growth. Relying on Guangdong for new supply sources will jeopardise the reliability of supply in Hong Kong.
2. Who will be responsible for problems of reliability and safety if they occur - Mainland China or Hong Kong? This blurred line of responsibility can cause disputes, which ultimately is a disadvantage for the consumers.
3. There are a lot of environmentally damaging thermal power plants in Guangdong to cope with the electricity shortages there. These are low in efficiency, and their emissions pollute the environment, being one of the major contributing factors for the deteriorating air quality in the Pearl River Delta region. We must not buy cheap electricity at the cost of the environment.
4. I believe the 10-year regulatory period and the 7% - 11% rate of return is not enough incentive for utilities to invest. This could lead to power shortages like those in the Mainland, causing an enormous impact on Hong Kong as a world financial centre.

I hope you will take my view into consideration, and that Hong Kong consumers will continue to have the current level of excellence in the supply of electricity, that is both reliable and affordable.

After reading the Consultation Paper on "Future Development of the Electricity Market in Hong Kong: Stage II Consultation", I concur with most of the comment with the following exceptions:

- 1) Since reliability and safety of electricity supply are of paramount importance (results from Stage I Consultation). Therefore, Government must be extremely careful with the issue "New Supply Sources from the Mainland".
- 2) The tight electricity supply situations in Guangdong will continue due to their rapid economic growth. Rely on new supply sources from such a power shortage area will definitely jeopardize the supply reliability in Hong Kong.
- 3) Consider what will happen in case of operating problems or disputes between the Guangdong Electricity suppliers and the HKSAR. The responsibility to ensure reliability and safety of electricity supply will be blurred.
- 4) There are a lot of highly polluting small thermal power plants with low efficiency, which are still generating electric power in Guangdong. These small thermal power plants are the severe polluting sources in Guangdong and their emissions are one of the major contributing factors for the deteriorating air quality in the Pearl River Delta region. We should not choose to buy the polluting electricity from China even if the price is comparatively lower.

I believe that taken into account the above elements you should be able to achieve your policy objectives especially the paramount importance of the reliability and safety of the electricity supply.

1. The policy objective of ensuring that consumers receive reliable, safe and efficient electricity supply at reasonable prices while minimizing environmental impact caused by the production and use of energy is the key success factor of Hong Kong and should be maintained.
2. Under the Scheme of Control Agreements (SCA) in the last three decades, which provided a stable and promising environment for the electricity supply industry (ESI) to develop, the electricity supply in Hong Kong has become the most reliable city in the world. [1]
3. Hong Kong is situated at the Pearl River Delta where economics and industries are blooming rapidly in the last decade. Both air and water pollution are cross boundary issues, unilateral control is wasting effort. On the other hand, the government should have a broader view on the environmental protection. The following options adopted in other countries are worth to consider:
 - committed greenhouse gas emissions reduction, e.g. many countries [2]
 - electricity taxes, e.g. many European countries [3]
 - energy reducing policy, e.g Israel 1.4% per annual [4]
4. The consumption of electricity was increased gradually in almost all countries, however, the rate is faster in Asian countries than those European countries where there are various kind of taxes associated with electricity and environmental protection (see attached table 1). It is suggested to collect electricity tax from the consumers so as to control the use of natural resources as for water pollution, municipal solid waste in Hong Kong.
5. In comparing with the tariff in other places [5, 6], the present tariff is reasonable and only contributes to about 2% of average household income in HK [7].
6. The consultation paper suggested a 10 years of regulatory instrument was not reasonable. As we know that, the asset life of the equipment in the ESI is about 25-50 years, such short regulatory period would mean a waste of resources. Furthermore, natural gas is purchased under long contract, usually longer than 15 years. HK is a small market, HK has little bargaining power with the international energy company, therefore shorter a gas contract, higher the price and ultimately higher the electricity tariff.

本人已從事工程建設十多年，因此欲對電力市場開發第二階段諮詢文件之內容發表一些意見，現錄述如下：

一 政府建議將電力公司的固定資產分成四類，各有不同的准許利潤回報率，介乎7-11%之間。

本人對於政府所訂立的准許利潤回報率過於空泛，沒有合理的理據和實質數據支持如何訂立為7-11%。

而且本人對於政府為何把電力投資分為四種不同類別的資產，並且採用不同的投資回報率不甚認同。

因為作為一個投資者，只要籌集資金的成本相同，不論資產類別，

作為一個自由市場的社會，所得到的回報也應相同。再者，對於一所電力公司的日常營運，所作出

不同類別的投資，也是自來實際上需要的，而不是一個外行人所認識的。

因此如政府硬要把一私營機構所作出的投資分為四類而各有不同的投資回報率，這未免對投資者不太公平。而且，這也會扭曲電力公司規劃時所作出的考慮，而引致電力系統發展不平衡。

一 至於針對過剩發電容量的全面剝削，雖然中電於若干年前被揭發備用容量過剩，但本人認為目前的懲罰機制已足以防止電力公司過度擴充資產，因此作為一間健康、負責任的電力公司，存有適當的備用容量是必須的，因為沒有足夠的備用容量足以引發像美國加州大停電的事件。

據本人了解，美國加州三大電力公司因為市場開放後出現嚴重財政問題，某些更面臨破產危機，由於改革

後市場經營環境未能給予投資者獲得理想回報的信心，加州的發電機組及供電設備的投資便大大減少，而且引致供電設施不足以應付電力需求的增長，最後大大削弱原來供電的穩定性，並造成停電，嚴重地影響市民的生活，更為整體經濟帶來重大損失。

試想想，一場金融風暴如沙士已令香港經濟大倒退。香港能否再一次承受因為電力市場開放所帶來的經濟損失呢。

因此本人並不贊成香港政府單方面改變現有之核准回報條件，香港政府應與兩電共同商議並訂立一個合理可接受的核准回報水平。

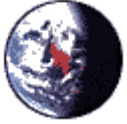

In relation to the above subject, I have some comments. As pointed out in the consultation paper, Hong Kong people admit that reliable, safe and efficient electricity supply is very important to our life. I believe there will not be 'free lunch' to enjoy high quality of electricity services. As from "1999/2000 Household Expenditure Survey and the Rebasing of the Consumer Price Indices" prepared by Census and Statistics Department of HKSAR, in an overall average, only 2.9% of the expenditure of a household is spent in Energy sector, which is low as compared to other items, such as Food (25.7%), Housing (32.2%) or Transport (9.2%), and I don't want to sacrifice quality by saving just a little bit. From these figures, I see that the local electricity companies are doing well and no need to reduce the rates of return (ROR) as it will discourage investment for a better electricity system.

Furthermore, I believe the suggestion of 4-tier RORs is not necessary, especially on why it is discouraging the investment for the category of Emission Reduction Facilities to have the lowest ROR. It will just complicate the regulatory framework and introduce unnecessary administrative works on assets classification, which will ultimately reflect in the price to consumers.

Below is my view concerning the stage 2-consultation paper:

(1) Regulatory Instrument

“The electricity supply industry is capital-intensive requiring long lead-time for planning and long payback period.” The purposed Rate of Return (ROR) of 7~11% and 10-years term Bilateral Agreements is rather low for infrastructure project especially with the demand of expensive Renewable Energy (RE).

(2) Return

The target RE is only 1~2% of local power by 2012 so the air quality improvement is insignificant. The better way to improve air quality is introducing new fuel, new Generating equipments or install large scale Emission Reduction Facilities (ERF) in short to long term especially the needs to meet emission caps at 2010. However, the purposed ROR on ERF rated the lowest ROR. I would suggest adjusting all of the RE, Generation & ERF at the same high ROR as a true incentive to improve the air quality.

(3) Tariff

Tariff adjustment with Government approval means no business, as the atmosphere of the Legislative Council is extremely political. How to judge “cost-justified, reasonable and affordable to consumers” if it is within the proposed ROR.



1. Investment is a kind of gambling. No one can guarantee a hundred percent win or loose. But during the game, it is not suppose to change the rule. I have never heard a rule change in the Casino during a middle of a gamble, or a rule change in the middle of an Olympic competition. The investments on the electricity companies involve a large amount, and will also take a long period before return. The electricity company signed contracts with coal suppliers much longer than ten years and. Without a stable government policy, no way electricity company can built plants and sign contract will suppliers.
2. All consumers look for low consumer prices and tend to look for short term benefits without insight to long term. The long term stabilities of electricity depend on investment incentive.
3. In a dynamic world with the cost of production keep changing, I do not see how the government can prefix the rate of return based on different methods of electricity generation. I appreciate the Government's effort in preparing the Stage II Consultation Paper.


However, some of the proposals in the consultation paper like shortening of agreement period and giving the lowest return rate to emissions reduction equipment worry me.

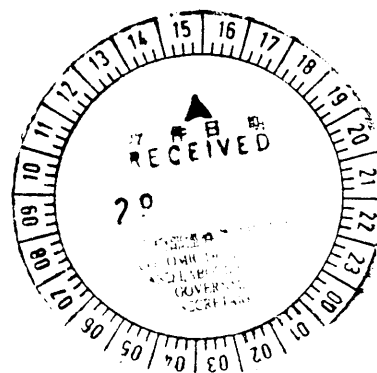

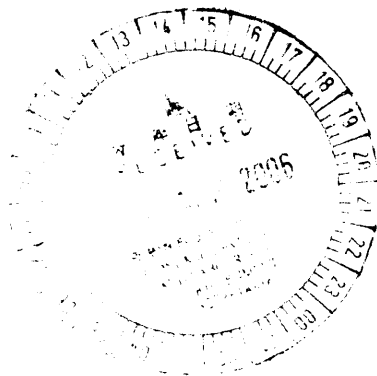

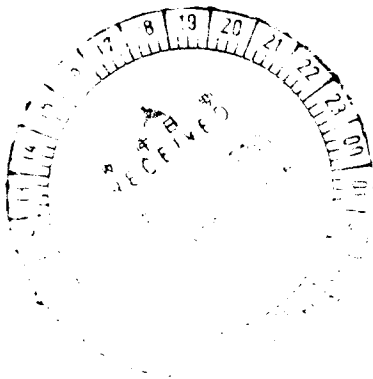

STAGE TWO CONSULTATION

In past several decades, Hong Kong has enjoyed higher quality of electricity supply services at an affordable price. Thanks for the Schemes of Control (SOC) Agreement between the Government and power companies.

It was reported in Ontario, Canada and California, US that these electricity 'de-regulated' areas where the prices of electricity went up and down like a rollercoaster once the electricity market changed its rules of governance, which made electricity users suffered from not only lower quality of electricity supply but also monetary loss.

The bilateral agreement between the Government and power companies such as the existing SOC Agreement is simple, and easy to implement and requires low governance costs.

The bilateral agreement between the Government and power companies also reduce the disparity between different sectors of the society, such as different in arrangement would favor some groups that may be in the expense of other groups. For example, large electricity users would be in a better position in bargaining and obtain favorable terms on the expense of general customers.

Again, bilateral agreement between the Government and power companies does not required a lot of expenditure on governance and administrative costs and thus could maintain a reasonable and stable tariff.

It is worth to point out that the existing Scheme of Control Agreement has been effective in providing Hong Kong a safe and reliable electricity supply, together with exemplary environmental performance, at reasonable price since its inception. All the policy objectives set by the Government, as can be seen, have been met under the Agreement.

Against this background, I would like to express my objection to some of the proposals listed in the Paper.

Regulatory Arrangement

I object to shorten the regulatory period from 15 years to 10 years given the long-term investment cycle and contractual commitments required for the power industry. Investors of the power companies must be provided with a sufficiently long regulatory period to induce their investment continuously.

Permitted Rate of Return (ROR)

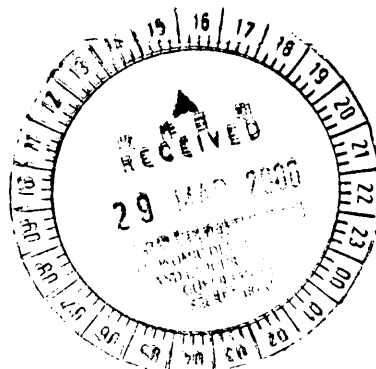

Emission Reduction

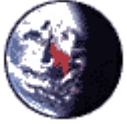

I have the following comments on the stage 2 consultation paper :

1. I agree that a regulating regime should be established to provide investment incentive for the power company while maintaining an affordable tariff and high reliability of supply. The performance of the power company and the asset utilization could be one of the many factors in the formula. In the paper it is proposed that the rate of return should be in the range of 7-11%. Without disclosing much details on the calculation, it appears that such ROR may not attract sufficient incentive for the power company to keep on maintaining their asset to a highly reliable status, bear in mind that power distribution is a capital intensive business and the investment period is in the order of 10s years. It is suggested to provide more details on the calculation how the suggested ROR are derived. In addition, the way how the tariff adjustment are taken place should be elaborated. As long as the regulating regime is clearly defined and transparent, government approval on tariff adjustment may not really necessary as it will only introduce unnecessary uncertainties.

2. The proposed 10 years regulatory period may seem too short to allow power company to institute any substantial long term improvement on their asset because it requires long term planning and long lead time to commission transmission and generation facilities, not to mention the long term fuel purchase contract which the power company uses to stabilize electricity tariff. Similar to tariff control, some clear and transparent regime could be established such that when the power company meet certain performance criteria, the regulatory period could be extended automatically. Such regime could provide incentive for power company to make long term planning to invest in the generation and transmission facilities and they understand that their investment would be paid back if their performance is up to the requirements. Performance review and setting new performance objectives could be carried out regularly between the regulator and power company. However, it is necessary that the performance objective should be clearly set, reasonable, achievable and agreed by both regulator and power company.

3. It is proposed in the paper that higher ROR (11%) should be assigned to RE. I personally think that RE does not have any bright future in Hong Kong given the limited resources in Hong Kong and much higher capital cost. The few percent difference in ROR would hardly drive the power company to invest significant amount in the generating facilities portfolio. If environmental regulation is the main concern, it could be achieved through the existing established ordinance such as APCO. Using ROR to achieve environmental regulation will unnecessarily complicate the regulation system. The use of different ROR for different asset should be carefully evaluated as it may not bring about the desired benefit.

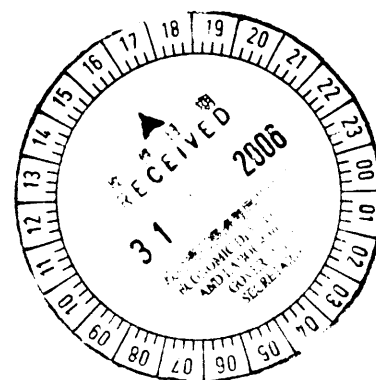


Under the current regulatory regime, there are rarely power interruptions in Hong Kong and I have been enjoying reliable electricity at a reasonable price. I agree with the Government that reliability of electricity supply is of utmost importance and the policy objective should focus on maintaining reliability. Based on the Stage II Consultation on the captioned subject, I would like to make some comments.

I have concerns about some proposed changes in the consultation paper such as permitted rate of return reduction and shorten the regulatory period. As proposed by the Government, the period of the future agreement would be a 10-year term with an option to extend by another five years. I consider it is not reasonable. Since infrastructure for the electricity supply industry have long asset lives and any investments by the power companies should give a fixed rate of return for longer terms in order to give incentive for the investors to invest. The 10-year term stated ignores the long-term nature of the investment cycle and would lead to increase risks for the investors.

In addition, the rate of return for the two power companies is proposed to reduce from the present 13.5% to 7-11% after 2008. The lower rate of return for the power companies may once again lead to under investment by the power companies.

Both proposals in the consultation paper might lead to under investment by the power companies and decrease the reliability and safety of electricity supply in Hong Kong. I suggest that the Government evaluates the proposals in the consultation paper with caution, so that Hong Kong will continue to have reliable electricity supply.

I support the proposal to continue with a legally binding bilateral scheme of control agreement(SCA) between the Government and the two power companies. The use of ANFA to calculate the return to the power companies is also acceptable to me. In fact, I appreciate much this existing mechanism, which had ensured Hong Kong people to enjoy, and continue to enjoy reliable electricity supply at reasonable prices.

Nevertheless, I do have reservation in some of the points stated in the consultation paper details as below.

1. New Supply Sources

The direction of the future RE development is welcomed. However, putting too much emphasis on RE is considered not appropriate as the potential of RE in Hong Kong is very small. Thus, I do not support to make RE a mandatory requirement in the new SCA.

The proposal to prepare for introducing new supply sources from the Mainland in future at this point of time is considered inappropriate. It is important to ensure the introduction of new supply sources will not affect the reliability & quality of the electricity supply in HK. As we all know, the electricity supply in South China is currently not adequate and will remain tight in the foreseeable future. There is no point for us to spent money and time to prepare the local supply network to introduce electricity supply from the Mainland at this point of time, not to mention the substantial difference in the reliability and 'cleanliness' of electricity between HK and the Mainland.

2. Duration of the new SCA

The proposed shortening of the new SCA duration from a 15-year term to a 10-year term (with an option of 5 years extension) is considered not appropriate as the service life of the supply equipment is 30-40 years whereas the return on any investment in the 30-35 year service-life infrastructure will still be negative in the first 8 or 9 years. I am afraid this proposal will discourage the power company's investment and ultimately impose adverse effect to the reliability and adequacy of electricity supply in future. I strongly support to retain the current 15-year term for the new SCA.

3. Rate of return (ROR)

The current prime interest rate is 8% and is on the rising trend. From investor point of view, the indicated 7-11% ROR is considered non-attractive in consideration of the huge and long term capital investment required for the electricity supply industry. Furthermore, this indicated 7-11% ROR is quoted without any justification. I am afraid the proposed reduction in ROR will discourage investment and ultimately incur adverse effect to the supply reliability and adequacy in future.

The proposed 4-tiered ROR for different asset types is considered unreasonable, as there should not be distinction between assets. This proposal will induce distortion on the power company's optimal planning and investment practices as these practices will be skewed towards those asset types with higher ROR and will ultimately impose adverse effect to the supply reliability. Furthermore, varying ROR will complicate the system, create unnecessary argument on the asset classification, and increase additional administration cost.

I strongly support to retain the current simple and easily administered single ROR. In addition, the ROR must be sufficient to incentivise investment.

4. Excess Capacity

The proposed tightening of excess capacity regulation whereby all capital expenditure on machinery and equipment of the generation facility found to be excessive will be deducted from the rate base in calculating the power company's return is considered unfair, as forecasted demand can never perfectly match with actual demand. Probably this proposal will result in under investment by the power companies to avoid penalty and ultimately affect supply reliability and adequacy in future. I support retaining the current risk-sharing regime, which is a more reasonable approach.

5. Tariff

The proposed arrangement that all tariff adjustments must be subject to Government approval will introduce a risk to the power companies that they might not be able to recover their costs through tariff. In the California Energy Crisis in 2000, power companies almost went bankruptcy because of tariff freeze set by the regulator. The subsequent damages to the community could be much higher if the regulator has too much power on tariff approval that can be influenced by undue political pressure, as power companies who cannot recover costs via tariff can no longer provide reliable supply services.

6. Emission Reduction

The proposed linking of the permitted ROR to the achievement of the emission cap is unreasonable. Under the Air Pollution Control Ordinance, the power companies will be subjected to penalty if they fail to meet the emission caps. The proposed linkage to ROR would mean a double penalty to the power companies. Furthermore, as the majority of the existing generation plants in HK are coal-fired, the emission caps set by the Government will necessitate the power companies to replace the coal-fired plants by gas-fired plants, yet there is no clear energy policy set by the Government on this respect. It is considered unfair to penalize the power companies by reducing the ROR if they cannot meet the emission caps as this is beyond their sole control.

As the Government has launched the public consultation on the future development of the electricity market in Hong Kong, we would like to express our views on this subject.

To make our business a success, we rely on a stable electricity supply. For example, we need to use a lot of audiovisual and lightning equipment to design the stage for our clients. Hence, a stable and reliable electricity supply is vital for us to produce a remarkable stage effect design. Since our establishment, we have rarely experienced any power interruption incidents which hinder our business operation. Hence, we have full confidence in and satisfaction with the electricity supply service delivered by the power companies in Hong Kong.

As pointed out in your consultation paper, it is proposed to reduce the rate of return for the post-2008 regulatory regime. One should be very careful with setting the rate of return to ensure that there is sufficient incentive for the power companies to continue their investment in the industry. Taking into consideration the rising interest rate and the anticipated inflation in Hong Kong, your proposed 7-11% permitted rate of return is simply not enough to attract continuous investment in the electricity supply infrastructure. After reading the consultation paper on "Future Development of Electricity Market in Hong Kong: Stage II Consultation", I fully support your policy objective to attain the reliability and safety of the safety of the electricity supply since the power shortage would have enormous impact on Hong Kong as a world financial centre. However, I think you should be more

careful on the following issues:

(1) Inadequate incentive to utilities leading to power shortage

The short regulatory period of 10 years is the first barrier to investment. Electricity infrastructure is capital intensive and has long life. How would one invest in it if it has only 10 years of certainty to earn a return. The second barrier is 7-11% return rates. Are these rates really attractive for investors to put in money that can be locked up in 20 to 30 years? Although it is proposed to revise the return rates every 5 years, they are not attractive in the prevailing economic condition.

Therefore, the 15-year regulatory period and sufficient rate of return to incentivise investment should be re-considered.

(2) Return based on different asset types

The 7% return on environmental facilities is too low and therefore cannot help to mitigate the air quality problem. The tiered return based on different asset types should be re-considered and discarded.

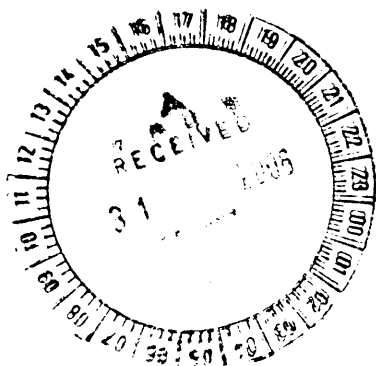





Having read your Stage II Consultation Paper, I would like to express my views and comments as follows:

- Supply reliability is essential and must not be compromised - We understand that a highly reliable power supply is the most essential element to sustain commercial/economic development. Over the past 30-year experience, it has been well proven in Hong Kong that the SCA regime can successfully allow a reliable electricity supply at reasonable cost.

- Sufficient financial incentives must be provided - Reliability comes at a cost. Sufficient and continuous investment in electricity infrastructure, which depends mostly on the financial incentives offered to the utilities, is the key to achieve reliable power supply. The present rate of return offered to the local utilities therefore should be stable and preferably maintained at the current level.

- Regulatory period should be sufficiently long - As there are considerable risks on the investment of power utilities, therefore a longer-than-10 year regulatory period shall be more conducive to attract investment in Hong Kong.

Based on the above, I hope you could consider keep any changes to the present regulatory regime to an absolute minimum.

本人乃一名電燈公司職員，記得十一年前於新界搬至公司附近的屋苑時，很多朋友都羨慕我可以省回不少電費開支。我馬上給他回應：事實上我可省下部份電費開支，但我最得着的是省了不少交通時間，還有一筆可觀的交通費，因當時的交通開支佔了我個人收入約百分九。相對電費只佔我個人收入約百份三，可見電費並不是家庭必要開支最多的一項。

對於政府二〇〇八年後電力市場發展的諮詢文件內提出了四十三項建議，針對配合能源供應的政策目標。我們知道公司港燈是完全支持政府政策目標，但對於文件的多項建議則有強烈保留。本人對其中幾項也有一些意見。

首先我們公司對於供電可靠程要求很高，自一九九七年起我們維持供應可靠程度超過99.999%，較其他大城市為高。這都是多個部門努力的成果，但公司仍要我們齊心再上高峯，目的是給我們各尊貴客戶有更穩定更可靠的供電保證。還有港燈約有七成的客戶是商業用戶，對於穩定供電有一定的要求。我們致力為客戶所提供優質服務，已達至所有承諾的十八項世界級服務標準。另外，公司對環保方面也竭盡所能，而且也獲得多方認同。再觀港燈電費的水平約佔香港家庭總開支約百份之一點七，比其他開支如交通約9.1%為低。比對鄰近亞洲多個地區也是一個最低的水平。再觀其他已開放電力市場的大城市，她們電費水平遠超過我們未開放電力市場的城市。所以各界人仕對開放市場要慎思！

對於建議書所建議協議年期由十五年縮短至十年，我們絕不苟同。首先，我們所有建設和設施，是用三十至三十五年期來計算，以平均攤還方法來收回成本。如縮短至十年，所有的設施未能收回成本，這只會令投資者卻步。若我們被迫接受，為使成本降低，作為投資者可能不會訂最好的設施，或會採用用者自負的方法，到時信相為要收回成本，定必大幅度加價，到時消費者更難接受既不穩定又貴的電力供應。對各商業用戶影響遠超過各住宅用戶。敬請各尊貴客戶慎思！

我們認為政府文件建議的准許回報太低，不足以吸引電力行業所需要的龐大而長遠的投資。因電力公司需要面對業內特定風險，所以准許回報率要足以抵銷當中的風險。因此我們不能接受建議中的7-11%比優惠利率還要低的准許回報。

建議中四項資產分類回報水平並不合邏輯，只會令計算回報的方法更複雜、更官僚及增加行政費用，令到改善空氣質素的目標適得其反。我們認為現時的回報統一水平計算方法既直接又簡單，應予以保留。

我們認為建議中將准許回報與減排表現掛鈎的減排罰則機制不能接受。對投資者而言，投資回報是要彌補資金成本及機會成本，實不應與減排目標扯上關係。況且政府現時已有法例懲罰電力公司減排超標，這建議等同「雙重懲罰」。電力行業涉及長遠的投資，在現時缺乏一個二零零八年後清晰規管架構的情況下，要求電力公司達到政府單方面訂定的減排目標，我們認為相當困難。因此，我們認為減排罰則必須合情合理

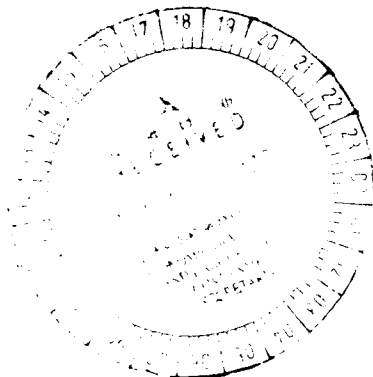
Although I may not have a full understanding of all the issues proposed by the Government and countered by CLPP, I think the Government should not have preempted the consultation with a proposed 7-11% return to the power companies. First of all, as reiterated by the two power companies in many occasions, no justifications have been provided in the Consultation Paper as to how the return is derived. Under such situation, unless the Government is 100% sure that the target can be achieved, it'd unnecessarily subject itself to possible humiliation and failure. On the other hand, if the Government is already 100% sure even before the Consultation that the target is achievable, what's the point of consultation? Is the Government going to coerce the two power companies into accepting the reduced profits? At the worst, this could be a lose-lose situation for both the Government and the power companies if an agreement cannot be reached. In addition, this would also set a dangerous precedent for the Government to follow heavy-handed regulation instead of the prevailing laissez-faire policy? What if the 7-11% return turns out to be really too low for the power companies to invest? Can Hong Kong afford the dire consequences? Can we afford any power shortage?

In sum, I think the Government should really think before it leaps, particularly now that it is leaping into an abyss of no return.



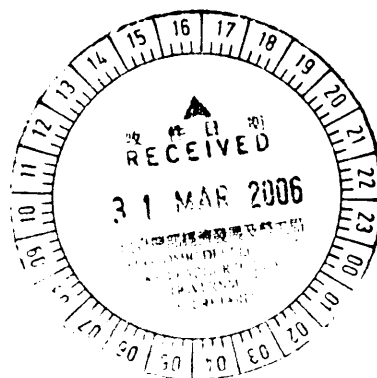

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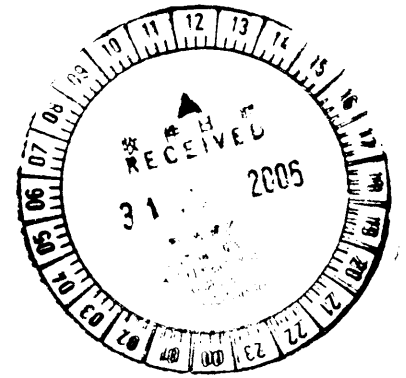

I refer to the Consultation Paper and wish to express my views on the proposed tariff adjustment.


Under the existing SCAs, Government's approval is not required for tariff increases where the projected basic tariff rate of a particular year is no higher than the most recently approved basic tariff rate by more than 7%. It is proposed in the Consultation Paper that under the new regime, Government's approval will be required for all tariff adjustments. It is a very dangerous precedent case for the Government to interfere with the operation of a privately-owned company in particular the followings: -

- a) Power companies are entitled to earn permitted return on investments approved in the Financial Plans. Why Government's approval is required for tariff adjustment even the tariff adjustment is within the permitted return?
- b) The regulatory regime is meaningless if the permitted returns for the two power companies cannot be protected adequately.
- c) The tariff adjustment in accordance with the permitted return can be turned down by the Government in view of the undue political pressure that will increase risks borne by the two power companies.

I opine that as long as the tariff adjustment is within the permitted ROR, Government's approval is not required. This is to avoid Government's interference with the privately-owned company bearing in mind that Hong Kong is a free

commercial city. Just like the central gas supply in Hong Kong, the cost adjustment is not subject to Government's approval.



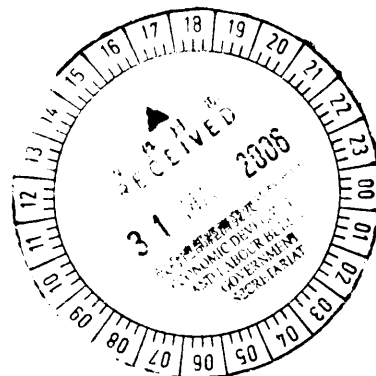

Since the electricity supply industry is capital intensive requiring long lead time for planning and long payback period, I think that a regulatory period of only ten years proposed in the Paper will be too short to ensure any investors to plan and invest in the power industry. Without a long regulatory period, I am afraid that the high standard of supply reliability will no longer be sustained. Therefore, I suggest the Government to ensure a long regulatory period to reduce the risk of investment in the power industry.

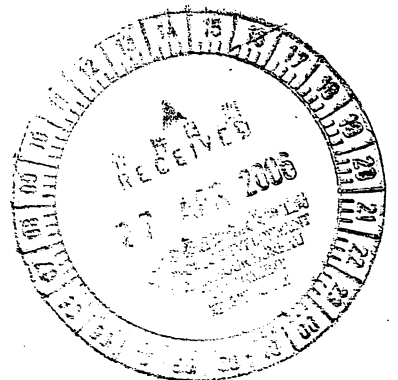

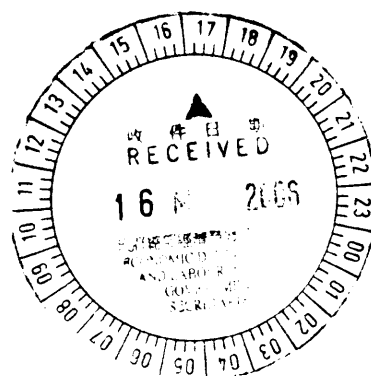

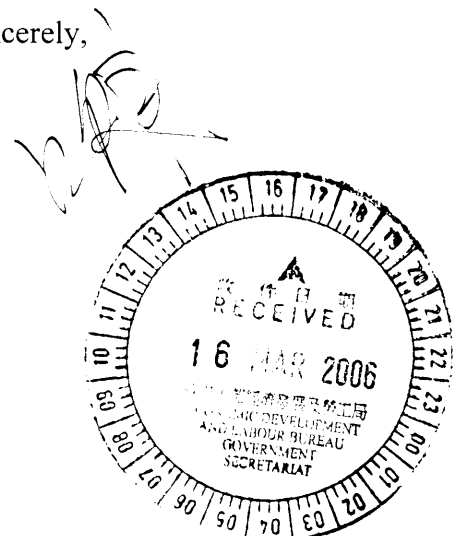

Further to my comments to Stage 1 Consultation Paper, I would like express my views on Stage 2 consultation paper as follows:

Generally speaking, the Hong Kong citizens demand the power companies to provide a reliable and safe electricity supply with reasonable and affordable tariff. In order to achieve this without tolerates a harmony society:

1. The present Scheme of Control Agreement (SCA) had proven to be a successful regulation to ensure a reliable power supply and good customer services and shall be retained.

2. Investment in power industry is huge and return period is long as compared with other industries since the asset life is more than 30 years. In order to encourage the power companies to continue investment to ensure sufficient generating capacity and reliable supply, the permitted rate of return (ROR) should be reasonable and acceptable among the power companies, Government and the citizens. The Government shall substantiate the proposed new ROR rather than saying a figure lower than the existing one so as to please the politicians and the citizens. Also, as the return period is long, if the period of the permitted ROR is less than the present 15-year, this will discourage investment of new plants and maintenance of the installed equipment and have adverse effect to the reliability of supply.

3. The current tariff is generally not expensive as compared with other international cities of same standard of electricity supply and is generally affordable to most of the citizens. Technically it is difficult to provide different degrees of reliable supply at the same region such that citizens can select different tariffs with different reliability. Besides, the tariff is also depended on government policies such as environmental and energy policies. At the consultation paper, the government policy is not clear and hence it is difficult for the power companies to plan and invest. For example, the ratio of electricity generated by coal, gas and renewable energy (RE) is not clear.

4. The public demands both lower tariff and clean energy such as

gas-fired plant and RE. This is contradicted with each other. The government should devise a clear energy policy for the power companies to follow since the investment is long term and any stranded asset (idling of asset when energy policy changes) is undesirable. On the other hand, if the Government wants to promote the use of RE, it should seek public view whether the citizens support a higher tariff for a cleaner energy, sacrifice more land / country and marine parks to build wind farm etc..

5. In order to maintain a more stable fuel cost, efficient coal-fired plants are suggested to be retained in the near future. In order to reduce pollution caused by burning coal, flue gas desulphurization (FGD) plant and other feasible means shall be installed to the coal-fired units.

6. The consultation paper classifies the asset into 4 types with different returns. The ROR is lowest for emission reduction facilities. This will discourage investment and contradict continual improvement of protection of environment. In conclude I consider a single ROR will be adequate.

7. In assessing the feasibility of new supplier from Mainland, the government should impose the same set of requirements such as reliability, adequate capacity, finance, environmental protection etc. to the new suppliers.

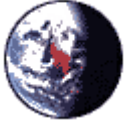
8. Open the electricity market in Hong Kong is a hot topic that most of the citizens believe this will lower the tariff. However, due to small market in Hong Kong and complicated regulatory system, the effectiveness of the new system requires more detail study. In an open market system, more power will be transmitted among different supplied regions through interconnectors which are the bottlenecks of the power network. It will easily lead to a blackout in case any system disturbance cannot be properly regulated in time.

9. Government Policy in dealing with new suppliers is not clear. In case new SCA is signed with two power companies but a third supplier is accepted later on. The existing two power companies had no plan to suit the new change. This may lead to unexpected surplus generation capacity and higher tariff will be resulted.

Finally, in order have a harmony society, fierce competitions leading to unreasonable cheap products/services is undesirable and shall be aware by the Government. Telecommunication market is an example - cheaper but poor service. However this can still be acceptable to the citizens because even the interruption of telecommunication network does not cause much inconvenience to the public. Unlike telecommunication network, the interruption of power network can easily be cascaded and leading to blackout of the whole network which is unacceptable to the citizens.

I have a few comments regarding the captioned and they are stated as follows.

The proposal of shortening of the period of bilateral agreement from 15 years to 10 years is not appropriate for power utility as its development life-cycle is much longer than other industries - it usually takes a couple of years to construct a new power facility - and hence the shortening will discourage investment in this kind of multi-billion infrastructure.

In addition, as the power companies have already been regulated by the EPD's SPLs under the APCO, they will be fined if they fail to meet the emission cap in the SPLs. Hence, double penalties will be resulted if their permitted rate of return is linked to their achievement of the emission cap and this is unfair to the power companies.

The idea of applying different rates of return to different types! of assets is not feasible because the savings gained will not cover the administrative costs incurred and the difference will inevitably be borne by the customers.

Finally, the current institutional setup is effective and efficient and a separate regulatory authority is not necessary.
