Hong Kong needs an integrated energy policy that comprehensively addresses energy supply and usage. Electricity generation has produced significant air pollution and contributes significant amount of greenhouse gas emission, causing global warming and resulted in climate change, the single biggest threat to our planet.

The Government's current proposals are outdated and could do far more to address these issues. I demand a future electricity market in Hong Kong that facilitates clean energy, and encourages energy conservation and efficiency, so that I am provided with electricity at minimal impact to my health, society and the environment.

I strongly recommend the Government to:

 Set up a comprehensive and integrated energy policy for Hong Kong that properly addresses energy security, energy efficiency, protection of the environment and public health. The environmental costs of air pollution should be incorporated into policy making and the threat of climate change should be reflected into our electricity market.
 Set up a regulatory mechanism to electricity companies to offer energy efficiency services so that I can improve the efficiency of my electricity usage. The government's current proposal is fundamentally flawed as the utilities continue to make the majority of their profits from selling as much electricity as possible, providing a major disincentive for them to seriously promote energy efficiency. The government must seriously examine the economic models that can overcome this barrier, rather than making small changes to the currently flawed system.

3. Ensure fair access to the power grid to promote for the energy supply by small energy producers, including renewable energy and other clean energy suppliers.

Stage II Consultation Future Development of the Electricity Market in Hong Kong

With reference to the captioned Consultation Paper, I would like to give my comments as follows:

- a. Basically, I support the bilateral agreement structure similar to the current Scheme of Control Agreements regime for regulating the power companies after 2008. Also, the current institutional setup to monitor the power companies works well. Such institutional setup should be retained for the post-2008 regime. It is appropriate and reasonable that the permitted return of the power companies is based on average net fixed asset. I believe that this approach would provide financial incentives to the power companies to invest for maintaining/further improvement on operational efficiency, supply reliability and customer service.
- b. There is a disadvantage on reducing the present rate of return (ROR) of the power companies from 13.5% to 7%-11% after 2008. The proposed ROR is simply too low to attract the long-term investment needed by the power industry. Such reduction will discourage investment and affect the supply reliability in the future. Since the current electricity tariffs are very reasonable and affordable, it is not necessary to further lower the tariffs by reducing the ROR at the expense of jeopardizing the supply reliability. Moreover, there is no evidence that HK's tariffs are too high, nor that lowering them will not impact reliability. It is not a proper decision-making to cut tariffs and returns on the supposition that they are too high, particularly when system reliability is at stake.
- c. Being a world financial centre with most people living in high-rise buildings, reliability of electricity supply is of paramount importance. Hence it would be risky for Hong Kong to rely on the Mainland for electricity supply in the future. This is because based on the past and present performance of the power companies in the Mainland, the supply reliability and adequacy is poor. Moreover, from the environmental perspective, the generating units in the Mainland give far more pollutants than those in Hong Kong. If Hong Kong imported electricity from the Mainland, this would worsen the air quality in the region of Pearl River Delta and subsequently create more pollution in Hong Kong. So how can supply from the Mainland can help to achieve your policy objective in minimizing the environmental impact caused by the production and use of energy?

Finally, I hope that after considering my view, the final regulatory framework will be able to provide a very stable and predictable environment for power companies to invest and maintain a world-class electricity infrastructure for Hong Kong. This, in return, will provide consumers with affordable and reasonable tariffs at high reliability and good quality of services.

Comments on Stage II Consultation Paper on Future Development of the Electricity Market in Hong Kong

I am writing to express my views as follows:

- Environmental protection is crucial but most of the air pollution in Hong Kong is caused by emissions from Guangdong Province. Further reducing the emission from power companies alone may not be helpful to improve Hong Kong's air quality. The HKSAR Government should strive to negotiate emission trading with Guangdong Government to reduce the total emission. On the other hand, promoting the use of energy efficient equipment and demand-side-management should help to lower the electricity demand and hence reduce emission ultimately.
- Although I agree with the introduction of renewable energy in HK, one should consider specific Hong Kong regional situation in deciding the renewable energy policy. It would be disastrous if the power companies build an enormous wind farm with extremely low utility rate at Sai Kung or elsewhere due to the renewable energy policy or pressures from Green groups/councilors. Our scenery and precious land resource and ecology would be sacrificed.
- The proposed asset classification for permitted rate of return is not realistic and has not been adopted in any other countries. It is complicated to classify existing equipment in the fixed assets of power companies. It would rather increase unnecessary administrative cost and bureaucracy.
- The proposed permitted rate of return as low as 7 % is considered not attractive for power companies which invest huge amount in power generation and distribution equipment with long payback period. Without a reasonable rate of return, it would weaken the financial status of the power companies to make future investment or to upgrade/replace the existing non-environmental-friendly equipment.

I want to express my opinions here


1) I really do not want to see the joining of the electricity supply network in Hong Kong with that in the Mainland. Who is responsible if there are faults in between? I do not want to live without electricity supply for several years just to argue who is responsible for the fault.

2) Geographically, it is difficult to develop solar or wind power plants in Hong Kong. It is also not very practical to develop it as in the coming 6 years the target was only 1-2% of all the power coming from substantial development. Encouraging such an impractical target means discouraging the companies from doing practical work, which is totally unreasonable.

3) It is also not reasonable to reduce the period of SCAs into 10 years. This will seriously affect the power plants because contracts signed by the plants will need to take a higher risk.

I do hope the above points are seriously reconsidered.



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


After reading the Stage II Consultation Paper on Electricity Market in Hong Kong, I found that a lot of information were missing in supporting the suggestions put forth by the Hong Kong Government. Personally, I believe in reasonable control of the two electric companies to protect the interest of the general public, However, a rough consultation paper like this not only! would this lower the image of the Government, it also makes it difficult to convince the general public our Government is doing a proper job to study the whole situation in a all-rounded manner. List below are some of my queries:

On one hand, HKSAR Government keeps stressing the importance of exploring Renewable Energy sources and also admitted that the cost of doing so is quite high, on the other hand lower the permitted rate of return from 13.5% to a range of 7-11%. Such rate is so low that almost any reasonable investment vehicle with lower risk and shorter term of investme! nt can generate this rate of return. What kind of incentive to give to the investor of the two electricity companies to do research and explore on the RE area with such low rate of return on investment?

The Paper seems to try to equate between competition and better service which, to my opinion, is not necessary true. When market is open up for more competition, giving the same level of demand, this would mean more competitors fighting for the same pie. In order to gain new and retain existing customers, insensible price cutting could result.&nbs! p; This happened in newspaper sectors, telephone companies, mobile phone companies and so on. With such unpredictable income, do you think investor would be willing to make infrastructure type of investment? They would only concern about short-term profit, rip the immediate benefit as much as possible. Without proper investment on the hardware and infrastructure, this market-opening policy would ultimately harm the end-consumer as stability of electricity could be jeopardised.

I sincerely hope that our HKSAR Government wou! Id be more realistic in dealing with forcing an unreasonable rate of return to the investors of electricity companies and to force opening of the electricity market. You would be working against your belief of helping the public.

My views on Stage II Consultation on Future of Electricity Market are as below.

Return based on average net fixed asset was preferred. Return based on different types of assets was not preferred. For long term investment in power industry, 7-11% of return was not sufficient to attract investment.

Bilateral agreement between the Government and the power companies is preferred. Ten years regulatory period with an option to extend for another 5 years was not suitable for long term investment.

Tariff including costs and permitted return can ensure enough investment, reduces operation and investment risks and facilitates the Government's oversight on tariff setting. The setting up of a fuel clause account with fuel cost borne by consumers can help to stabilize tariff. The setting up of a fuel clause account with fuel cost borne by consumers can reduce operational risk.

The supply in Guangdong, China is already very tight and this supply may greatly affect the supply reliability in Hong Kong as the reliability there was so bad. Allowing third company to use the existing grid in Hong Kong will lower the reliability of supply and blur the responsibility on supply reliability. Provision of interconnection between CLPPower and HKE may add in tariff pressure while there will be very limited benefits. It may not be able to provide choice of suppliers to Hong Kong users.

Opinions on Stage II Consultation

As a Hong Kong citizen and electricity user, I wish to express my opinions on some Government's proposals in the Stage II Consultation Paper.

Government should be very cautious with their proposal to lower the permitted rate of return from 13.5% to 7–11%. But there is no justification for the rate of return of 7–11% in the consultation paper. The 7–11% return is considered not enough to attract the huge and long-term investment for building a reliable electricity system. Government must give the power companies sufficient incentives to invest. Otherwise, there will be no new fund injected into the electricity infrastructure and our high level of supply reliability will be deteriorated.

The government has proposed a shorter 10-year regulatory period. Electricity infrastructure has long life and is capital intensive. It is considered that the proposed 10-year regulatory period is too short because it has only 10 years of certainty to earn a return. With the regulatory period shortened to 10 years, there will be increased investment risk for the investors. I support that the 15-year regulatory period as adopted in the past should be maintained after 2008.

I request the Government to evaluate the proposals more carefully in the Stage II Consultation Paper and Government will seriously consider my views.

Congratulation, Hong Kong is ranked as number one again among all free market economy countries and cites by an economic journey recently. Less Government interference to the economy is the main reason to retain this honor.

Investors investing on power companies should entitle to earn permitted return on investment projects as approved by the Government, otherwise the regulatory regime would become meaningless if the costs and permitted returns cannot be adequately protected.



In response to the Government Stage II consultation process, I, the undersigned, would like to put forward my opinion and comment as a shareholder of CLF fieldings for your kind consideration.

While fully agree with the Government's objectives of providing a safe, reliable supply of electricity at reasonable cost with low environmental pellution, there are certain areas in the proposal that I find it impossible to agree:

1. The Return of 7-115 is too low and the fluration of the Regime of 10 years is too short 7

Investments in the provision of electricity calls for enormous capital expeditue investment that entails significant risk when the duration of the megime is too short. On the other hand, when the Regime is prolonged to at least 15 years, the risk and the cost are reduced accordingly.

Over the past 8 years, CLF Holdings has kept tarriff unchanged; in addition there has been rebates totally MK33 billion. There has been an annual investment of 6 billion each year. During the 8-year period, the price of coal has increased many folds.

The drastically howering of return would unfairly cut shareholder value by 30-50%.

2. Environmental pellution objective

The greatly reduced environmental pollution objective entails enormous cost. The use of gas instead of coal would increase cost by 30% and would endanger the reliability of supply.

In my opinion the Government should carefully discuss with CLr delaings so as to determine what level of pollution is desirable, commensurate with the cost and thereby strike a balance between these two factors rather than fixing a penalty cause, without giving the reasons for such stipulation and without discussion with CLr Aeldings.


2. The interests of the shareholders, the stake holder (Excon, USA) and the employees of CLP holdings should be protected.

Electricity accounts for only 1.3% to 2.7% of the monthly household expenditure in Hong Kong. Dramatically reducing the tariff via the cutting of the permissible return from 13.5 to 15% to 7-11% would benefit the public to a very small extent, whereas the shareholders would sustain a loss of 30-50% in terms of dividend and share value. CLP Holdings profit on electricity investment in Mong Kong increases only by 3.8%, and as only around 60% of the profit is distributed, much of the retained profit is utilized in maintaining the current standard of electricity supply. On the other hand, other household cost, e.g., rental, cest of purchasing a flat accounty for a much higher proportion. There are, of course, simple methods by which such cost could be reduced, but such measure would hurt the interest of the land developers. I, therefore, see no reason why the Government should so unjustifiably jeopardise the interest of CLF shareholders, so as to benefit the public by such a small extent. In this connection I would also like to add that offices in the Contral rental increase in rental as much as 70%, and yet the Government has not taken any action, even though such heftic rise would be detrimental to the investment atmosphere in Mong Kong.

As a shareholder of the Hongkong Electric Holdings Ltd., I would like to express my views on the following 5 key proposals outlined in the Consultation Paper.

1. The Regulatory Period Should Remain 15 Years

> The proposed 10+5 year regulatory period is actually for 10 years. It is too short for huge and lumpy investments in 30-35 year service life assets to recover costs and to earn reasonable return.

2. The Permitted Rate of Return (ROR) Should be Sufficient to Incentivize Investment

The proposed 7-11% ROR is far too low and not commensurate with risks of the power industry. It cannot attract huge and long-term investments required.



I appreciate the Government's effort in preparing the consultation paper for the future electricity market development. After reading your consultation paper, I am pleased to give my comments on the consultation paper.

I hope the Government could reconsider the appropriateness on reducing the rate of return from the present level of 13.5% down to 7-11%. The rationale is that the proposed rate of return is too low to attract sufficient investment in the electricity supply industry. Besides, the proposed 10-year regulatory period will further hinder the continuous investment in the industry. I have concerns if the power company would have adequate incentive for continuous investing in the electricity infrastructure after 2008. Having read the stage II consultation document, I have following comments for your consideration:

The short regulatory period of 10 years can hinder investment. The investment in electricity generation and transmission equipment is of capital intensive, long depreciation period and non-movable nature. Ten years cannot be an incentive for investment as the ROI is not assured especially the document is proposing possible new supply sources from the Mainland post 2018.

Mainland has her own problems in electricity generation and transmission. With reference to Mainland's economic development trend, shortage in power supply would still persist in the coming 10 years. The time lag between planning and completion of power generation / transmission projects, intensive capital investment and fast economic growth are the factors. I don't think any of the Hongkongers would expect Mainland to undergo negative economic growth for the benefit of Hong Kong.

Hong Kong people must manage Hong Kong until 2047. We should solve our problems and not ask Mainland to assist us once we encounter any problems. 





Stage II Consultation on Future Development of the Electricity Market in Hong Kong

The direction to more environmental and economical power sources is undeniable. Yet I have reservation on the measures raised in the Stage II consultation report.

A reliable power source meeting the environmental and economical expectation will not exist in an <u>unstable market environmetment</u>. From what we have achieved in Hongkong's economy in the past decades, I have beliefs in the capability and expertise of the two existing power companies. The direction to more environmental and economical expectation shall be achieved by: -

- 1. A <u>good balance</u> in the duration terms of the agreement with the rate of return. It is ridiculous to expect a quality supply at a low rate of return over a short period of time simultaneously.
- I suggest that the general rate of return to be reduced <u>slightly and progressively</u> while the period to be <u>extended</u> to 15 years or even longer to encourage sustainable power companies like a partner to our economy.
- I support higher return allowable under a regular review mechanism as incentive for green power innovation, etc.
- I support cut in return under a regular review mechanism as incentive for surplus power generated, etc.





I write to express my comments on Hong Kong's electricity market after 2008.

People living in Hong Kong should be proud that the reliability of power supply in Hong Kong today is of excellent standard, and the highly reliable power supply is expected to continue after 2008. Regulations for the future electricity market should provide an environment which allows the power companies to continue to do so.

In particular, I found that there are two proposals made by the government which would vastly decrease the power companies' incentives in their future investments. The first such proposal is decreasing the power companies' rate of return from 13.5% to 7-11% and the second one is shortening the regulatory period from 15 years to 10 years. If the proposals were adopted, the power companies would most likely reduce their investments in their facilities as these investments may not have any return after the next regulatory period. With the investments in the power supply facilities decreased, the reliability of power supply would inevitably be affected and we won't be able to enjoy the high standard of power supply we are having today after 2008.

Dear Sir,

With reference to the stage II consultation on SOC, I am disappointed on the Government's proposal as follows,

1. Open Market

I disagreed to plan to open the electricity market in HK in next future. HK is a well developed and small market. Any new comers will face great difficulty to develop its own plant and network in HK. If Government force the existing companies to open up its network, someone have to pay a great compensation to the electric companies on it. In the experience of telecom, the compensation will come from Government, in other word from our pocket.

On the other hand, it is not sure if there is any gain even when the network is opened up. Will the reliability, environmental performance, safety, service, can be up kept? Will the customers in remote area, where new network should be set up, can be still satisified?

If I am the CEO of the new comer, the target customer will be the big commerical companies like MTR, KCR, etc, which have high and stable electricity demand. The one in remote area, who I have spent a lot to build network, will be surely rejected. You can see some areas in Sai Kung still be not covered by the mobile telecom network for years, despite the mobile telecom market is an open market and there are many service providers in this market.

Further, if there are new comers and they build their plant and network. As a result, the reserve capacity as a whole will be greatly increased. A lot of resource will be wasted. I note that the Government plans to merge MTR and KCRC. One of the reasons is to maximize the resource and reduce the unnecessary duplication of service. Government consider the merge is good to HK people. But why not the Government plan to built one more railway that overlap MTR and KCRC, if competition = BETTER SERVICE = LOWER TARIFF = GOOD TO HK PEOPLE.

2. Rate of return / contract period

I do consider the 7 to 11 % of rate of return + a 10 year contract is not attractive enough for investors to invest in the electric market with following reasons,

The investment in electric companies is mainly in construction of power plant and transmission network. The life of these equipment would be 20 to 30 years. If the plant is built but the Government terminate the contract 10 years later, the investment will be wasted. On the other hand, the return rate is low and the investors can only get back part of the investment. Further, to increase tariff will be much difficult in future due to political

pressure. If I was the investor, I would have rather put my money into the bank, as least, I could have got back my money with interest 10 years later.

From the above, you can see that the existing electric companies will be likely limited their investments. So, what will happen 10 years later when the equipment got aged and can not fulfill the requirement in that time? Will there be system breakdown or even blackout?

3. Reliable Electricity Supply

As a HK people, I care my spending on the electricity, but I do care more about my earning. If the change of SOC will result in a better economic growth and create wealth in HK, I do agree the change. Will open market and leak of electricity equipment investment will result in a more reliable electricity supply that leads HK growth?

In Stage I consultation, a lot of feedback highlighted their concerns on the electricity supply reliability. However, in stage II consultation, I cannot aware the Government's determination in maintain a high reliable electricity supply in HK, which is quite disappointing.

4. Only way to reduce tariff?

I agree that Government has a role to fight for us for a lower tariff. But, are lower the rate of return / environment performance punishment on the electricity companies the only way to achieve it?

I suggest the Government should take a leading role to discuss with PRC to ask for fuel with a lower cost. In PRC, the fuel cost is fixed by the Government. So, the electricity companies in PRC can get fuel in a cost much lower than the market price. If HK Government, works with HEC & CLP, to discuss with PRC and get fuel with a lower price, the electric tariff will be reduced. It will be a (HK People) win - (Government) win - (Electric companies) win result.



I would like to offer comment on the subject:

Scheme of Control and Rate of Return

- The suggested 7-11% rate of return classified by asset is a significant cut to the current 13.5-15% level. Scheme of Control has been in place for years, supply reliability in HK has been improving and so far, local power companies has managed to maintain tariff at affordable level. This has proved the control mechanism has been working quite well, and outcome exactly aligns with government's policy objective, the need to initiate a big change is not justified.
- Supply reliability is a crucial factor to sustain development in HK, general public understands this fact and it is welcomed by overseas investors. But supply reliability comes at cost, when it is at top priority in government's policy objective, the policy itself should also support incentive for power companies to invest.

Emission Targets

Fuel diversification is important to secure reliable electricity supply. Reliance on single source of clean fuel supply is impossible. On the other hand, land scarcity and high land cost make development of renewable energy expensive. While extensive supply from renewable is impossible, environmental target has to be achieved by reducing emission from existing coal plants. Government should welcome investment on emission reduction facilities with reasonable incentive, so why the lowest rate on return to disincentive investment instead.

Renewable Energy

- Understand that development of renewable energy bears social responsibility, but renewable energy, by nature in self, is intermittent and difficult to be relied on without backup.
- High cost and backup requirements are important issues that worth consideration behind the scene set for clean and environmental friendly supply

New Supply Sources and Grid Access

- All market players should bear the same supply reliability, safety and environmental standards and commitment. Regulation should be in place to ensure no 'cherry-pick' and 'burden-shift' by any new supplier.
- Clear and fair market rules are necessary for gird access and technical considerations play important part here. Without jeopardizing the performance of grid supply, additional investment is necessary for reinforcement, government shall set clear demarcation for such responsibility. In the end, the cost is to be born by users.

Market Competition

- In an effort to grow subscribers and expand market share at initial stage, immediate price cut may be achieved, but there are examples to show the behavior over time is difficult to be long lasting. At time when limit to growth approaches, it will just reverse. There are lots of lesson learnt from overseas competitive markets
- The power industry is highly capital intensive and technical limits come quick, room for enjoying price cut is very limited. Again, decision to alienate new subscribers or expand services depends on incentive to invest.
- The HK market is too small for fair competition
- Without clear arrangement to address the above issues by the government, plan for transition become unrealistic.

In the Stage II consultation paper, I am glad that the government can fully recognize our concerns on electricity supply reliability. We treasure the current high supply reliability and would like to protect it at all costs. Therefore, I would like to ask the government to review the following issues seriously before proceed any further negotiation with the two power companies.

- 1. Open electricity market for competition is not meaningful and not practical in Hong Kong.
- 2. Relying on China's power supply will endanger our reliability level and import pollution indirectly.
- 3. Sufficient and reasonable return should be provided to power companies to induce their investment continually in power infrastructure. Setting the return too low will just cause under-investment which jeopardizes our reliability in the long run. 
With reference to your Stage II Consultation on the captioned subject, I would like to make some comments.


I am aware that you are seeking public opinions on the future development of the electricity market and would like to give my views for your consideration.

I find your proposal to lower the allowed rate of return for the power companies by 20-50% (from 13.5% to 7-11%) risky. This obviously will not provide adequate motivation for the power companies to invest. In longer term, this probably will affect the reliability of electricity supply to be enjoyed by Hong Kong people. Sufficient rate of return, in my view similar to the present 13.5%, should be allowed to attract the huge and long-term capitals required by power companies.

In addition, I would like to comment on your proposal to shorten the regulatory period. I understand this arrangement will greatly increase the risks of the power companies and again affects electricity supply reliability.

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

We see that there are increasing risks to the electricity regulatory system in Hong Kong. The current Scheme of Control has proven to be far superior to perhaps any other system in the world in providing safe and reliable electricity supply to Hong Kong. A safe and reliable electricity supply cannot be taken for granted. As I travel around the world, I have found poor government regulatory systems have led to inadequate power supply investments, inefficient power generation and distribution and poor customer service. One of the most frequent problems that I have seen is that there are not enough incentives for companies to make the necessary power supply investments. Another problem is that there are not enough legal safeguards to ensure that tariff adjustments are not subject to the whims of politicians. 



Stage II Consultation on Future Development of the Electricity Market in Hong Kong

I understand the Government has launched the Stage II Consultation on the captioned subject. As a shareholder of the Hongkong Electric Holdings Ltd., I would like to express my views on the proposed arrangements contained in the Consultation Paper.

Regulatory Arrangements

1. First of all, I agree that the current institutional setup with economic, safety and environmental regulation by various Government bureaux and departments should be continued and that the economic regulation should be most effectively carried out by a bilateral agreement signed between the Government and each of the power companies.

2. However, I cannot agree with the proposed shorter 10-year regulatory framework. Given the long-term investment cycle of electricity infrastructure and contractual commitments (e.g. the liquefied natural gas take-or-pay contracts), investors of the power companies must be provided with a sufficiently long regulatory period so that they are willing to continue to invest.

3. In order to attract further capital investment, I strongly urge that the regulatory period be maintained at the current 15 years. If not, a higher return rate should be introduce in order to reflect the increased risks faced by the power companies.

Permitted Rate of Return (ROR)

4. The Consultation Paper proposes, without given any justifications, a 4-tiered ROR in the range of 7%-11% for different asset types. My view is that the proposed ROR is too low to attract the huge and long-term investment required by the power industry. Given the industry-specific risks faced by the power companies, a higher ROR is required to cover the challenges and non-diversifiable risks in the electricity market.

5. In addition, I do not see any logic in the proposed 4-tiered ROR arrangement which I believe should not be adopted. Instead, the existing arrangement of a single ROR for all asset types should be maintained as it is straightforward and simple. If the cost of raising capital for an asset is the same, be it for electricity generation from renewable or non-renewable sources, electricity delivery or emission reduction, the ROR should be the same.

Emission Reduction

6. I also find the proposed emission penalty mechanism, which links ROR with emission reduction performance, totally unacceptable. Given the nature of electricity supply infrastructure which requires long term business planning, the absence of a clearly and fairly defined post-2008 regulatory framework, would be difficult for the power companies to meet the emission caps.

7. In fact, the proposal will subject power companies to a "double penalty" as there are already provisions under the Air Pollution Control Ordinance penalizing them for failing to meet emission caps imposed by the Government.

Tariff Setting

8. For tariff setting, I consider the proposed Government approval required for tariff setting unreasonable. If there is no guarantee for the power companies to recover their costs and permitted returns, the certainty of the regulatory regime will be completely undermined.

9. While I agree with the setting up of a Tariff Stabilization Fund, I find the asymmetric nature of the proposed Fund an undesirable feature. A more balanced and flexible arrangement is to allow a debit balance for the Fund.

New Supply Sources

I fully share the Government's view that the future development of our electricity 10. market should not be predicated on supply from the Mainland. As CLP is still supplying huge amount of electricity to Guangdong, I wonder how the latter can export power to Hong Kong in the next few years, not to mention the reliability of such export. You may have aware that the Mainland is still facing shortage of power supply problem. From time to time especially during summer, the government gives short notices to the factories in the Mainland to suspend power supply. Shopping malls are also being ordered to limit their use of electricity, failing which the government would order the mall to close. The unstable and unreliable supply of power in the Mainland greatly affects the business operations in the Mainland. If that happens to Hong Kong, I am sure that the competitiveness of Hong Kong being an advanced commercial city would greatly be hindered. Given the current situation I wonder whether the Mainland could support Hong Kong in the near future. In fact, given the vital importance of an adequate and reliable supply of electricity to Hong Kong, I have grave concerns about the introduction of any new supply sources, which may not bring in benefits to electricity users.

As an investor of Hong Kong's power industry, I am proud to have helped build one of the most adequate and reliable electricity supply systems in the world. I trust that you will give due recognition to our past achievements as you map out the way forward for the electricity market. I also hope that my views will be considered and reflected in the ongoing consultation exercise.



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

Section B 2.10 Interconnection with Guangdong

With the continued shortage of power supply vs demand in China, in particular the slow reaction to increasing power supply to handle the restriction of usage in certain southern China provinces, the reliability and responsiveness of the power grid to consumer demand for power in mainland China is questionable. Thus, the proposed interconnection with Guangdong with the aim to import electricity into Hong Kong needs to be assessed very carefully in terms of electricity reliability and stability, considering the fact that Hong Kong people are all very used to a stable and reliable supply of electricity.

2.17 Usage of renewable energy

It is well known that the cost of renewable energy (to maintain reliable and stable electricity supply) is higher than conventional energy. I strongly agree that financial incentives should be provided to encourage the development of such source of energy. Otherwise, no investor will be interested in developing this source of energy. Apart from considering financial incentives, HK government needs to also consider the proportion of renewable energy vs conventional energy and whether mandatory usage of such can be implemented to support such industry. In addition, I am also concerned about which party will need to bear the additional financial cost (eg. government or consumers).

Section C Proposed regulatory arrangements - tariff; regulatory body

Tariff mechanism should consider the following:

- providing sufficient incentive to encourage sufficient investment to ensure supply stability and reliability; as a consumer, supply reliability is considered to be more important than mere reduction of electricity tarifft
- avoid power companies investing in excess capacity, thus passing extra cost to consumer
- setting up a strong regulatory body with sufficient industry knowledge to liaise and monitor the business of the power companies is very important


After reading the consultation paper on the future development of the electricity market in Hong Kong, I have the following comments to make:

1. Chapter 2, Section A, Policy objective

The Government's energy policy objective

"to ensure that the public can enjoy reliable, safe and efficient energy supplies at reasonable prices, and to minimise the environmental impact caused by the production and use of energy"

is just a policy rather than an objective. Objective is the means to translate the policy into actions.

I admit that reliable, safe and efficient energy supplies are our competition advantages and should be sustained. Any compromise of these attributes for reducing tariff is stupid and irresponsible.

The policy should include "security" in the energy policy as in other nations such as Japan [1] and Germany [2] where the security of primary fuel portfolio including coal is explicitly mentioned.

The objective should also include energy conversation plan as in the energy objective of Israel [3].

The paper only addressed short term goals and did not touch on long-term issues with what, when and how to achieve our future goals. Some of the long term issues are: the energy consumption forecast, time frame for introducing new generating capacity, plans to save energy, research and development of new and renewable energy, development and use new electricity generation technologies, plan to prepare for the change from scheme of control to market-oriented competition, logistics for extra primary fuels.

- 2. Chapter 2, Section B, New Supply Sources, Clause 2.3 2.17
- 2.1 There is no evidence that reliable, safe and efficient energy supplied by the existing power companies will be jeopardized and there are track records that the existing companies could provide services in pace with the economic growth. It is not logical to preclude the local companies for the supply of electricity in future. The so-called "New sources" from the mainland (clause 2.3-2.10) and renewable energies (Clause 2.11-2.17) are not wrong but fail to address the quality of electricity, obligation to supply, and environmental commitment.

- 2.2 If the intention of introducing new supply from Mainland is to enhance reliability, safety, efficiency, and environmental performance, it is not at the right moment now, since these attributes are not the strength of the power companies in the Mainland nearby Hong Kong.
- 2.3 If supply from Mainland is allowed, the competition with the existing power companies should be in the same arena details about electricity quality, obligation to supply, environmental commitments, tariff, taxes should be clearly stated.
- 2.4 The Government's target of 1-2% of Renewable energy (RE) by 2012 is not realistic if REs are to be built in the territory by the electricity companies. The study report made in 2002 by EMSD on the potential applications of RE [4] found that the main source of RE in HK will be "energy-from-waste". This kind of RE is responsible by the government, however, such projects have aroused strong objection from local environmental groups. The building of windfarm on the other hand is also facing the same objection from the local environmental groups although these groups should loudly to support RE. This is what the South China Morning Post had mentioned as "the ugly side of renewable energy" that people supported RE on condition that "do not build in my backyard". This is the repeating story of the California electricity crisis.

There is also a lack of economic incentive to attract investor to build REs. The Return on investment (ROI) for a solar PV system at the EMSD head quarter is 40 years [5]. In the study report on the potential applications of RE [4], page A-1, all RE systems were based on a 20 year lifetime. The government projects have a life or ROI longer than the existing SCA of 15 years. The proposed regulated period of 10 years is not logical.

- 2.5 This Consultation Paper did not mention the direction of fuel coal, oil, natural gas, hydrogen and nuclear. However, in another consultation paper for Persistent Organic Pollutants (POPs), the government suggested to phase out coal in the next 10 years. Coal was started to use in generating electricity after oil crisis in the 70s for its reliable supply. The government should not rule out coal as a major fuel owing to the present poor air quality. As mentioned above, coal is explicitly included in the energy policy of many countries, e.g. Japan and Germany[1,2]. It is also heard that Singapore has started to study the flexibility of using coal for electricity generation in additional to fuel oil and natural gas. The Government should produce a clear policy on fuel for the energy players in HK to follow.
- 3. Chapter 2, Section B, New Supply Sources, Clause 2.18–2.22

There is no detail on the access of the grid owned by the existing electricity companies. Clause 2.21(a) (ii) is a good wish.

There is no detail on the responsibility and liability for Clause 2.21 (c).

4. Chapter 2, Section C (II), Environmental Regulation, Clause 2.28 – 2.32

There is no long-term target and objective to control air pollutants. As we know, air and water pollution are cross boundary issues. The proposed measures

- (a) Ignore the present situation. The poor visibility is associated with the wind direction instead of the amount of waste gases produced locally. The grayish sky in HK is predominantly in winter when the wind direction is from north and north west. Clear sky is mostly in the summer time in HK when the wind direction is prevailing south and south east. This fact is supported by the data from the HK observatory [6]. When comparing the statistics on "number of hours of reduced visibility" and "wind direction" in the last three months and for June to August, we can estimate the source of the air pollutants. The center of poor air quality can also be identified from the EPD's web site for the Regional Air Quality Index [7].
- (b) Apply measures locally without seeking the co-operation with our neighbor The government adopts an avoidance attitude to address the problem and let the problem continues. We will pay the price of losing tourist and medical expenses of air-pollutant related diseases. The unilateral control is wasting effort and resources.
- (c) Push the responsibilities to the power companies The emission from the existing power plants only contributed a portion of the total air pollutants and greenhouse gas emission inventory (1990-2004) [8] but the government push the responsibilities to them by various regulations and fines. The other contributors are free from obligation, such as road transportation, navigation, civil aviation, other fuel combustion and non-combustion.

Environmental protection is not just the power company's responsibility but also the consumers. Since more we consume more natural resources are used and more contaminant are produced. Taxes associated with the use of electricity are rather common the European countries [9]. Some of the examples are VAT and electricity tax. In Denmark, there are surcharge of renewable and carbon dioxide tax. I Germany, there is Ecotax and renewable levy. In Sweden, there are fossil fuel levy, green certificate charge, and energy efficiency commitment charges. In Spain, there are nuclear moratorium and decommissioning taxes. The tax is about 30% for Denmark and up to 50% in Germany. The responsibility on environmental protection is solely borne by the power companies in the consultation paper (clause 2.28 to2.32) is not fair and is lag behind the international practices. For our future, HK consumers should pay electricity / environmental taxes.

- 5. Chapter 2, Section C (III), Economic regulation, Clause 2.33 2.39
- 5.1 Duration of the Agreement

The proposed 10 year is not the norm of ESI even the government projects mentioned in item 2.4 above have 20–40 years. Furthermore, the natural gas contract is usually covered 15 years and longer. The norm of the trade is that the buyer have to pay all committed amount of gas even though they will not consume it. That is the power company has to bear the price of fuel gas if the agreement ends after 10 years. Hong Kong is small potato in the international fuel market. Therefore, the agreement duration should be at least 15 years.

- 5.2 Return on investment is not excessively high. Since the ESI involves
 - huge investment high interest are required for funding

- long payback period longer the period higher the risk
- high exit barrier the cost to purchase electricity generating equipment is high but the residual value is very low.

The average cumulative ROI for Exxon in fuel business is 20% per annum over the past 40 years, whereas Exxon's investment in CLP is only 13.5 to 15%. In comparing with other investment, the existing ROI is not particularly attractive. We should strike a balance on the ROI with respect to the risk of investment, the real situation of the ESI market and the purchasing power of the consumers.

The proposed return to the investment of pollution control equipment is unreasonably low. This would be no incentive to better our environment. As mentioned in item 4 above, environmental protection is the responsibility of everyone, the consumers have to bear the costs and not the electricity investors.

- 5.3 Performance improvement is not encouraged but threatened. Since extra penalty is required to pay by the power companies under the stage 2 proposal. This penalty is ridiculous since there are regulations and penalties already for any exceedance of the environmental aspects. The proposed sentence is double penalty to discourage performance rather than encouragement for better performance.
- 5.4 The tariff with respect to the quality is not high. In comparing with the tariff in other places [9, 10], the present tariff only contribute to about 1.7 % of our GDP per capita or 1.94 % of our average household income in HK [11].



Referring to your consultation paper on the future development of the electricity market in Hong Kong, please find my views on this subject.

The proposed 7%-11% rate of return may not give sufficient financial incentives for the power companies to invest. As the power companies are now enjoying a permitted return of 13.5%, I think such a reduction may discourage them to invest.

Also, the proposed multiple bands of asset return for the post-2008 regime may give a wrong signal to the power companies and hence distorting their planning priorities. To provide sufficient incentive to the power company, a single rate of return for all asset types will be a more logical means to adopt.

To ensure electricity reliability and sufficient investment in the electricity supply infrastructure in the post-2008 regulatory regime, the Government should provide adequate incentives for the investor to invest.

I cannot agree with you on some of the proposals after reading the government's Stage II Consultation Paper.



A. Policy Objective

There are no clear energy policies in the proposed paper. A balanced fuel mix strategy us important in order to ensure supply security and cost benefits.

B. <u>New Supply Sources</u>

(I) <u>Supply from the Mainland</u>

The power shortage problem in the Pearl River Region remains severe. Other than the supply reliability., we should also need to consider the fuel sources of the generating plants on the Mainland. Pollution in Hong Kong will still be persistent if the sources from the Mainland are not environmental friendly. Also, the readiness of the grid, such as its capacity, technical concerns, etc., on the Mainland to be used for transmitting power to Hong Kong needs to be carefully studied.

(II) <u>Renewable Energy</u>

Land is very crucial to develop renewable energy, e.g. wind power. Also, the output from renewable energy sources should be carefully considered such that they can serve the purpose of the Hong Kong SAR Government and the need of the customers.

(III) Arrangements to Cater New Supply Sources

The Hong Kong SAR Government should provide a more concrete proposal and roadmap on introducing new players to the market in the paper such that the citizens of Hong Kong could be award of the approach taken by the government.

C. Proposed Regulatory Arrangements

(I) <u>Environmental Regulation</u>


There are no clear environmental policies with the emission standards established in Hong Kong. Emission standards should be practical and applicable to all services providers. Furthermore, more details should be provided on the emissions trading scheme to the public. However, it should be made clear that a more environmental friendly power supply will cost more and it is the responsibility of all involved parties to share the additional costs incurred.

(II) <u>Economic Regulation</u>
 Contracts of fuel supply usually last for more than 15 years as capital

commitments involve billions of investment. Therefore, the government should consider a longer duration, say at least 15 years, so that power utilities could established better procurement strategies with their fuel suppliers to reduce the operating expenditure.

(III) Return

The proposed return is unreasonable. In order to attract investment from power utility, the rate of return should be remained 13.5% to 15%.

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

Dear Sir,

In my opinion, reliability of electricity supply is importance in Hong Kong, just like other world-class cities in the world. Hong Kong has changed to a service economy in the recent decade. The commercial and financial sectors rely on a continuous, stable and reliable supply for business operation. Most of the residents in Hong Kong are living in high rise buildings. Continuous electricity supply with minimum and short interruptions, especially emergent power interruption, for the running of service lifts, water pumps and other services is essential for the general household. In addition, reliable electricity supply is also very important to public safety and convenience, like maintaining the proper operations of public road lighting and traffic lights.

Use of electricity is just part of our daily lives. The mechanism to keep the lights on round the clock may be easily taken for granted. The blackouts involved various big cities in the world in recent years remind us again that stable and reliable electricity supply would cause enormous financial losses in economies, and disruption to every aspect of our daily life. Most importantly, it is apparent that a proven regulatory regime would ensure the availability of stable and reliable supply.

Both of the two power companies are investor owned and have been operating for more than 100 years. The current regulatory regime (scheme of control arrangement) has demonstrated its success in terms of stable, reliable and sufficient electricity supply. The key factors that underpin such success, just mention a few are good corporate governance, highly motivated workforce, affordable tariff, reasonable returns to investors and simple regulatory regime.

The proposed regulatory regime should balance the interest of stakeholders, viz. the general public, the employees of the electricity power industry and the shareholders.

Hong Kong is a small place. There is no room laying lots of additional cables and building lots of additional generation, transmission and distribution plants. Introducing of additional operators would not lower the tariff. The costs of investment for new market entrants will eventually be bear by the general public. Hence the interests of customers are undermined due to probable higher tariff level.

Introducing new market entrants cannot improve stability and reliability of electricity supply. Problems in one system will affect the stability of other interconnected systems.

It should be noted that the existing regulatory mechanism is simple and involves few government resource. Establishment of complicated regulatory mechanism would involve substantial costs and in the end the tax-payers have to bear the costs.

I nvestment on electricity power industry is a long term investment with long payback period. The useful life of electrical power plant and equipment for electricity generation and delivery like generators, cables, transformers and switchgear are normally taken as 30 to 35 years. Besides, such investments involve enormous capital investment and therefore involve substantial risks, viz. business risks, interest rates risks, currency risks, and political risks etc. These investments should not be confused with speculations and gambling. Reasonable returns on investments to commensurate with the risks taken by the shareholders are essential to encourage continuous investments to meet new demands and rejuvenate existing plants and equipment to enhance operations and performance.

A stable and reliable electricity supply is also stemmed from well trained, motivated and highly disciplined workforce in the industry. Radical changes on the electricity market would disturb the existing stable working environment and eventually degrade the reliability electricity of supply.

I mport of electricity generated from power plants with high pollution level outside the territory is unwise and unfair to the local power utilities that have invested substantial capital on environmental protection measures.

To conclude, the existing regulatory regime under the Scheme of Control Arrangement has been operating successfully and in a cost effective manner in the past decades. Such arrangement has balanced the interests of the consumers and shareholders of the power utilities. Besides, the simple regulatory mechanism requires less public resources for surveillance and control by government officials. For the interest of the public, such regulatory regime is highly recommended for the post 2008 electricity market.

Dear Sir,

It is referred to the Government Stage II Consultation paper on the future development of the electricity market in Hong Kong.

Since Hong Kong is a most densely populated city with different races, reliability and stability of electricity supply are very important, especially; Hong Kong is a well known international financial centre, any interruption or failure of supply may affect the image of our "Oriental of Pearl" and cause disasters to Hong Kong.

Electricity as we know is a most essential element in our daily life. Now, we have been enjoying a stable and a reliable supply of electricity while comparing with other high risk power outage countries, such as Mainland China and etc.

If government intends to cut the future permitted returns and to change the contract period from 15 years to 10 years as well as to impose a pollution penalties to the Power utility, it will have a great impacts and drawbacks to the public. As the permitted return of 7 to 11 per cent on planned assets is too low and the contract period of 10 years is too short for the capital-intensive industry with long payback duration. The shorten contract period of 10 years will surely bring uncertainties and discourage the investment, but increasing the risk of investment and causing the risk hurting reliability of supply at all.

Moreover, if government really wants to discourage investment in emission reduction facilities by fixing the lowest return rate at 7 per cent and penalize power firms for failing to meet emission targets, it is without doubt unfair and unreasonable. Also, argument will be raised if government complicates the regulatory regime by fixing different return rates on different types of assets. Basically, the return and the cost cannot be separated.

However, I do not think that the electricity charge is so high when compared with other household necessities as gas and transportation charges, as we have already had competitive tariffs in Hong Kong in the past 40 years. It does not mean and guarantee that the charges of electricity can be reduced and a high quality of service can be maintained after market reform; I dare to say market opening may just cause many grey uncertainties.

I realize that Government should vigilantly review and prudently analyze before making market reforming decision. In fact, it is not worthy of making Hong Kong people in such a dangerous position, power market opening is not suitable in Hong Kong. As a result, I would definitely agree and highly support to maintain the current Scheme of Control after 2008.

May I share some of my views to the recommendations published in 'The consultation paper on future development of electricity market in Hong Kong' ?

(A) Deregulation of the Electricity Market

The paper seems not having many discussions on the deregulation of the electricity supply industry and the establishment of a spot electricity market. One of the pioneers in this development is New South Wales State of Australia. The primary requirements, certainly, is the separation of a utility company into power generation and power transmission & distribution businesses.

The advantages of having two different entities are to allow a power company to sell surplus capacity to demanding customers in another distribution grid through the spot market. Because of an open market, the government needs not to guarantee a permitted rate of return with the utility company. The supply grid company owns a free choice to buy the cheapest electric power available from a spot market for their customers, including importing from Mainland China. Such a market force will force a power generating company to phase out inefficient generating units and encourage more investments on cost effective generating units. New business opportunities will also attract the supply grid company to invest more on interconnecting lines with other supply grids.

The spot electricity market will free up not only the market strength of a utility company, but also the public to participate in the supply business if they have a choice in electricity suppliers or a right to sell surplus green power from their own grid-connected renewable energy.

- (B) <u>New Supply Sources</u>
 - 1. Supply from Mainlands

Importing electricity from Mainlands China is a viable option to meet the electricity demands in Hong Kong but the market shares will unlikely to be large as demands in Guangdong provinces will also increase rapidly. A more proactive approach would be new power companies to invest new generating plants in China and export back to Hong Kong through the supply grid of Guangdong if we have a spot electricity market. These are new business opportunities to the power industry once local electricity supply industry becomes deregulated.

2. Renewable Energy

Because of geographic constraints, Hong Kong does not have many renewable sources. If we are to achieve 2% of the electricity coming from renewable sources by 2012, the current scale of investment from both power companies on renewable energies are not too optimistic. Hong Kong needs to attract more investment from private on renewable energies, like solar panels in property developments, in the promotion of renewable energy. We could also expand our use of renewable energy by importing from Mainlands if our electricity market is open.

3. Grid Access

Limitation of access to a supply grid has restricted the sales of electricity to a customer from a third party supply company. It also forbids the development of small scale grid-connected renewable energy to export electric power into the supply grid via a customer own renewable source. Grid-connected solar penal is a mature technology that does not require power storage or modification of the supply grid. All we need is a two ways energy meter and a power socket.

(C) Proposed Regulatory Arrangements

• Hong Kong needs new legislations for the deregulation of the electric supply industry and a green power policy to attract more investments from public.

◆ Unless local power companies are willing to invest more on natural gas for power generation, Hong Kong is unlikely to achieve great improvements on gas emission. In fact, gas emission shall be an environment policy for all industries. Hong Kong needs a long term policy (>15 years) that would encourage the use of low emission fuels for power generations, cooking, transportations, and production. Alternatively, we might consider relocating polluted business at some remote sites and to promote the use of electric power in densely populated areas in all walks of life.

• There shall be a power supply monitoring board to oversee the implementation, safety, and commercial operations of the deregulated electric industry.

Please excuse my ideas in brief. Certainly, there are many regulations and rules that need to be established to protect the interests of the public and investors before we could enjoy a clean city with cheap, reliable, and safe electricity supply. I just hope to share my views with you for building a better Hong Kong.

We refer to the Stage II Consultation Paper and would like to take this opportunity to provide you with our thoughts on the issues affecting future electricity supply in Hong Kong.

We are in agreement with the Hong Kong Government's overall policy objective to continue providing the public with a reliable, safe, and efficient electricity supply at reasonable prices while minimizing environmental impact from the generation and usage of electricity. With this objective in mind, Merrill Lynch would like to share the following specific points regarding electricity supply in Hong Kong:

- 1. Merrill Lynch, as an institution, must continue to have a supply of electricity which is <u>totally</u> <u>reliable</u>. Otherwise, our business will suffer from unacceptable disruptions.
- 2. During recent years, the United States of America witnessed numerous electricity blackouts. The blackouts mentioned below resulted in high costs to cities, impacted many businesses, shut down airports and communications networks, and temporarily debilitated millions of people
 - a. Blackout in the Northeast Region of the United States (August 2003)
 - i. Estimated losses of US\$6 billion to the United States
 - ii. The blackout affected approximately 50 million people. New York City, alone, was without electricity for about 29 hours
 - b Blackout in San Francisco, California (December 2003)
 - i. Estimated losses of US\$400 million to the city of San Francisco
 - ii. The blackout affected nearly 1 million people, and power suppliers needed approximately 30 hours to fully restore electricity supply

As a leading international financial hub, Hong Kong cannot afford to experience similar blackouts. Reliability of Hong Kong's electricity supply is critical for Hong Kong's continued success and economic development.



- 3. To ensure maximum reliability in electricity supplies, the power companies will need to be appropriately rewarded. Given high capital expenditure needs, long maturity contracts (i.e., longer than 10 years) and appropriate returns are necessary for the power companies.
- 4. Merrill Lynch's current electricity costs are affordable. In 2005, Merrill Lynch's expenditure on its Hong Kong electricity supply was only 0.2% of total operating costs. This figure came down from 0.3% of total operating costs in 2003.

Thank you for the opportunity to share our thoughts. Merrill Lynch looks forward to remaining involved as the Hong Kong Government firms up its policy on the future development of the electricity market in Hong Kong.

In response to the Stage II Consultation, we are writing to express our views on a few issues related to the future development of the electricity market in Hong Kong.

As a sound broadcaster in Hong Kong providing round-the-clock radio services to the general public, power supply reliability is crucial to our operation. It is our pledge and core responsibility to provide uninterrupted sound broadcasting service to the community, which indeed is largely dependent on uninterrupted electricity supply.

Reliability, undoubtedly, comes at a price. Sufficient and continuous investment in electricity infrastructure, which depends mostly on the financial incentives offered to the utilities, is the key to achieve reliable power supply. On the other hand, just like any other electricity users, we are naturally concerned with the size of our electricity bill. However, from an operational point of view, electricity bill in fact constitutes a very small portion of our operating costs when compared to other overhead expenses. It is therefore unjustifiable to compromise supply reliability for nominal savings possible from revising the current bilateral Scheme of Control Agreements (SCAs), with particular reference to the rates of return and regulatory period. The SCA regime was proven to have been effective in ensuring reliable and safe electricity supply in Hong Kong while providing flexibility for both the Government and the business operators to respond to market demands over the past forty years. We are, therefore, of the view that the present rate of return offered to the local utilities should be stable and preferably maintained at the current level. Furthermore, a longer-than-10 year regulatory period is considered more conducive to attract investment in Hong Kong.

We hope you could consider our views and keep any changes to the present regulatory regime to an absolute minimum.





Dear Sirs

I fully agreed with the proposed policy objective on ensuring a reliable, safe and efficient electricity supply at reasonable prices and with minimal impact to the environment. Given the situation in Hong Kong which is characterized by high po! pulation density, high urbanization and high-rise buildings, reliability is of paramount important to this World Class City. This was also reflected in the results of Stage I Consultation. In part, this was one of the factors that supported the growth of the Hong Kong economy. Therefore, great care should be taken when changing a system that served well in the past.

For the current consultation paper, I would like to express my views and comments in the followings:

- 1. In future, renewable energy (RE) is expected to play an important role in the energy market. At present, RE does not seem to be an attractive mean of providing electricity because of its economics. Therefore, higher rate of return or incentives to power companies are essential for promoting RE.
- 2. With the same purpose of improving air quality, it is difficult to understand why the facilities aiming to reduce emissions should have lower rate of return. Investment on such emissions reduction facilities should be treated the same way as RE if both of them help improve the air quality in Hong Kong.
- 3. The future regime is proposed to be regulated via a bilateral agreement, similar to the existing scheme of control agreement. However, a 10-year duration for the agreement in the proposed arrangement is considered to be short. Given that electricity supply is a highly capital intensive business with long asset lives and long purchase commitment on fuel, a short duration agreement would lead to high investment uncertainty.
- 4. The government should avoid overregulation because it comes at a cost such as regulator's costs, compliance costs, loss of innovation, dynamic efficiency and other costs due to complex regulation. Regulation should be limited in scope and remain simple.

In the end, I like to point out that a general perception exists among the public. Everybody, if asked, would like the tariff decreased. Commerc! ial firms would like to have their cost of business reduced. However, we should ask ourselves how much of our monthly income is used to pay for electricity bills. Are we not getting reliable services? Imagine the situation in Hong Kong, can we live with sub-standard services? In considering a change of the current regulatory regime, the government should not change for the sake of change. Continuous and steady investment in the electricity market is required as long as population grows, living standards improve and urbanization

continues.

Hong Kong is one of the financial hubs in the world. A secure and reliable supply of electricity is very critical to our economy and society. I am glad that I have enjoyed a very high level of reliability in Hong Kong.

The Government has raised many proposals. Among these proposals, the permitted rate of return and the regulatory period will affect the whole electric power industry. A 7-11% return rate is too low compared to other investment opportunities. It will discourage the power company to further invest in their power facilities.

Dear Sir,

I am a Hong Kong permanent resident and I am very much concerned about the air pollution in Hong Kong some of which is clearly caused by the power stations.

My comments / observations in relation to the Consultation paper on the future development of the electricity market in Hong Kong - Stage II Consultation are;

1. I strongly agree the electricity market should be regulated.

2. I believe the objective of the regulation should be to ensure that Hong Kong has a safe, reliable and sustainable supply of electricity and that whilst the price of the electricity supply is important the emphasis should be on sustainability and in particular the effect on Hong Kong's air quality of current and future emissions from power stations in (or outside Hong Kong) used to supply Hong Kong should be monitored and reduced.

3. The reasons that the emissions should be monitored and reduced and power companies should be financially motivated to invest in renewable energy are twofold;

a. the emission from our power companies effect and contribute to the appalling air quality in Hong Kong; and

b. recognizing that most of the air pollution comes from the mainland we have no chance of persuading the mainland authorities to help us if we can not at least demonstrate that we are getting our own house in order otherwise why should they be bothered to assist us.

4. The power companies are profit driven and we can not reasonable expect them to change their behavior and incur significant capital expenditure if we do not provide them with;

a. Certainty of return – so the new agreements should be for 15 years (if not longer); and

b. Significantly increase the returns they will earn by investing in renewable and less polluting forms of energy production - by significant I mean they get twice the return or higher – I do not have the technical knowledge to tell you exactly how to do this but some form of formula that links the return to the level of pollutants generated from a particular form of energy production would seem to be a sensible starting point. In this regard I support the use of varying returns for different types of assets as outlined in Para 2.58 of the paper but would urge that the difference be significant so as to have a strong economic effect on the power companies bottom line and if this means Hong

Kong has within reason to have more expensive electricity but less locally generated pollution then so be it.

5. Whilst over investment in excess capacity should be guarded against an exception should be in relation to bona fide research and development of renewable energy power generation sources. The reason for this is that the current technology clearly does not allow renewable energy to form a large proportion of output (the current targets are for only 1% - 2% of local power needs by 2012) and significant further research would appear to be needed to make renewable energy a more economically viable proposition.

6. The paper explains that gas fired emissions generate 50% less carbon dioxide than coal – fired generation but other than asking does not explain how the former will be encouraged. Asking is not good enough a proper study needs to be done on the reasons why the power companies need to be asked – has the government done all it can in relation to considering the possible locations of gas storage facilities?

7. The grid access of in house users of renewable energy should be for a nominal charge as should their connection to the main grid for back up purposes.

8. The grid access of suppliers of renewable energy should be on favorable terms if necessary partially subsidized by the government so that the cost of the supply of the resultant electricity is competitive as without the prospect of a economically viable project why would anybody spend the time and effort to generate new supplies based on renewable energy.

9. The inter-connection of the two existing networks should be upgraded as I understand the useful life of the current inter connector is 2011.

10. The government and all the Hong Kong political parties should significantly step up their work with National and provincial government in Guangdong to improve the air quality in the Pearl River delta;

a. this is one instance where political difference should be put aside and everybody should be working together;

b. one major area of focus should be how to introduce some form of polluter pays tax or levy as we all know that a large number of the factories based in Guangdong are Hong Kong owned or controlled and some form of cross border enforcement is long overdue as whilst I think we clearly need to focus on our own electricity companies *we equally need to focus on Hong Kong businesses that operate from Guangdong*,

We are the Hong Kong office of a Japanese supplier and contractor. Our business is closely related to electricity supply and also power supply reliability is critical to our operations. With reference to the web-site of <u>http://www.edlb.gov.hk/edb/eng/papers/electricity/pdf/StageII_CP.pdf</u> dated December, 2005, please find below our views on the future development of the electricity market in Hong Kong:

- We supply reliable equipment and system and therefore we understand how the people's daily life depends on reliable electricity supply. Not long ago, blackouts in the USA, Europe and other parts of the world still marked painful memories to the people affected. We, in HK, enjoyed the highly reliable electricity supply and need not worry. This is a result of the excellent scheme of control agreement between the power companies and the HK government. This excellent scheme is so effective and we see no reason to have a drastic change.
- This high reliability is a result of sufficient and continuous investment in plant and equipment. The incentive comes from fair and reasonable return on investment. After the 2003 blackout in the US, utilities realise that reliability can only be maintained if predictable and sufficient returns are provided to the utilities of which the existing rate is to be maintained.
- The investment of power companies is huge and the project life cycles are long. A project usually needs a long lead time to plan and to build. The asset lives are also very long. Any regulatory period less than 15 years is considered unfair and unreasonable. The paper proposed to reduce the regulatory period to 10 years. It will mean asking the power companies to stop any investment and it will greatly affect the future supply reliability.

Please incorporate our views into your careful consideration and keep the present regulatory framework as little change as possible.

<u>Views/Comments on Stage II Consultation on Future Development of</u> <u>The Electricity Market In Hong Kong</u>

Nowadays, we are enjoying continuous, reliable, safe and stable electricity supply with reasonable electricity tariff for our good living for a long period of time. This high quality and world-class electricity services in Hong Kong have to be maintained after 2008, end of the present SOC.

Investment in electricity generation and transmission facilities for future expansion, environmental protection, improvement of system reliability in fact takes a very long time to get the return back. It requires a huge amount of money and it is a very high-risk business comparing with others. I do not agree to shorten the period of the new agreement proposed by the Government from 15 years to 10 years.

Such a short agreement period imposes a high risk of return to the investor and is not fair. Moreover, this cannot provide a strong power to the investor to pay more on their old or depreciated facilities for system reliability improvement and environmental protection. Consequently, we will suffer from that! I consider that it is reasonable and fair to keep the new agreement period to at least 15 years.

As we all know that pollution in Hong Kong, especially air pollution is very serious in these years. We anticipate that the situation would become much worst if we do not take immediate action to solve this pollution problem. The two power companies in Hong Kong had made every effort and promised to invest on new advanced system technologies and equipment in their generation, transmission and distribution facilities so as to minimize the environmental impact and reduce the pollution levels to acceptable standards.

According to government proposal, the % return for the new environmental improvement facilities by the power company only accounts for 7%. It seems that the government do not encourage the power companies to invest more on environmental protection facilities. It's strange !!

Furthermore, as a high-risk business of long payback period, reasonable rate of return can offer high-level confidence to the power company to invest suitably on their facilities for future growth of electricity demand, environmental protection and system reliability and stability. The permitted rate of return should be sufficient to encourage the power company for long-term investment. I strongly believe that the present rate of return is reasonable and should remain unchanged.

Many people say that the electricity tariff in Hong Kong is very high. Comparing high cost in transportation, town gas and other living expenditure, I think that the electricity tariff is reasonable! Bear in mind that we are now enjoying a high quality, non-stop and stable electricity power supply.

At last, I also think that the government proposal to classify the asset into 4 different rate of returns is not helpful and make things much more complicated. Actually, the Government does not have a clear picture or definition on how to work out this 4-tiered rate of return percentage. Same as the present simple scheme, it is much better to adopt a single ROR for all types of asset in the new agreement instead of different ROR as proposed by the Government.





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

1) 可再生能源

Technically, renewable energy can be developed in Hong Kong only for supplying extremely small amount of energy. Wind power or solar energy will occupy large area, which is not cost effective in Hong Kong. So it can only be developed in China and supply back to Hong Kong or domestic energy use for small amount of demand locally. Other concern is the integration of renewable energy to the power grid. Improper connection to power grid will cause problem. Proper rule / law / regulation shall be produced and strictly follow. Power quality in Hong Kong is very important as a commercial centre. In addition, more incentive to power company can be considered to motivation propose. For the recent proposed location of CLP Power natural gas storage location, as a layman, I don't know whether it is possible to store it underground or under sea which are more safety and save more land. Maybe only the capital cost is higher.

We're now enjoying high quality, high security, customers service with reasonable tariff electricity service in Kowloon (I living in Kowloon). If open market in future or reduce the profit rate, by cost and effect, did the power company still can provide the above mentioned good services at a low-profit status. I'm afraid not. The two companies are now doing it good job. I don't want to change for the sake of change. If really open market, I'm afraid our Hong Kong Government can not handle it and how can our Government / other company governed by Government can run as an Independent System Operator (ISO) just like other country to control and monitoring the open electrically market??? Our Government had no experience about this. And other question is that after open market, is there any responsibilities / rules for the new comers to supply some rural areas which now using only small demand?? It will have large investment including overhead line, underground cabling and also excavation works. From the investor point of view, its really an low / non-profit account, they will only willing to supply large accounts such as container terminals, MTRC, KCRC, large resident areas, etc in which the supply network is really simpler. The two companies now have the responsibility to supply those rural areas (low or non-profit accounts) with no choice as I know.

Regarding the interconnection, I knew that CLP Power already have interconnection with China. But is it possible to have interconnection with HEC with submarine cables across the harbour or inside the existing tunnels? It will be more competitive with HEC if CLP Power can jump into the electricity market in Hong Kong Island.

And other concern is the environmental problem, once the market was opened, the transmission and distribution system are really difficulty to share or open. The only possible in Hong Kong is the alternative supply sources, that is the new generators. And the only possible area for investor to install new generators is China. The main problem is that the environmental control of new generators in China cannot be directly control by the Hong Kong Government. But the exhaust air from generators will directly affect us. All we know Hong Kong citizens already suffering from the poor air quality. Therefore, if open market is considered, regulation / rule regarding this issues shall also be considered.



Basically I opposes the proposed period of new SOC. It's because the period of the new SOC is too short. Very often, the asset life cycle of power system related equipment is very long, say 20 years or even more. If each review period only consists of 10 years, then power utilities will not be willing to invest on the facilities since there are many uncertainties and risks for the future. This is unbeneficial to citizens since under-investment will affect the supply reliability of electricity. To be more reasonable, I think the period should be at least 15 years.

Currently both power companies supplying electricity to Hong Kong do a fantastic job and I am happy with services they provided. From their annual reports, both companies have attained supply reliability exceeding 99.99%.

Even there is no franchised supply areas for power companies, customers would know which power company is responsibility if there is power interruption. Once a third party granted access to the power grid, the responsibility of electricity supply will become blur and adequate and reliable electricity supply would not be ensured.

Additional players in the electricity supply services will need duplicate infrastructure that make the supply services more expensive, and introduce addition waste of resources, and extra costs due to third party grid access would also pass to customers via the tariff.

Hong Kong Electricity market is very small comparing with other open electricity market countries. Open grid access will need large amount of moncy to setup regulator agents and operation authorities. Finally, these costs will also pass to customers.

Third party grid access will require co-operation among current power companies in both Hong Kong and Mainland China, because they are competition in nature and they would not be co-operate easily. Eventually, this will lead to substandard supply services.

Finally, I would like to point out that the current electricity supply services are in excellent shape. It would not be a good idea to break up the current electricity services, introduce third part grid access and stirred up uncertainly in the industry. Finally, there will be more power interruptions.

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

Future Development of The Electricity Market in Hong Kong (Stage II Consultation)

Dear Mr. Ip,

With reference to your stage II consultation on the future development of the electricity market in Hong Kong, I would like to take this opportunity to express my personal views on this subject.

I am in IT profession and my company provides innovative IT and telecommunication network infrastructure to our clients. A reliable electricity supply is one of the key factors allowing my company to stay successful in the business. In my view, a reliable electricity supply comes from the continuous investment by the power companies in Hong Kong. Under the present Scheme Of Control Agreement (SCA), the two power companies in Hong Kong provide us a stable and reliable electricity supply at reasonable costs. Hence, I trust that the current regulatory regime balances the interests between the customers and the power companies.

After reading your consultation paper, I feel that the proposed 7-11% return is much lower than the current return of 13.5%. Lowering the rate of return to this level is considered unattractive from investor viewpoint for continuous investment to maintain a reliable electricity system in Hong Kong. Besides, shortening the regulatory period to 10 years will also increase the investment risks. I am afraid that the 10-year regulatory period and the 7-11% rate of return will discourage investment from the power companies in the electricity supply infrastructure in Hong Kong. Without adequate investment in the electricity supply infrastructure, the reliability of electricity supply in Hong Kong will deteriorate. Also, this would have severe impact on the economy of Hong Kong. Frankly speaking, the reliability of supply cannot be

compromised and I don't mind to pay more in order to enjoy the quality of electricity supply services presently provided by the power companies.

I urge the Government to maintain the present regulatory system after 2008 so that sufficient incentives can be provided to the investors for continuous investment in the electricity supply infrastructure to ensure reliability of electricity supply.

I would like to express my opinion about encouraging the power companies to adopt renewable energy and allow grid connection of renewable energy installations:

(1) I agree that mechanisims should be designed to encourage the power companies to generate some of its electricity from renewable energy sources.

(2) Although the renewable energy resources are limited in Hong Kong, due to its limited land or sea area, we should endeavour to exploit the local renewable energy resources first, before utilizing the renewable energy resources of other places.

(3) In this connection, the power companies should be obliged to allow and facilitate connection of renewable energy installations to their electricity grids, whether such installations are big or small.

The power companies should remove all their impediments to grid connection, and more than that, should readily allow renewable energy installations to connect to their grids and to readily adjust their networks to suit such connections without charging the applicant for such adjustments. Hong Kong allows the power companies to supply electricity to the citizens and to make money out of it, the power companies should naturally allow citizens or companies to connect renewable energy installations to their grids with ease. (4) The power companies should be obliged to buy the electricity generated by such installations with net-metering. As explained above, the available renewable energy resources are limited in Hong Kong and so net-metering will have small impact on the power systems even if such limited resources are all exploited.

(5) For small renewable energy installations generating electricity of up to a fraction of the site's demand, a simplifed procedure should be designed to allow operation of such intallations in parallel with the grid. For example, if an ordinary household wants to install just a few hundred watts of photovoltaic panel, the applicant should only need to fill in a simple form, signed by a qualified electrician, in order to connect the panel to the house wiring, without having to sign the lengthy and complex agreement or to be involved in difficult technical discussions with power company's engineers.

(6) The power companies should be allowed to "import" renewable source electricity ONLY AFTER having exploited the resources in Hong Kong. Even for imported renewable source electricity, the requirement should be that the renewable energy power station (e.g. wind farm) should be DIRECTLY connected to the Hong Kong grid through dedicated transmission lines. We should not allow the renewable energy power station to inject power into the Mainland grid and claim that the power is carried to Hong Kong through the grid ties. That is nonsense. If that is permissible, then we can allow the power companies to "buy" renewable source electricity from a great distance away, say, Xin Jian. Furthermore, the power company should demonstrate that it is NOT taking the prime sites of, say, Guangdong. Guangdong or anywhere else also has its need for renewble energy. We should not take away other's prime resources. We can, say, build offshore wind farm just outside Hong Kong waters and bring the electricity to Hong Kong, but we should not build wind farms at locations that Guangdong itself also has a strong interest in. (7) Finally, I strongly support what is said in the consultation document about renewable energy and about grid connection, and wish that my comments above will be incorporated to augment the proposals.

I would like to express my opinion about importing renewable energy from Mainland.

In the case of electricity import from conventional generation sources, the amount of electricity import can be SCHEDULED some time ahead, say one day.

In the case of, say, wind farm in Mainland, we CANNOT schedule the amount of electricity to be generated. We cannot "wheel" the power from the wind farm through the Mainland grid to Hong Kong. The output of a wind farm all depends on the wind. The output fluctuates greatly, from 90% in one moment to 10% in the next. It is impossible to import 90% in one moment and 10% in the next, through the Mainland grid. The control system of the tie-line doesn't allow that. Therefore, it is necessary that the wind farm be connected DIRECTLY to the Hong Kong grid through its own transmission line.

The notion of building a wind farm in Mainland, injecting the output energy into the Mainland grid, and import an equal amount of kWh from the Mainland grid some time later, is ridiculous. The power does not match in real time. So, what we are importing is stable electricity, that means fossil-based electricity. We inject clean electricity into the Mainland and import dirty electricity back!

Furthermore, the Mainland grid has to absorb all the fluctuating changes in the power output from the wind farm, and their generating plants must backup the fluctuations in real-time. If the wind farm output increases by 50MW in one moment, the generating plants in the Mainland must reduce output by 50MW, and vice versa. The tie-line exchange between Hong Kong and the Mainland cannot react in the way like the generating plants in the Mainland. So, our grid has to do nothing at all. This is ridiculous.

The conclusion is that if we really want to import wind farm electricity, the wind farm must be directly connected to the Hong Kong grid through its own transmisison line. Thanks.

Suggestions concerning Hong Kong Electric's Management Plan Agreement

I, Kar Shun Kan, have lived in Hong Kong for forty years. I witness Hong Kong's transformation from poverty to prosperity. To keep up with current standards, quality and stable electricity supply is needed. It is hard to imagine what Hong Kong will be if no electricity is supplied to hospitals, exchange squares and the MTR etc. The consequences may be disastrous. At present, electricity expenses are economical compared to town gas, management fee and transportation expenses etc. In addition, Hong Kong's economy is recovering. To maintain Hong Kong Electric's profit control standards until 2008 is a wise step. This is because Hong Kong will remain one of the best places for investment from international perspectives. Nowadays, in the electrical transmission and distribution facilities, the investment normally requires over billions of dollars. Such facilities have been applied in Hong Kong for more than three decades. Hong Kong Electric demonstrates full confidence in the government and her intention to serve local citizens. If the contract period is below 15 years, it will not be fair, contradicting with Hong Kong rules of investment.

In the asset classification, this is impractical. Say, environmental asset part which return is lower. While everybody is fulfilling environmental responsibilities, returns have been lowered. This is directly opposite to what has been expected. Unless the government encourages Hong Kong's electrical suppliers to increase investment on environmentally protective facilities, this situation cannot be improved.

It is self-deception if you believe you can protect the environment without raising electricity expenses.

Concerning approved returns, I puzzled how it falls between 7% to 11%. I suspect the government may be under the pressure of political parties. They always criticize about every move of the government and want to deduce the electricity prices. I sincerely hope that the government will emphasize on the stability of the society and not amending government policies for the sake of merely amending policies themselves. Local citizens will suffer in this way.

I conclude that 1) maintain 15 years contract period to power utility company; 2) increase asset investment return to encourage application of environmental electrical facilities; 3) permitted returns should not be lowered than 13.5%.


The proposed 7-11% permitted rate of return is too low and the 10-year regulatory period too short to attract the two power companies to invest huge capital in their electricity supply systems.

- vi. to adjust the rate of permitted return every 5 years just turns the bilateral agreement a much shorter and more uncertain contractual arrangement. – There can be a backlog quickly of disputes between Government and the power companies as there are too many reopeners during the term of the contract
- vii. differential rates of return for different parts (e.g. power generation vs. emission reduction) of the business do not make sense as both of them are equally important.

Also, the contractual period of 15 years is acceptable since it would warrant the long term capital investment to sustain the growth of electricity demand.



- 1. Electricity supply reliability is the most important element that maintains the prosperity and safe living of HKSAR. While we are able to afford the electricity tariff which is only a small part of our expenses, I do not want to have any reduction of supply reliability as a result of the change of the electricity market. There were many blackouts occurred overseas in the de-regulated markets, and rolling supply interruption in Guangdong. There must be many problems in the de-regulated markets and insufficient electricity equipment in Guangdong. Therefore I fully support to maintain the system of the current Scheme of Control. I do not support opening the electricity market. And HKSAR should have sufficient generation sources that under our control for our own use not to rely on others.
- 2. I support to adopt a fixed asset approach using ANFA as the base because it provides incentives for investment in the electricity infrastructure. With reference to the above consultation paper, I would like to express my views as follows:

1. <u>Reliable electricity supply</u>

Being a world financial centre and a densely populated modern city, reliable, safe and efficient electricity supply is of paramount importance to all of us. As such, sufficient incentive should be given to power companies to invest adequately in electricity infrastructure so as to ensure uninterrupted power supply. To rely on the Mainland for electricity supply is absolutely unrealistic as there are frequent power shortages and/or interruptions in most of the provinces. In fact, CLPP is currently supplying huge amount of electricity to Guangdong areas and I wonder how the latter can export power to Hong Kong.

2. <u>Rate of Return (7% - 11%)</u>

The proposed ROR cannot give sufficient incentive to power companies to invest adequately in electricity infrastructure which may lead to power shortage and degradation of supply reliability. Given the highly reliable power supply and excellent customer services, I consider the current electricity tariffs are reasonable and affordable by the majority especially when compared with other modern cities.

3. <u>10-year Regulatory Period</u>

A short regulatory period may discourage power companies from investing 17 13 14 the electricity infrastructure as it is very capital intensive and takes a long time 11/1/15 for cost recovery. I consider that the present regulatory period of 15 years should be maintained. In conclusion, the present arrangements in the SCA regime have been proved to be successful and cost-effective and I would strongly recommend to keep any changes to the present regulatory regime to an absolute minimum.

On the Consultation Paper:

- (i) I am supportive of the current SCA-type of arrangement or similar bilateral agreement, using an asset base for calculating return.
- (ii) Reliability and safety of electricity supply is of paramount importance and should continue to be the primary objective for the future development of the electricity market.
- (iii) I agree to importing electricity from the Mainland if:
 - a. the Mainland power companies agree to use environmentally friendly fuel to generate electricity for HK but then how does the HK Government police the activities of these Mainland companies? Even if they use clean fuel for HK, how can we stop them from burning dirty fuel for power generation for the Guangdong consumers? If so, HK will be badly affected by more pollution from the Mainland.
 - b. the Mainland power companies are governed by the same regulatory framework as the two power companies, otherwise it would not be fair to the power companies who have served HK well for many years.
 - c. the Mainland power companies can guarantee the same reliability of electricity supply to which we have been accustomed – at least 99.99% reliability.
 - d. bringing in competition would result in cheaper electricity prices for HK consumers lower prices not just for a few months to attract customers, but long term.
- (iv) I am generally supportive of measures to protect the environment, particularly the introduction of renewable energy, but not if it costs a fortune to build, generates little power and spoils the natural beauty of our countryside. I am also concerned that some consumers will have to subsidize the electricity charges of others whose electricity is generated by renewable energy (eg Mongkok consumers subsidizing the cost of producing electricity for consumers in Tseung Kwan O whose electricity is generated using wind). The huge cost may not justify the minimal improvement to the environment.
- (v) To improve our environment, Government should encourage the use of natural gas by the power companies. But if CLP Power's gas field is drying up, then something has to be done quickly. They say that they want to build an LNG terminal and are waiting approval from the Government. Please sort this out with them quickly, so that they can burn more gas. At present, it would be irresponsible for them to switch to coal knowing that their gas field is depleting. Realistically, they need a balanced fuel mix to avoid blackouts, as do all power companies.

- (vi) If we accept that improving the environment is important, then we should not punish the companies for installing emission reduction facilities by cutting their returns. Nor does it make sense to reduce the contractual period to 10 years, if the idea is to encourage them to invest in equipment to maintain reliability of supply to HK and to help cut emissions. Fifteen years is not too long if we are talking about millions or billions of investments. Without the knowledge that they can recoup the outlay or earn a reasonable return, why would they invest.
- (vii) My electricity charges account for less than 2% of my monthly income. Are tariff levels too high? I cannot honestly say "yes" because I am not greedy. I am content with the current tariff levels and the companies' permitted return. They are there to make a decent profit, not run a charity.

I understand that the Government is under immense pressure from the politicians and green groups (many of whom are more keen to win publicity/votes than dealing with the matter rationally) to drastically modify the SCA, to demonstrate that the Government is in control. HK seems to have developed a culture, on the one hand, of shooting companies with high performance, and on the other, dishing out benefits to those who least deserve them.

On this issue, the Government should be sufficiently bold to act rationally and consider carefully whether the stated Policy Objective would be achieved by implementing the proposals referred to in the Consultation Paper. I seriously doubt that.

I do have one point to say about the Stage II Consultation Paper on Electricity Market of Hong Kong. Lots of people would comment on tariff control, control on electricity companies' rate of return and so forth. There bound to be pros and cons for each suggestion, depending whether one is looking at the whole from from consumers' point of view or investors' point of view. There is literally no right or wrong. However, I found that two suggestions in the Paper which are quite good, at least they are fair to both consumers and investors and they reduce some kind of external dependencies when determining tariff price. The first one is setting up of a Fuel Clause Account with fuel cost borne bv consumers. No one wants to bear the cost of a product but it cannot be avoided. In order to stabilise tariff, such reserve can be used at the time of high oil price. When oil price is lower than the price charged by electricity companies to consumers, the surplus can be added to the reserve. This is a smart move. Secondly, setting up of a Tariff Stabilisation Fund with a cap and a mechanism to return monies in excess of the cap to consumers is another qood measure to further stabilise tariff, making it a win-win situation for both the consumers and electricity companies in long run. I strongly advise HKSAR government to help setting up these two funds with the two electricity companies and the usage of the funds are to be monitored

by the Government.




On the Stage II Consultation, I just wish to Government and the public to be realistic about the whole situation. Introduction of renewable energy will reduce emissions but because it is an unreliable energy source, the power companies will still have to maintain backup supply so ended up, we will have to duplicate resources and the cost will then be passed through to us.  $\Upsilon\Pi$ The deployment of RE should be encouraged but these projects must be considered in a practical and economical manner. The output from RE may at best amount to about 1-2% of existing generating capacity. Further the Government should also recognize that the construction and operation of any renewable energy source in our countryside will also destroy our natural environment.

YΠ Hong Kong has to accept the reality that the potential of meaningful RE in Hong Kong is very limited. Pushing RE regardless of economic or practical factors may lead to unnecessary cost to consumers.

ΥΠ Clearer policy on RE for each RE source should be given by Government.

(III) Arrangement to Cater for New Supply Sources

YΠ Learning from the experience of the US blackout, I am not in favour of opening grid access unless a clear, co-ordinated roll-out plan has been established and agreed between grid owners, power companies, new suppliers and Guangdong Government. To be successful, this arrangement will require careful planning to ensure clear allocation of responsibilities, a high degree of co-ordination and strong supervision.

Part C Proposed Regulatory Arrangements

(I) Safety Regulation

No comment.

(II) Environmental Regulation

 $\Upsilon\Pi$ Emissions are a consequence of public demand for electricity so I am not in favour of giving a lower return for emission control investment as a penalty against power companies. Instead, power companies should be given a higher return rate so that they will be encouraged to install more emission control devices to protect the environment. As a consumer, I will be willing to pay more for better air quality.

 $\Upsilon\Pi$ In addition to the power industry, I think emission control regulations should also be tightened for other industries. Emission caps should be applied to the transport sector especially on buses and ferries. Government should also consider granting tax incentive for the importation of environmental friendly cars.

 $\Upsilon\Pi$ I have reservations on the proposed linking of emission performance to return. If power companies are forced to shut down some of their stations in order to meet the emission caps causing blackouts in Hong Kong, the consequences will be very serious.

(III) Economic Regulation

 $\Upsilon\Pi$ Government ought to recognize the long-term investment time horizon for power generation and transmission assets. If the duration for the next term is 10 years plus 5 more at the option of the Government, it will be too short and may prevent the power companies from continuing to make necessary investments.

 $\Upsilon\Pi$ Any incoming electricity player must come into play with the same legal and regulatory framework to create a level playing field. There should be statutory fitness criteria for all power companies operating in Hong Kong.

 $\Upsilon\Pi$ The current tariff level is affordable and I am opposed to lowering tariff at the expense of reliability and the environment.

 $\Upsilon\Pi$ The differential rate of return is not easy to understand and it would be helpful if the Government could explain the logic behind it. The consequence of this proposed return arrangement may be against consumers' interests because power companies may focus more on projects that will give them the highest return. I would therefore prefer a uniform return rate for all types of assets with further incentive for investment in emission control equipment.

(IV) Institutional Setup

The existing set up has served Hong Kong well and should continue.

<u>Views on Future Development in the Electricity Market in Hong Kong</u> <u>Stage II Consultation</u>

Policy Objective

I agree with the Policy Objective to ensure that the public can continue to enjoy reliable, safe and efficient energy supplies at reasonable prices, and to minimize the environmental impact caused by the production and use of energy.

Bearing in mind this objective, the policy should not result in lowering the present high standard of safety, security and reliability of electricity supply.

New Supply Sources

Currently, it is a common understanding that the security and reliability of power supply from Mainland is in doubt. Connecting an unreliable supply to the existing highly reliable grid will only downgrade the quality of our existing electricity system. It will be too aggressive to consider using power supply from Mainland at this stage.

In addition, un-controlled granting of grid access to new supply source will create similar problem and therefore careful consideration shall be made before putting in action.

If RE is to be pursuit, it is preferable to rely on the existing two power companies who have proven record in HK rather than any new comer.

Proposed Regulatory Arrangements

Sustaining the safety and environmental standard are important. The government should continue to work closely with the power companies to ensure safety, minimize emission and improve in environment protection. To do so, the cost of electricity generation will inevitably be increased, either due to increased capital investment for emission reduction facilities or the use of more expensive natural gas as fuel. However, the newly proposed rate of return scheme is discouraging this kind of investment (granting lowest return). It is difficult for people to understand the rationale behind. The proposed rate of return (7-11%) is a drastic cut from the existing 13.5%. It is highly recommend that the government should negotiate with the power companies to reach a mutually acceptable rate of return. Otherwise, the power companies may feel losing the incentive to continue investing in the power supply system and ultimately result in unreliable power supply or even power shortage.

Moreover, as the power business is a capital-intensive investment, I doubt the advantage of shortening the agreement period from 15 years to 10 years. If the agreement period is shorten to 10 years, the only choice for the power company is to get their money back in that period. i.e. the electrical tariff will increase rather than decrease.

Current electricity expense only cost 2% of our general household monthly expenses, which is only a minimal portion compared with other expenses like transport, gas, water, etc. With current price, we enjoy excellent reliability and security, why do we need to risk our electricity supply for a small amount of money every month?

I believe that Government should aim at providing a stable and prosperous environment for the citizen instead of creating uncertainty.

I strongly disagree on the proposed new Scheme-Of-Control Agreement on electricity policy. The new Scheme-Of-Control agreement has reduced the incentives for the power business to invest on their capital assets with a view to provide the reliable electricity supply. It will affect Hong Kong in the following ways:

- 1. Most Hong Kong citizens are living at high-rise whose lives heavily depend on electricity escalators, water supply, refrigerator, etc. If we do not have a reliable electricity supply in Hong Kong, we will suffer from poor hygiene problem if there is any accidental black-out. With the probable invasion of avian flu worldwide, the poor hygiene environment in Hong Kong will be a very good place to spread out the disease.
- 2. Hong Kong is a famous commercial centre in South East Asia and one of the gateways to China. Hong Kong's success is attributable to the best corporate governance and logistic support among the China's cities. Reliable electricity supply is one of the key factors of the logistic support for companies in Hong Kong. If the Hong Kong Government and citizens are so myopic and selfish and only considered their short-term or microscopic benefits, fighting to death to lower the electricity tariff in Hong Kong, Hong Kong will lose her competitive advantage over other China's cities. The result is catastrophic and businesses will move their offices to other cities, and eventually our GDP decreases, leading us to recession.
- 3. The proposed Scheme-Of-Control agreement represents a doublepenalty system: the government will penalize power companies for not moving towards renewable power, by reducing their rate of return, then fine them if they do not meet emissions targets. This is an unnecessary burden on business and goes against international best practices, which rests on market-based solutions. This act will also deter other businesses from investing in Hong Kong.

As such, I think the proposed new Scheme-Of-Control Agreement on electricity policy has the following shortcomings:

- 1. 7%-11% rate of return is too low
- 2. the 10 year contract term is too short
- 3. the double-penalty system is against the international best practice
- 4. calculation of variable rate of return based on different asset is inapplicable and costly

Being a Hong Kong citizen living on Hong Kong Island and a business owner in Hong Kong, I am fully satisfied with the present Scheme-Of-Control Agreement and the world-class electricity supply in Hong Kong which provides us a comfortable and secured living environment.

I am therefore writing to express my point of view and would like the Government to think carefully before working out the final Scheme-Of-Control Agreement and take every prudent measure to safeguard the benefit of the Hong Kong economy.

I refer to the stage II consultation and has only one comment.

I agree that SCA is going to stay to suit the importance of electricity in Hong Kong. What I don't agree is the idea that lowering the Rate of Return is going to benefit Hong Kong and the customer.

As pointed by many people, lowering the ROR is not equal to lowering the tariff.

Taking the reality of the existance of the two power companies as commercial operation into consideration. Their existance is to make profit and they can afford to hire the most knowledgeable group of people who know the electricity industry in the Hong Kong context inside out. Their explicit objective is to maximize share holders value, not maximizing tariff.

Based on SCA with given ROR and with unlimited power to raise tariff, they would do all their best to bargain with the authority to approve the increase in profit by increasing asset and resist all pressure from the authority to reduce the rate of increase of overall asset, even when there are obvious reason between the time of approval of the plan and change in environment. The over built of Black Point Power Station is an obvious example.

Based on the same balance of power between the regulator and the regulated, the same tuck-of-war will continue. However, there are always other means to increase the power companies profit other than raising tariff. Take for example, if the ROR is going to increase 0.1% per year for the next 15 years from its current value of 13.5%. If the power company is satisfied with increase in profit of 11% in the next 15 years (from 13.5% to 15%), all they have to do is to spend just sufficient investment that can off-set the aging of the asset and compensate the asset reduction due to depreciation. If the load of Hong Kong is not growing, then we are going to enjoy the same level of supply reliability as the additional capital expenditure should off-set the aging effect and keep the assets in their current state. In this way, there is no need to increase tariff at all for the next 15 years, yet the power companies get what they want. The consumers also gain as the tariff will remain the same for 15 years. Hong Kong gain by spending the least in importing electrical equipment.

Then take the example of keep the ROR at its current level, and if the power company wish to have 11% increase in profit in the next 15 years, they have to increase the asset base by 11% by all means and I'm sure given the market power and talent pool of the private undertaking, they will ultimately get it. Based on the same no growth scenario, the tariff has to increase by 11% and in return, the consumer will be given something better for the extra 11% tariff increase. What's more, Hong Kong as a whole has to spend more (import more from other country) in order to meet the extra expenditure of the two power companies. There is an extra outflow of hard earn money for Hong Kong for something which we are already having the best. It is now clear that by reducing the ROR, and if the power company is going to finally get 11% increase in profit in 15 years, the asset has to increase more than 11% just to offset the reduction in ROR The tariff has to increase by 11% and Hong Kong has to spend an even larger amount of money to other country to get an even better quality of electricity. A lose-lose-lose situation for all parties.


The above analysis is base on the same level of talent between the regulator and the regulated. If in the past 45 years of SCA the balance of power between the regulator and the regulated has produced the Black Point Power Station case, why should the regulator thinks that there will be a big shift in the balance of power to stop the last scenario from occurring?

Increasing the ROR is suiciding for the Government but will not hurt anyone in real term. Reducing ROR is taking poison for Hong Kong. Perhaps the final solution is a compromise of reducing ROR, say, 0.1% per year for the next 15 years with the option that in the mid-term review the rate of reduction or rate of increase can be +/- 0.1%.

I am an administrative personnel working in a reputable private medical associates in Hong Kong. Everyday, my office needs a constant electricity supply to support the function of air-conditioning, lightning, heating facilities and a lot of electric appliances. I believe that your proposals on shortening the regulatory duration and reducing the rate of return to 7-11% in the post-2008 regulatory regime are the major obstacles in reaching a successful agreement with the power companies. I consider that your proposed 7-11% permitted rate of return is too low and cannot lead to sufficient investment in the electricity infrastructure after 2008. Besides, shortening the regulatory duration to 10 years will also increase the investment risks borne by the power companies and discourage them form investing in the electricity

infrastructure in the long term. This implies that the overall electricity supply reliability will be downgraded as a result of insufficient investment.







After reading the Paper on "Future Development of the Electricity Market in Hong Kong: Stage II Consultation", I would like to comment as follows:

1. Most of the viewpoints received from Stage I consultation indicates that reliability and safety of electricity supply are of paramount importance. Therefore, Government must be very careful with the issue "New Supply Sources from the Mainland".

2. Due to the rapid economic growth of Guangdong, the tight electricity supply situation in Guangdong will continue. We cannot rely on new supply sources from the Guangdong which has power shortage as it will jeopardize the supply reliability in Hong Kong.

3. If Hong Kong imports electricity from Mainland China, I can't imagine what will happen in case of operating problems or disputes. The responsibility to ensure reliability and safety of electricity supply will be blurred.

4. To cope with the tight electricity supply situation in Guangdong, there is a lot of highly polluting small thermal power plants with low efficiency, which are still generating electric power in Guangdong. In response to the Government Stage II consultation process, I, the undersigned, would like to put forward my opinion and comment as a sharehelder of CLP fieldings for your kind consideration.

While fully agree with the Government's objectives of providing a sage, reliable supply of electricity at reasonable cost with low environmental pollution, there are certain areas in the proposal that I find it impossible to agree:

1. The Return of 7-118 is too low and the duration of the Hegime of 10 years is too shore

In my opinion the Government should carefully discuss with CLr Soldings se as to determine what level of pollution is desirable, commensurate with the cost and thereby surike a balance between these two factors rather than fixing a penalty cause, without giving the reasons for such stipulation and without discussion with CLr fieldings.

 The interests of the shareholders, the stake holder (Excen, USA) and the employees of CLP holdings should be protected.



I am writing to give my view on the Stage II Consultation on Future Development of Electricity Market in Hong Kong. My main concern is the seemingly optimisstic view on the Mainland's electricity supply.

From news available to general public, the demand for electricity in Mainland China has been increasing drastically on a year-to-year basis but the supply has not been increased in the scale comparable with the demand, resulting in shortages in some of the areas. Even electricity rationing had to be introduced in some area. Even the government in Mainland China cannot provide a definite answer as to when the shortage can be overcome. Even when they say they can overcome the problem, there is no implication that they would have abundant supply that they can export to Hong Kong, as already stated in your consultation paper.

If Hong Kong is to open up the power grid (i.e. the transmission & distribution network) to "transmit" these imported electricity, who is going to be responsible for the reliability of the supply? Is it the problem with the transmission, or the problem of the supply generator, or both? Right now I have the convenience of just going to the 2 power companies to have all my electricity problem fixed. Would it be alot of redirection, "hands-off" situation later if one company is to generate the supply, another to transmit? One can easily imagine how difficult the situation could be if the source! of supply is in Mainland China! Even if "single point of contact" is still maintained with the power companies, segregation of duty would certain lengthen the time to identify the cause of problem, complicate the problem solving procedure, hence higher administrative cost which would definitely be transpose to end consumers.

I therefore strongly against opening up the electricity's power grid to third parties just for the sake of introducing competition.




After reading the consultation paper on the captioned subject, I would like to express some views on it.

I share the same view with the government that reliability and safety of electricity supply should continue to be the primary objective for the future development of the electricity market. I also support the Government of using a similar bilateral agreement and an asset based approach for calculating return in the future.


I fully comprehend the necessity of long-term investment in power industry to a high standard of supply reliability exceeding 99.99% in Hong Kong. As it is a fact that the power industry is capital intensive requiring long lead time for planning and long payback period, I afraid that the proposed regulatory period of only ten years is too short to ensure any long-term investment in the industry. Moreover, I have grave concern over the proposed post-2008 permitted rate of return in a range of 7-11% is too low to attract sufficient investment in the power industry. Insufficient investment will definitely undermine the reliability of electricity supply.

Frankly, I consider that the quality of power supply and services provided by the power companies is worth more than what I am paying now. In addition, I think that the current regulatory regime has been functioning satisfactorily and the Government has been successfully monitoring the two power companies. Therefore, I am not looking forward to any changes in the up-coming regulatory regime.

As reliable power supply is vital to Hong Kong for staying competitive and prospering in the future, I request the Government to stick to the current regulatory period of 15 years and the present permitted rate of return.

Stage II Consultation on Future Development of the Electricity Market in Hong Kong

I refer to the captioned consultation and would like to offer my views and comments on the Consultation Paper as follows: -

A. Policy Objective

The policy objective stated in the Consultation Paper is supported.

B. New Supply Sources

(I) Supply from the Mainland

Agree with the recommendations in the Consultation Paper. However, it is necessary to ensure the new supply sources are operating to similar environmental standards as that in Hong Kong.

(II) <u>Renewable Energy (RE)</u>

Agree with the recommendations in the Consultation Paper. However, the financial incentives must be attractive to the investment on the RE generations and grid access permission.

(III) Arrangement to Cater for New Supply Sources

(i) Grid Access

The proposal in the part of facilitating RE supply sources for use in Hong Kong is supported. Grid access to other less environmental friendly supply sources is not agreed.

(ii) Increase Interconnection

The increased interconnection must not jeopardize the supply reliability of the existing power systems.

C. Proposed Regulatory Arrangement

(I) <u>Safety Regulation</u>

Agree with the proposal in the Consultation Paper as safety of electricity is extremely important to the residents of Hong Kong.

(II) Environmental Regulation

The direction stated in the Consultation Paper is supported. However, the Government must work closely with the power companies to achieve the environmental targets. A clear energy policy with a clear roadmap must be established in order to take us there.

- (III) Economic Regulation
 - (i) Regulatory Instrument

Support to continue with a similar bilateral agreement to regulate the operations of the power companies upon expiry of the current SCA. 15 years is appropriate for the duration of the agreement based on the past operating experience. A stable permitted rate of return should also be maintained as far as possible to provide a stable regulatory environment to facilitate long-term investments and a stable tariff.

(ii) Return

Agree to continue to adopt a fixed asset approach using ANFA as the base to provide the necessary incentives for the power companies. However, I do not agree the permitted rate of return be in the range of 7% to 11% as supply reliability is inter-related among the connected assets. The current rate of return is also considered appropriate when comparing with other major Companies in Hong Kong. A simple operating mechanism is essential and has been proved effective to minimize overall costs, therefore performance base applying to the permitted rate of return is not supported.

(iii) Tariff

The proposal in the part of tariff setting is supported. However, the tariff review and approval process must be transparent to the power companies. Mechanism must be in place for the power companies to appeal to the highest authorities for major differences.

(IV) Institutional Setup

Agree with the recommendations in the Consultation Paper.

<u>Response to Consultation Paper –</u> Future Development of the Electricity Market in Hong Kong Stage II Consultation

We are pleased to respond to the Consultation Paper issued in December 2005 and will endeavor to contribute to the success of the future electricity industry in Hong Kong. Here are our views and comments on the Paper:

- 1. We agree with the Government's primary energy policy objective of ensuring that the public will enjoy reliable, safe and efficient energy supplies at reasonable prices and with minimal environmental impact.
- 2. We support a new SOC as an interim measure which could result in a reduction of tariff rates for consumers. The new SOC should also provide flexibility so to allow electricity suppliers to offer larger discount to large scale users. This will help them to become more competitive under the threat of new entrants.
- 3. We agree that competition between the incumbents and new entrants is a policy to be encouraged by the Government. Furthermore we suggest that the timescale for this objective should be left to the market. We expect this could be achieved before 2018, and that the Government should devise a new regulatory framework in the next three years to allow market competition and open access.
- 4. We consider it is essential that the Government should delineate the necessary policy, specifications, standards and access processes for the competition within the next three years. However, the Government should not be too concerned with the constraints and technical difficulties of the supply from the mainland as these are commercial issues for prospective new entrants to manage.

- 5. We suggest that standards for environmental emissions as prescribed by the Government should be met without passing the costs onto the consumer.
- 6. We suggest that incentives for RE and environmentally-friendly energy generation need to be made to the community and to business. Incentives will encourage consumers to seek for distributed power supplies and local consumption; and for incumbents and grid operators to accommodate and include this as part of the plan.
- 7. We recommend that the proposed limit of 200kW should be raised to a range of around 10MW. In particular we consider that the regulatory framework for RE, and environmentally-friendly suppliers of energy up to 10MW per installation, should also be supported by the regulatory framework for grid access developed to coincide with the proposed new SOC.
- 8. We suggest that the Government should devise an explicit framework as soon as possible to allow competition to start should new entrants wish to enter the market by providing their own small-scale grids. Although there will be no immediate full-scale competition under the proposed new SOC, some competition will emerge during the time when the Government is pressing ahead with plans for the incumbents to open up their grids.
- 9. We consider that the ten-year SOC period offered to incumbents may be insufficient for any commercial utility business to invest, and make a return on their investment. We recommend that suppliers should be offered the incentive of SOC extension for a further ten years subject to their satisfactory performance in reaching targets for supply quality, environmental and other agreed objectives.
- 10. Our primary concern is that the Government set a policy to bring about competition in the electricity market by settling a timescale within which it can be achieved, and by laying down a framework and guidelines for the proposed new SOC to facilitate this process.

Future Development of the Electricity Market in Hong Kong Stage II Consultation

Dear Sir,

After reviewing the Stage II Consultation Paper on the Future Development of the Electricity Market in Hong Kong, I am quite sure that there would be very little argument on the policy objective of ensuring reliable electricity supply at reasonable prices and minimizing the environmental impact caused by production and use of electricity. However, how to achieve this objective requires a lot of thoughts and consideration. Being a permanent resident of Hong Kong, I would like to give my comment on some of the proposals outlined in the consultation paper for your consideration:

Supply from the Mainland

Hong Kong has gone a long way from a small fishing community to become one of the vibrant financial and trading centres in the world. In my opinion, reliable and efficient supply of electricity has been a key contributing factor to Hong Kong's success and will continue to play a vital role in sustaining the long-term growth of Hong Kong. Obviously, people in Hong Kong have been enjoying exceptionally reliable supply of electricity for too long and may not be aware of the risk of importing electricity from the Mainland. We have to understand that the phenomenal economic growth of the Mainland during the past two decades has outstripped all expectations and imposed severe stress on its electricity supply system. This inevitably has led to suboptimal reliability of supply. Besides, all electricity suppliers in the north are being regulated by a separate jurisdiction with different set of rules and priorities. Given the poor reliability record of the Mainland, importing supply from Guangdong or other provinces will likely hamper the reliability of electricity supply in Hong Kong. As such, I believe that the existing model of having generation, transmission and distribution of electricity being taken care of by the two local power companies is the best arrangement.

Permitted Rate of Return

While I agree that an adequate level of incentive must be offered to the incumbent and new investors for making continuous investment in maintaining a stable and reliable supply of electricity in Hong Kong, I do not believe it is necessary to adopt a complex regulatory framework within which a multi-tier rate-of-return structure will be applied to different types of assets of the electricity-supply infrastructure. In addition, the Consultation Paper fails to give convincing justifications as to why different permitted rates of return have to be applied to different types of assets, let alone a sound basis for the proposal of 'fixing" the rates between 7% to 11%. Supply of electricity is a capital-intensive business. The Hong Kong SAR Government must institute a simple regulatory regime and maintain a reasonable rate of return in order to encourage investment.

In conclusion, the existing Scheme of Control Agreements have been serving Hong Kong well. Any changes to the existing regulatory framework must not deter investors from making adequate level of investment - a decisive factor to sustaining reliable and efficient supply of electricity in Hong Kong.



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
